IVF Pilot Program



Version 1: Lifetime Cap of \$4000

- IVF Cost Not a Barrier to Parents who want Kids
- State Already Paying for IVF-related Births (\$1.37M)
- High Costs Due to High Complications
- Complications Tied to Implanting Multiple Embryos

Initial Costs



- 24 Births Over Two Years—2019 & 2020
 - 14 Single Births at Average of \$36,700
 - 10 Multiple Births at Average of \$165,500
 - Average Annual Cost of \$705,000
 - \$71,000 for IVF
 - \$634,000 for Births

IVF Pilot Program



Version 2: Reduce Complications

- Incentivize Implantation of Single Embryo
- Removed Cap & Tied Payment to Single Implant

Version 2 Outcomes



Modest Increase from Removal of Cap


• 76 Moms \rightarrow 107 IVF Benefits \rightarrow 1.4 Per

Significant Reduction in Multiple Births

- 2 out of 30 or 7%
- All single embryo implants
- 1 of 2 had high complications

IVF Outcomes





Failed Pregnancies 31%

IVF Costs Over 3 Years



- •No Pregnancy: \$3,300
- Failed Pregnancy: \$9,671
- Average of Births without Highest: \$25,177
- Average of 3 Highest: \$291,253

One Data Point on Potential Savings



- Rest of PEHP's Block of Business in 2020
 - 4 sets of Twins & 1 set of Triplets
 - Per child \$175,800; \$386,760 Per Pregnancy
 - State: 1 twin set with complications in 3 years

Total Costs



- •Estimated \$1.37M in 2019
- Average of \$774,700 for last two years
- Average of \$104,900 for IVF

Takeaways



- 1. IVF is Well Established
- 2. Good Results from Single Embryo Implant
- & Eliminating Cap
- 3. Risk of Complications Remain Due in Part to Maternal Age and Health Factors
- 4. Reduced Costs and Improved Health

State Insurance Update



Replacing 40-Year Old Legacy System

- Significant Challenges Backlog due to Provider Data
- State Transition next July

Renewal

- Taken Conservative Approach Through COVID
- Increased Trend to 7.2% due to Inflationary Pressures

Member Premium Differential

- Historically the Same
- Base Solely on Price Differences

Working Through Value-Based Arrangements

- COVID reveals flaws in calculating
- Reward better health and lower costs

State Insurance Update



Better Framework for Percent of Bill Charges

- Maintain Integrity of Fixed Payments
- Increase Fixed Payments or Medicare Benchmark

Concentrated Risk for Gene Therapy Drugs

- Life-saving Drugs that can cost over \$2M
- Larger Pooling Mechanism
- Larger Policy Issue of High On-going Drug Costs

Patients with High Ongoing Drug Costs

- Drug Assistance Takes Care of Drug Costs
- Individual Embedded for Medical -- \$4,500 Max
