## TITLE 76, CHAPTER 8 REORGANIZATION AND SUBSTANTIAL RECODIFICATION CHANGES

2024 General Session: The following changes to Title 76, Chapter 8 proposed for recodification to create uniform subsection structure in offense statutes and to address a few substantive issues per the direction of the <a href="Criminal Code Evaluation Task">Criminal Code Evaluation Task</a> Force. Subsections were reorganized to match the following order as much as possible:

- Subsection (1) Definitions
- Subsection (2) Elements of offense
- Subsection (3) Penalties
- Subsection (4) Limitations/Defenses
- Subsection (5) etc. Limitations/Defenses cont. or additional information

Substantive amendments to create clarity are noted below. Statutes that did not need to be amended based on the standards for this recodification are not included in this chart. Practitioners and the public should rely on the final language codified in adopted legislation rather than notes in these documents.
