HIGHLIGHTS:

Federal Grant Applications Requiring Legislative Action

Forty-four grants, totaling \$74,282,803 require approval from the Executive Appropriations Committee. Seventeen of the grants require an additional \$3,195,125 of state matching funding, which will be covered by existing program expenses. Thirty-eight of the grants are new and the remaining six are continuations or reapplications.

New Federal Grant - 38

Federal Grant Continuation or Reapplication - 6

Federal Grant Applications Approved by the Governor's Office

Fifty-seven grants, totaling \$17,163,033, have been approved by the Governor's Office. None of the grants have matching requirements. Thirty-five of the grants are new and the remaining twenty-two are continuations, reapplications, or supplemental authority for grants exceeding 125% of appropriations.

Description and Purpose of Grant:		<p>The Utah Meat and Poultry Inspection Program works in partnership with plant owners and producers throughout the state of Utah. With a Utah Department of Agriculture and Food (UDAF) staff of 21 field inspectors, 3 frontline supervisors, 2 field veterinarians, and 2 1/2 office staff. UDAF is responsible for 18 state inspected facilities, 15 Talmadge Aiken inspected facilities along with 53 custom exempt facilities and 35 mobile slaughter rigs. The inspections staffing ensures that the consumers of Utah are purchasing clean, wholesome, unadulterated and properly labeled products for their families. Every animal that is harvested and processed under inspection receives over 30 different types of inspections before receiving the marks of inspection. The mark of inspection allows the plant owner and producer to market their products either for wholesale and/or retail sales throughout Utah. In FY 2020, the UDAF Meat and Poultry Inspection staff performed approximately 30,727 verification procedures tasks to verify the establishment's food safety system, which consists of: Sanitation Performance Standards (SPS), Sanitation Standard Operating Procedures (SSOP), Hazard Analysis Critical Control Points (HACCP), and Humane Activity Tracking (HAT) just to name a few. UDAF also collected approximately 275 product samples that were tested for E. coli O157:H7, Non-O157:H7 STEC, Salmonella and Listeria monocytogenes, along with approximately 779 carcasses residue tests and 3,792 veterinarian dispositions. The UDAF Meat and Poultry Inspection Program is granted its authority by a formal set of meat and poultry regulations that have been passed by the U.S. Congress. United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food Safety Inspection Service (FSIS) has determined that Utah Department of Agriculture and Food (UDAF) Meat and Poultry Inspection Program (MPIP) are "at least equal to" the Federal requirements.</p>
