Literature

This class focuses on literature in the United States from the early settlers of this country through modern times. *The Declaration of Independence*, *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, *The Great Gatsby*, *Of Mice and Men*, *A Raisin in the Sun*, as well as various classic American short stories, essays, and poems from the time period will be studied. Other literature may include works from Walt Whitman, Henry David Thoreau, Edgar Allen Poe, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Langston Hughes, Pat Mora and other select authors from the time period. Although he is not American nor is he from this time period, we will be studying selected works from Shakespeare.

Building Proactive Communication with Parents



Open process for Board approval of *instructional* materials

- Open meetings
- Public notifications
- Parent access to printed materials being considered
- List of approved instructional materials is included on the district website (currently being updated)

Middle and high school teacher teams (grade level/content) select *supplemental* materials

- Teachers list supplemental materials in their syllabus
- If a potentially controversial supplemental material is suggested later by the team, the teacher sends a notification out to parents informing them of the new material and inviting any questions
