






#### History of Pacific Islanders In Utah




Warm Springs (1873) Iosepa (1889)










Samoans Castle Dale (1898) Iosepa (1899)


Percent Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander alone or in Combination, Total Population by State: 2020



The Mill Entrepreneurship Center @ SLCC has seen a significant increase in minority owned businesses and minority clients looking to start a small business.

- Traditionally minority owned business do not have an equal playing field when it comes to borrowing money and business education.
- Resources are increasingly focused on financial literacy for minority-owned business to ensure a highly likelihood of success in managing money, taking loans and understanding cash flow.
- Challenges: Funding for programs, trust from minority communities, lack of knowledge about resources available to minority business owners.
