Stepping Stones 24/7 Childcare construction started.

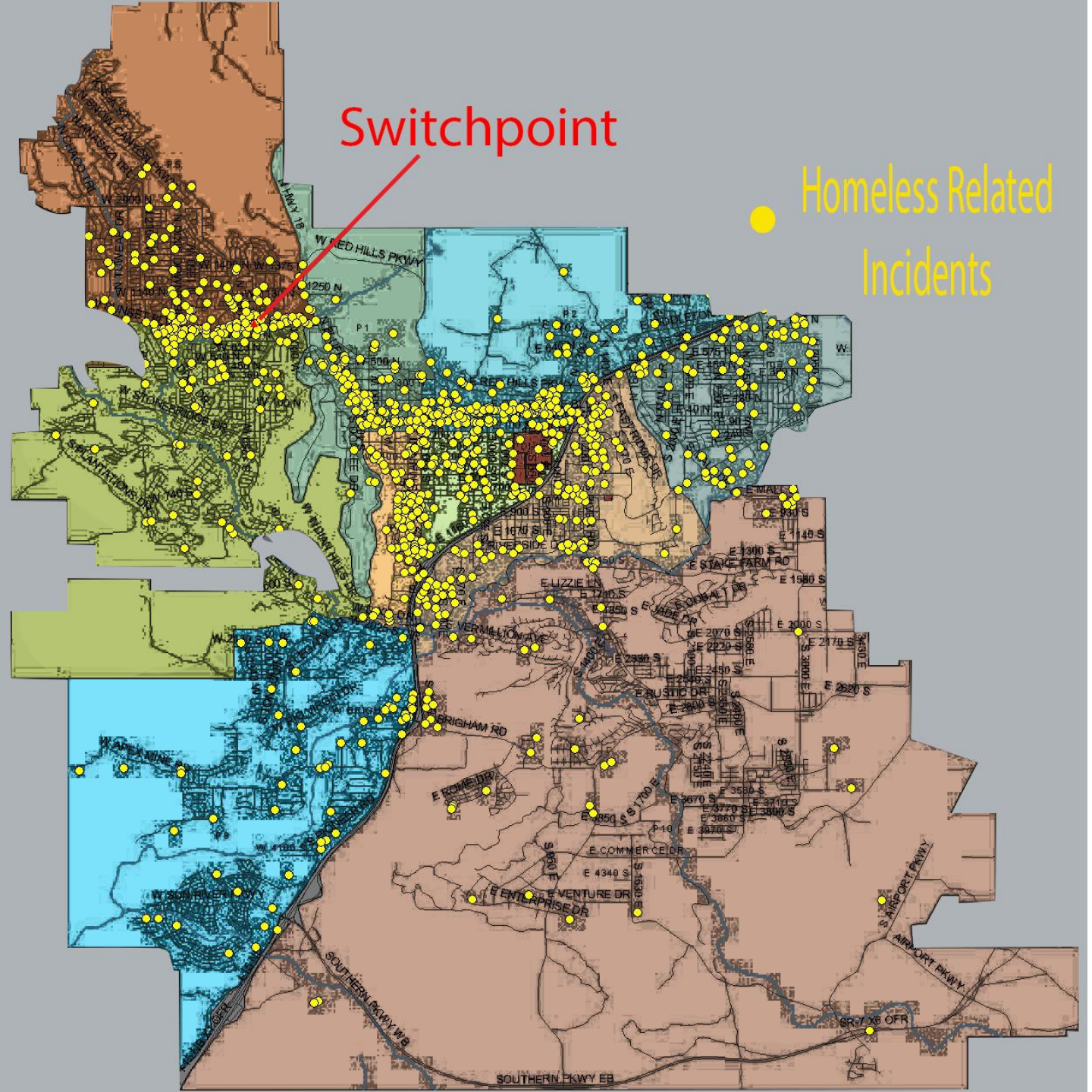

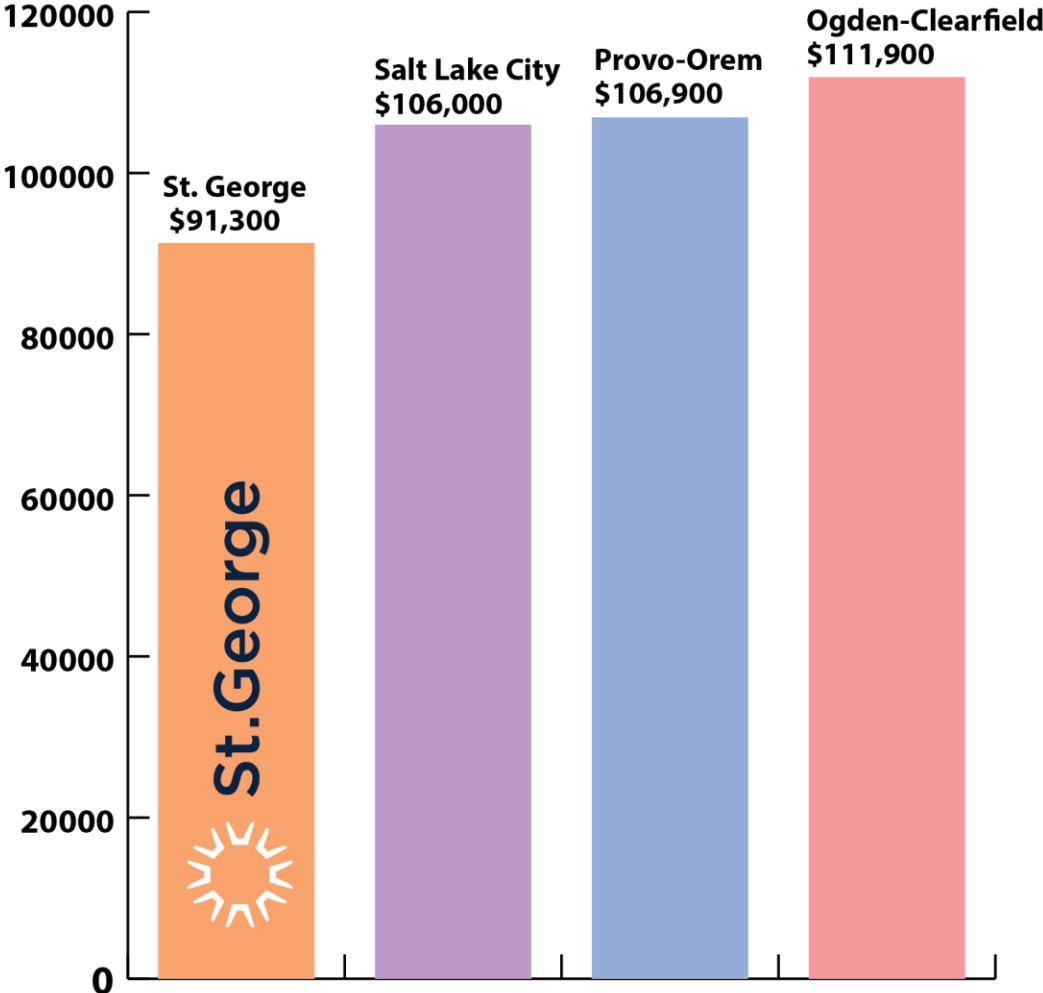

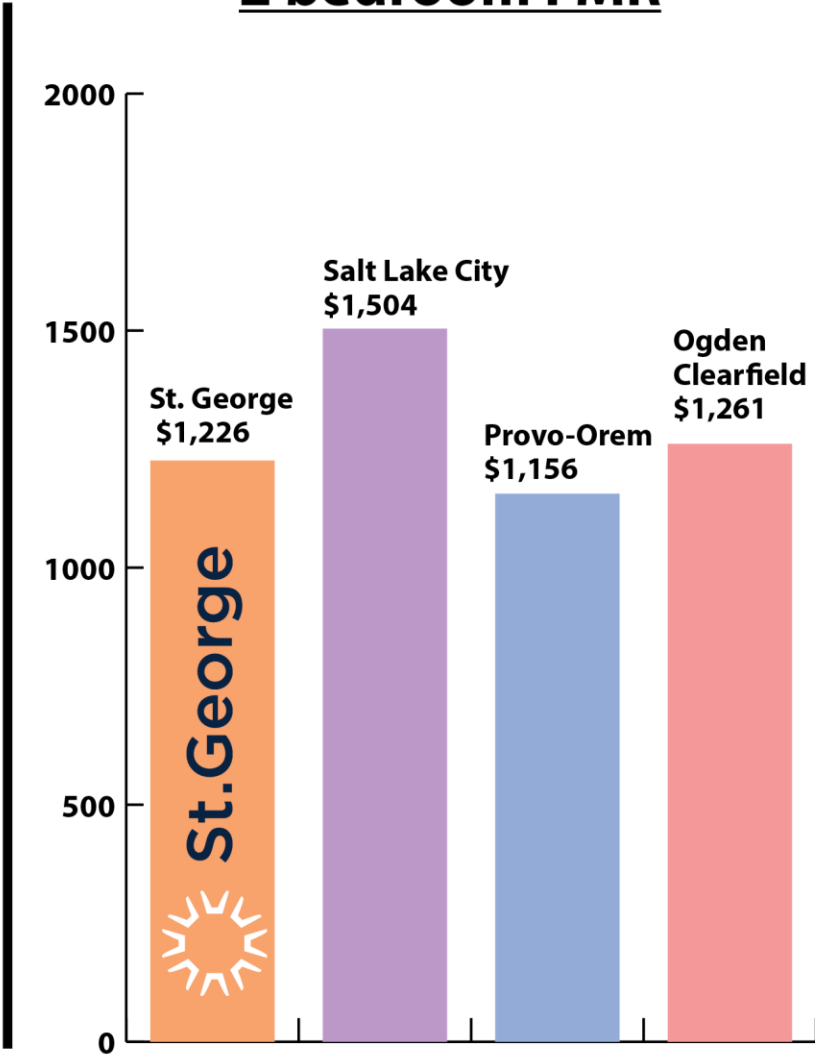


# Area Median Income and Housing Costs
