## **Railroad Update**

- HB 51 Railroad Right of Way Amendments
  - Gives a government entity authority to assess a railroad for any portion of the cost of right of way infrastructure improvement if the improvement provides a benefit to the railroad.
  - Effective March 31, 2024
  - UDOT is researching what constitutes a benefit to the railroad along with defining assessments.
- SB 61 Livestock Collision Amendments
  - Enacts provisions related to railroads, fencing of railroad rights-of-way, and liability for damage to livestock.
  - Effective April 1, 2024
  - The Department of Agriculture and Food is required to coordinate with UDOT when livestock collisions occur.
  - UDOT is currently working with the Department of Agriculture and Food to define what this coordination will look like. Our next meeting is scheduled for November 7.



## Railroad Update

- HB 63 Office of Rail Safety
  - Creates the Office of Rail Safety within the Department of Transportation.
  - Effective March 31, 2024
  - UDOT is coordinating with the Federal Rail Administration to participate in the State Safety Participation Regulations.
    - UDOT has reviewed the agreement to participate in the program.
    - Discussed options for hiring inspectors and getting them certified as quickly as possible including grant opportunities.
    - Initial implementation will be inspections on Operating Practices and Grade Crossings.
  - Currently researching fees and penalties to be paid by each railroad, including research on crossing blocking practices of the railroads.
- HB 232 Railroad Crossing Maintenance Amendments
  - Moved the Regulations of highway-railroad grade crossings from Title 54 (Public Utilities) to Title 72 (Transportation Code).
  - Technical updates to HB 181 from the 2022 Legislative session
  - Provides that the Department has the authority to determine assignment of maintenance fees
