# 1 in 2 children are reading on grade level by the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade in Utah






### Students who are not reading on grade level:

- Higher rates of school dropout
- Reliance on public assistance
- Higher rates of being arrested or teenage pregnancy
- Lack of skilled workforce







#### History of Impact on Student Outcomes

#### Moving Early Literacy to the WPU

#### **Pros**

- Increased flexibility of funding use
- Reduce application burden
- Increase in amount of funding over time
- Local control

#### Cons

- Loss of additional local matching funding
- Removes the focus area of literacy as a legislative priority
- Removes restrictions on use of funds
- Reduces accountability for the funding
- Competing priorities may minimize impact



#### What changed with SB 127?



- Required diagnostic assessment and progress monitoring
- Required educators to participate in LETRS professional learning
- Required instruction materials to be aligned with the science of reading
- Required change management in literacy for school, district, and charter leaders
- Added state literacy coaches to lowest performing schools
- Required teacher candidates to take/pass the Foundations of Reading Assessment
- And more...



#### Progress Monitoring: Instructional Support

- SB 127 established a requirement for progress monitoring of students
- In the first year, we saw small improvements towards meeting the law
  - Sent notices to schools below 20%
  - Certificates of Achievement for schools above 90%
- This year, we will be issuing corrective action notices to LEAs who are out compliance








% of Students Achieving Benchmark





#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade
















## Progress Towards Achieving the State's Goal



#### Percentage of Students Who Can Read Grade Level










- School-wide and grade level specific goals
- School leader monitoring implementation
- School leaders deep knowledge in literacy
