H.B. 85, Pregnancy Medicaid Coverage Amendments



What does this bill do?

H.B. 85 decreases uninsured pregnant women in Utah.


4.1% of pregnant women nationwide are uninsured, compared to an average of **6.2%** in Utah, with **26.2%** of Hispanic Utah women being uninsured.




How will this be accomplished?

Utah's pregnancy Medicaid is set at **144% FPL**, ranked 49th in the US for pregnancy Medicaid income threshold. This means that if a family of two in Utah makes **more than \$13.65 an hour**—combined—they make too much to qualify for pregnancy Medicaid. Raising the income threshold to 200% FPL would allow couples to **make up to \$18.95** an hour and receive prepared.

would allow couples to **make up to \$18.95** an hour *and* receive prenatal care.





How will we pay for this program?

This initiative is the #1 priority for the Medicaid Advisory Committee. Utah's Medicaid Expansion Fund is projected to have over \$250,000,000 by 2024, with projections showing as much as \$1,000,000,000 by 2033. The savings to the general fund in FY2024 would be \$340,000, and \$460,000 ongoing.
