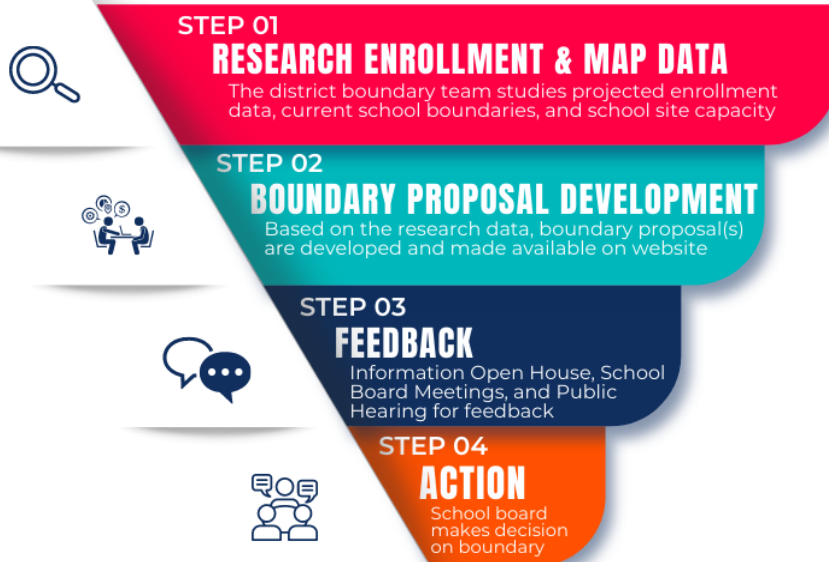

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BOUNDARY STUDY TIMELINE

The Alpine School District Board of Education initiated a districtwide boundary study during their board meeting in November 2022.

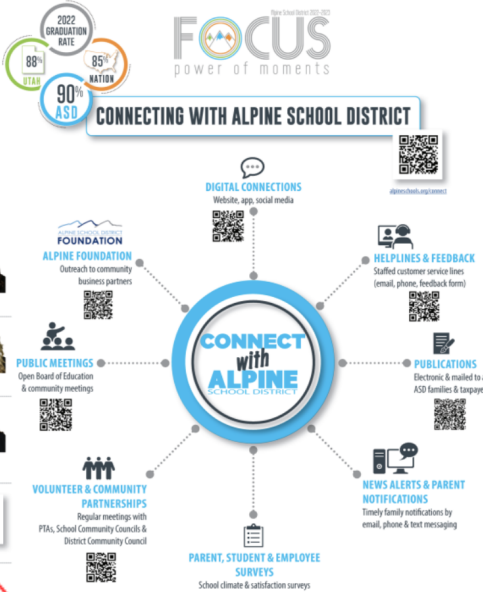

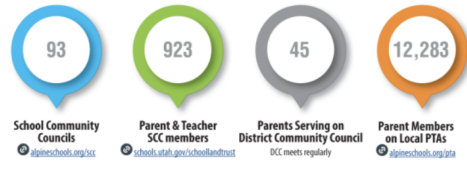

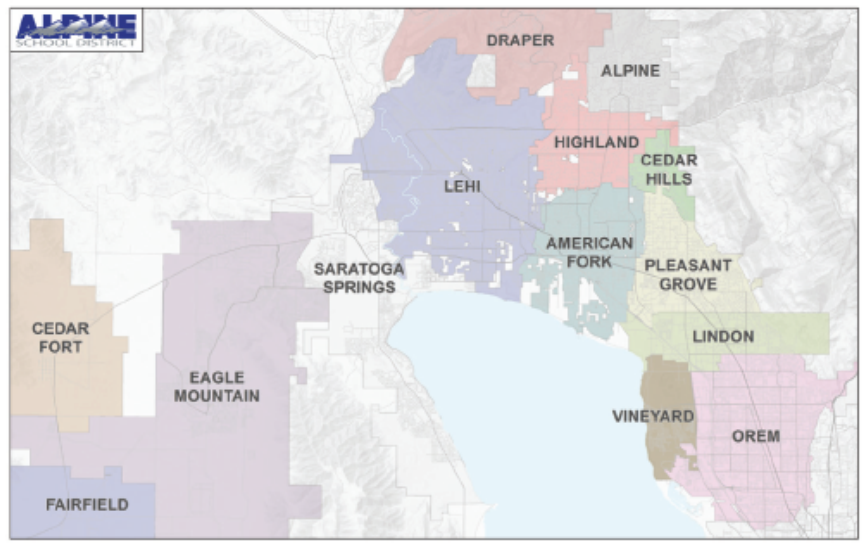

As you may recall, the proposed 2022 bond was not successful. Consequently, the Alpine School District Board of Education and district staff have reviewed many options and determined a districtwide boundary study is needed to mitigate additional student enrollment and address aging buildings. Some schools are over capacity, while other schools have room for additional students. This study will facilitate the effective use of all of our existing buildings and inform where boundary changes and/or school closures are warranted.

After the initial review of the study, parents of schools that could be impacted by a boundary change or closure will receive additional information. Study outcomes may result in boundary changes impacting some schools for the 2023 school year, while others may take effect in 2024 or at a later date.

While the boundary changes may only impact a few schools throughout the district, parents must be made aware that we are studying all school enrollments and associated boundaries. 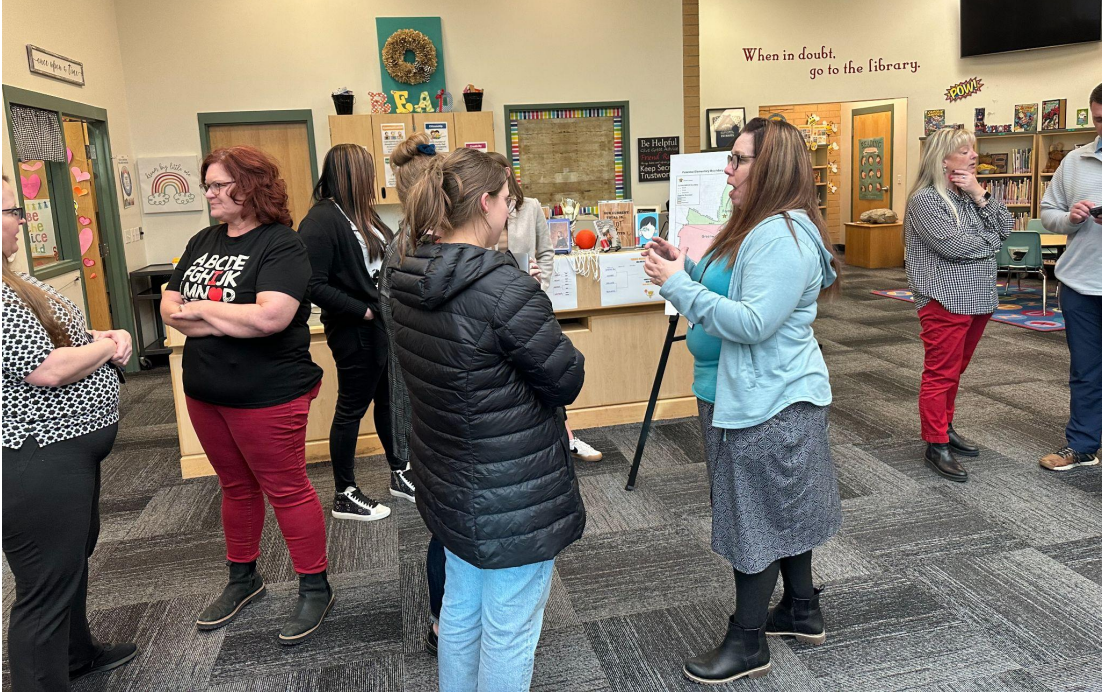

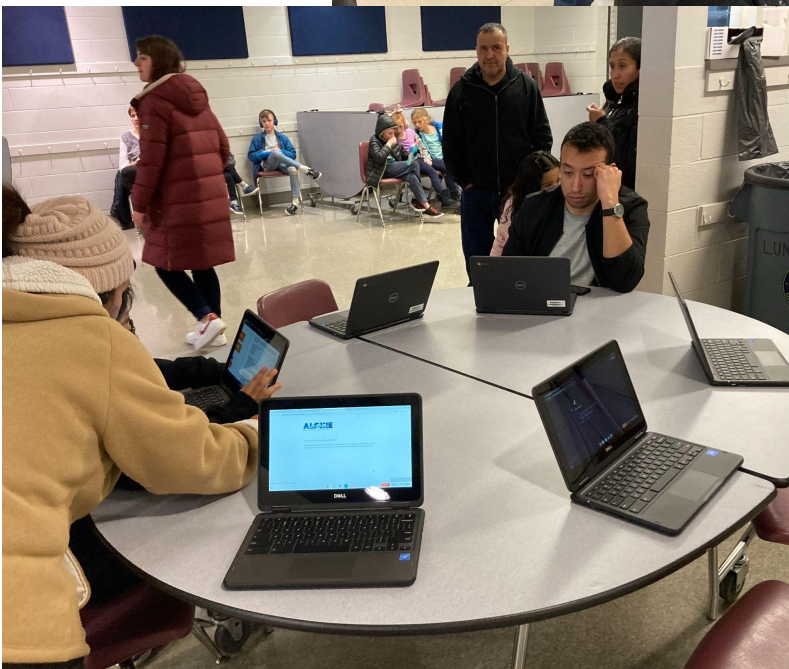

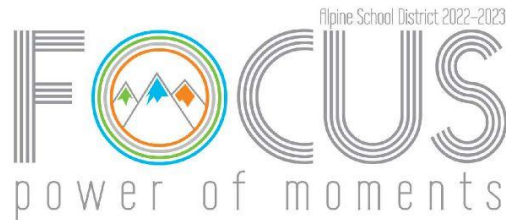

– FORMAL SCHOOL BOUNDARY & POTENTIAL CLOSURE STUDY

On Tuesday, April 18, 2023, the Board of Education voted to continue the process of proposed boundary adjustments and school closures, which was initiated during the November 29, 2022 board meeting. Specifically, the board voted to proceed and continue the process for the proposed closure of Sharon and Valley View elementary schools for the 2023-2024 school year. It was also decided to continue the study and extend the timeline for Lehi, Lindon, and Windsor elementary schools for possible implementation for the 2024-2025 school year.

In addition to public comment opportunities during two board meetings and a separate public hearing, six open houses were held to gather feedback. More than 1,450 comments were also provided through an online portal available at alpinesthools.org/boundarychanges. Feedback can still be provided through the portal and at upcoming board meetings.

A final decision on some or all of these proposals could be made in the coming months.



A **public hearing** was held on Tuesday, April 18, 2023 at 6:00 PM at the District Office located at 575 North 100 East in American Fork. Fifty-four patrons addressed the school board regarding proposed boundary changes, consolidations, or closures.

A **school board meeting** followed the public hearing. The agenda for that meeting is posted below. Please note the items listed regarding the boundary studies on the agenda. Additional map options have been added reflecting the potential closures of Valley View and Sharon and the boundary recommendations associated with the potential closures of these two schools.

On Tuesday, November 29, 2022, the Board of Education approved a **Districtwide Boundary Study**. The information on this webpage contains detailed information regarding potential school closures, boundary changes, and consolidations that are currently under study.

Also present: Superintendent Dr. Shane J. Farnsworth, Business Administrator Robert W. Smith, and members of the administrative staff. There were approximately 100 others in attendance.

Board President Sara Hacken conducted the meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was offered by Kraig Brinkerhoff.

COMMUNITY COMMENTS

Alex Lamoreaux, Saratoga Springs, spoke about her concerns regarding school safety and protecting students from violence.

Gabriel Johnson, Saratoga Springs, spoke about collaborating with the district to make schools safe. She would like to see money allocated for an armed guard at every school. She would like to hear from the board on what is currently being done to keep students safe at school.

Brianna Hugh, Highland, spoke about the 2024-25 calendar and asked the Board to not take away the early out Wednesday for secondary schools. She also asked that the teacher work day be linked to Presidents' Day weekend.

Rob Blodgett, Lehi, spoke about school safety in the elementary schools. He proposed putting chicken wire protection in the doors and windows.

Michelle Brough, Pleasant Grove, spoke about March being National Disability Awareness month. She asked that the district do a training for employees in middle school and high school to help students with executive function and would like a town hall to answer questions for parents on how to do an IEP, etc.

Kenny Sperry, Lehi, spoke about safety in schools, specifically elementary schools. He would like to open up a dialogue between parents and educators about what can be done to protect our schools from active shooters. Online comments from members of the community were received and read by the Board of Education.

MINUTES

Board President Hacken recommended the approval of the March board meeting minutes. Julie King made the motion to approve the March board meeting minutes, seconded by Sarah Beeson and the motion passed unanimously.

CLAIMS

Check numbers 00206452 through AU16VTZD totaling \$27,617,867.37 and 00004289 through 00004381 totaling \$638,405.59 with a grand total of \$28,313,976.62 were presented for the Board's acceptance. Stacy Bateman made the motion to accept the claims, seconded by Julie King, and it passed unanimously.

3. Personnel Hiring and Releasing

Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the routine business. On motion by Ada Wilson and seconded by Sarah Beeson, the motion passed unanimously.

ACTION ITEM

1. 2024-25 School Calendar

Superintendent Farnsworth recommended the Board approve one of the two options for the 2024-25 calendar. David Stephenson, Executive Director of External Relations and Communications, reviewed the two calendar options that were presented to the Board at the March 28 board meeting. Joylin Lincoln made the motion to adopt the option A calendar for the 2024-25 school calendar. Julie King seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

2. Boundary Adjustments for Belmont and Traverse Mountain Elementary Schools

David Stephenson reviewed the options for the Traverse Mountain and Belmont elementary school boundaries. The notification went out to parents about the proposed boundaries on February 6, and the 120 day notice state statute requirement will be met on June 6. Official action can be taken at that time. Stacy Bateman made the motion that the Board continue through the process per state code 53G-4-402(21) with boundary adjustment for Belmont and Traverse Mountain elementary schools for the 2023-2024 school year. The motion was seconded by Joylin Lincoln and it passed with a six to one vote, with Sara Hacken, Julie King, Stacy Bateman, Mark Clement, Joylin Lincoln, and Ada Wilson voting in favor, and Sarah Beeson voting against.

3. Boundary Adjustments for Barratt, Forbes and Greenwood Elementary Schools

David Stephenson reviewed the proposed boundary adjustment for Barratt, Forbes and Greenwood elementary schools. The notification went out to parents about the proposed boundary on February 6, and the 120 day notice state statute requirement will be met on June 6. Official action can be taken at that time. Sarah Beeson made the motion that the Board continue through the process per state code 53G-4-402(21) with the proposed boundary adjustment for the Barratt, Forbes, and Greenwood elementary schools for the 2023-2024 school year. The motion was seconded by Stacy Bateman and it passed unanimously.

4. Continue Study of the Formal Boundary and Closure Study Recommendation Associated with Valley View Elementary School for Intended Implementation in the 2023-2024 School Year

David Stephenson said there are four boundary options regarding the closure of Valley View Elementary. He said the current option D leaves Lindon Elementary open with all of Valley View Elementary moved to Central Elementary, a part of Central moved to Grovecrest Elementary and the Apple Grove community moved to Lindon Elementary. The community west of state street would move to Aspen Elementary. Julie King made the motion for the Board to continue through the process outlined in state code 53G-4-402(21) for the proposed closure impacting Valley View Elementary, and the associated boundary adjustments to Grovecrest, Central, Aspen, and Lindon elementary schools for implementation in the 2023-2024 school year. Joylin Lincoln seconded the motion and it passed with a six to one vote with Sara Hacken, Julie King, Stacy Bateman, Mark Clement, Joylin Lincoln, and Ada Wilson voting in favor, and Sarah Beeson voting against.

5. Continue Study of the Formal Boundary and Closure Study Recommendations Associated with Sharon Elementary School for intended implementation in the 2023-2024 School Year

David Stephenson said there are four boundary options regarding the closure of Sharon Elementary. The first three options split Sharon between Cascade and Foothill. The current option D has all of Sharon Elementary moving to Cascade Elementary and a section of Cascade moving to Centennial Elementary. Ada Wilson made the motion for the Board to continue through the process outlined in state

code 53G-4-402(21) for the proposed closure impacting Sharon Elementary, and the associated boundary adjustments to Cascade and Centennial elementary schools for implementation in the 2023-2024 school year. Joylin Lincoln seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

6. Continue Study of the Formal Boundary and Closure Study Recommendations Associated with Windsor Elementary School for possible implementation in the 2024-2025 School Year or Future School Years

Superintendent Farnsworth clarified that the intent is to continue to study and look at the options, because there are variables requiring additional time for consideration before further recommendations are made to the Board. Joylin Lincoln made the motion for the Board to continue the process per state code 53G-4-402(21) for the proposed closure impacting Windsor Elementary, and associated boundary adjustments to Northridge and Orchard elementary schools for implementation in the 2024-2025 school year. Sarah Beeson seconded the motion. Superintendent Farnsworth asked for a point of clarification regarding the motion because it did not include “or future school years” as worded in the agenda. Board President Sara Hacken asked Joylin Lincoln if she wanted to reword her motion. Joylin kept her motion as originally stated. The Board voted on the motion and it passed with a four to three vote with Sarah Beeson, Mark Clement, Sara Hacken, and Ada Wilson voting in favor, and Stacy Bateman, Julie King, and Joylin Lincoln voting against.

7. Continue Study of the Formal Boundary and Closure Study Recommendations Associated with Lindon Elementary School for Possible implementation in the 2024-2025 School Year or Future School Years.

Julie King made the motion for the Board to continue the process per state code 53G-4-402(21) for the proposed closure impacting Lindon Elementary, and associated boundary adjustments to Rocky Mountain, Central, and Aspen elementary schools for implementation in the 2024-2025 school year. The motion was seconded by Stacy Bateman. Mark Clement asked for clarification regarding a “yes” or “no” vote for this motion. Business Administrator Rob Smith clarified that if the motion failed, it would require another motion. Kraig Brinkerhoff, Executive Director of Legal Services, said the original motion stands, but there is no harm in making an additional motion to clarify the plan. Ada Wilson made a point of order regarding agenda item #6 and asked for clarification if an individual can vote against a motion they made. Rob Smith responded yes. The Board voted on the motion and it passed with a four to three vote with Sarah Beeson, Mark Clement, Sara Hacken, and Ada Wilson voting in favor, and Stacy Bateman, Julie King, and Joylin Lincoln voting against.

8. Continue Study of the Formal Boundary and Closure Study Recommendations Associated with Lehi Elementary School for Possible Implementation in the 2024-2025 School Year or Future School Years

Stacy Bateman made the motion for the board to continue the process per state code 53G-4-402(21) for the proposed closure impacting Lehi Elementary, and associated boundary adjustments to Meadow, Northpoint, River Rock, and Snow Springs elementary schools for implementation in the 2024-2025 school year. Julie King seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

REPORT

Superintendent Farnsworth reported on the enrollment changes in the district.

BOARD MEMBERS’ AND SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORTS AND INFORMATION ITEMS

Stacy Bateman clarified HB477 uses the term “full day” kindergarten, not “all day” kindergarten. More information should be out soon about the schools who will have this offering and Stacy thanked the public for their patience.

On motion by Sarah Beeson and seconded by Ada Wilson, the meeting adjourned into closed session at 10:02 PM to discuss personnel, property, litigation and collective bargaining, with Stacy Bateman, Sarah Beeson, Mark Clement, Sara Hacken, Julie King, Joylin Lincoln, and Ada Wilson voting in favor.

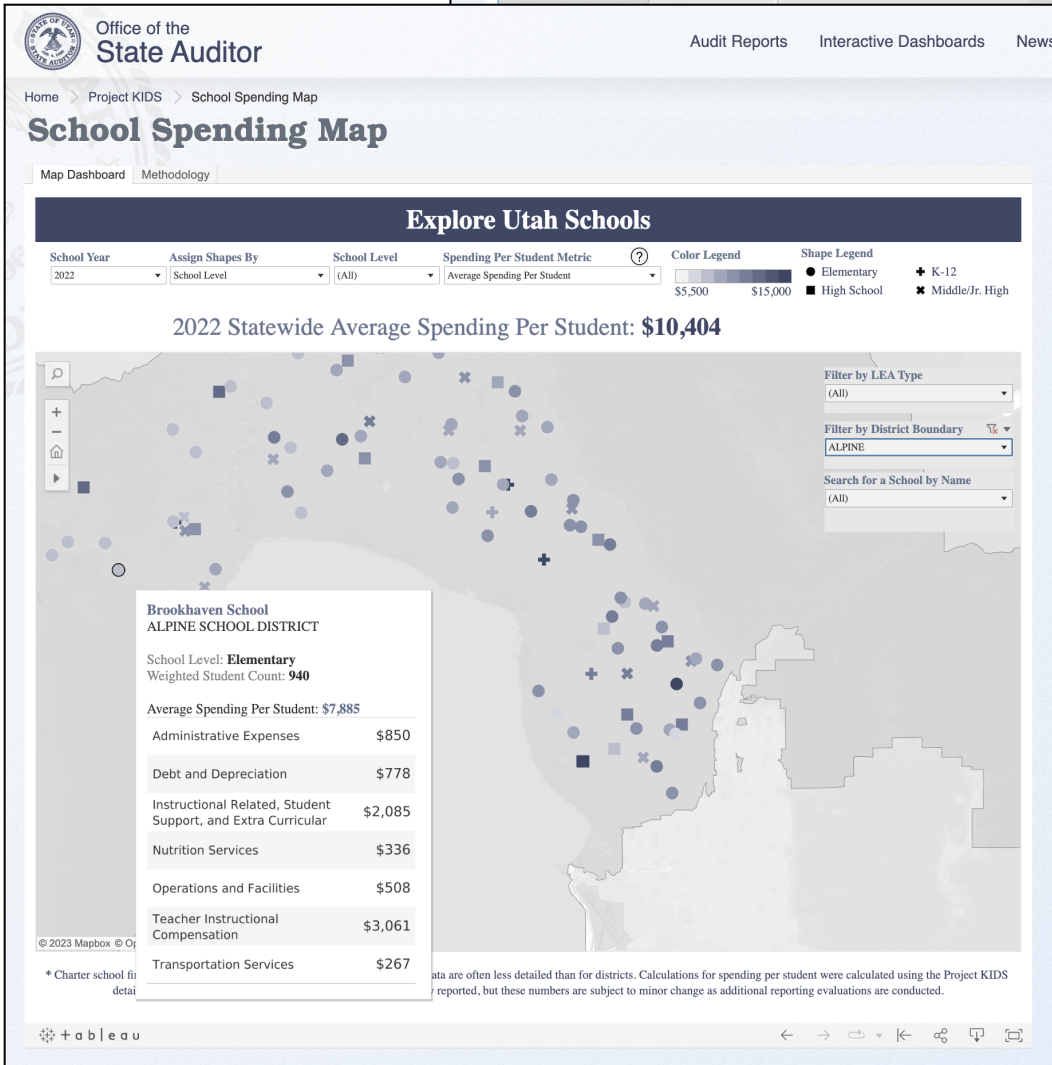
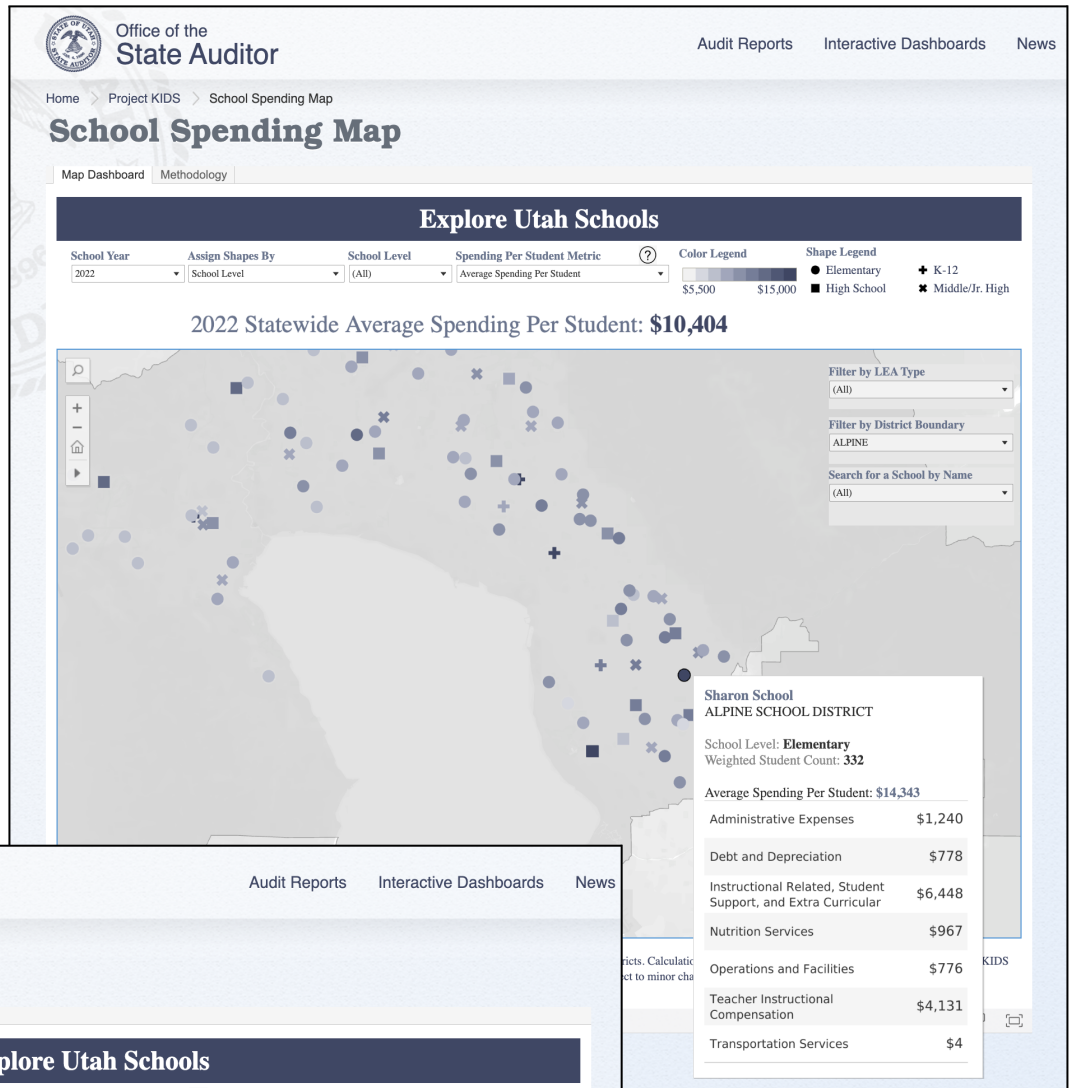

Sample of two Alpine District schools and the average spending per student.



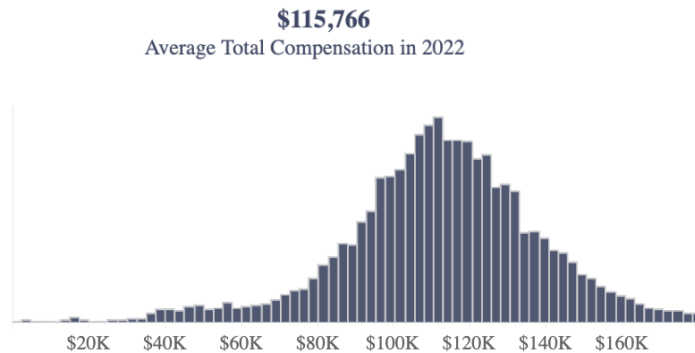

Distribution of Total Compensation

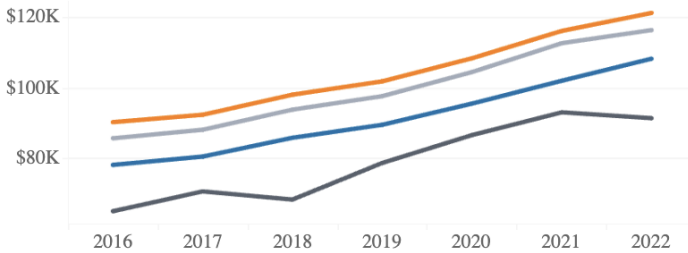

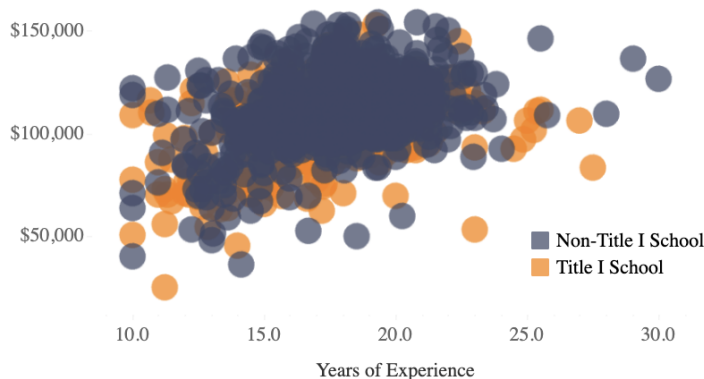
