Utah State Board of Education School Safety and Support Grant FY 2024 Application

Overview:

During the 2023 session the state legislature passed <u>House Bill (H.B.) 61 - School Safety Requirements</u>. The Utah State Board of Education (USBE) shall distribute money appropriated under this bill section to local education agencies (LEAs) to increase school safety measures.

- \$72 million is made available through a competitive grant opportunity in an effort to enhance basic physical safety and security.
 - Awarded funds may be used through FY26 (June 30, 2026).
- LEA's will submit an application for each school that needs to be considered for funding.
- Each school must complete a school safety assessment in order to determine their needs. The results will be included in supporting evidence for this application.
- Funds will be prioritized for LEAs:
 - o that have designated a school safety specialist in each school
 - with schools that have lower student count.

Application Final Due Date: Friday, September 15, 2023 by 5:00 PM

Applications should be submitted as a digital link, in a Google Doc format, to Shaleece Oldroyd, shaleece.oldroyd@schools.utah.gov.

Note: To be considered, the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) must receive your electronic copy **no later than September 15, 2023 by 5:00 PM**. All email submissions will be confirmed with a receipt email from USBE within two business days. An LEA shall resubmit if a receipt is not received. Late applications will not be accepted. Official award letters will be sent to the LEA through the Utah Grants Management System. Applications that do not include completed LEA Overview and Contact Information (Section A) and signed Statement of Assurances (Section D) will not be reviewed.
