6	General Description:
7	This bill amends provisions related to the requirement to issue and display a license
8	plate for the front of a vehicle.
9	Highlighted Provisions:
10	This bill:
11	 removes the requirement for the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue two license
12	plates in most circumstances;
13	 removes the requirement for an owner of a vehicle to display a license plate on the
14	front of a vehicle;
15	 prohibits a license plate cover and prohibits a license plate frame that obscures the
16	license plate number or decals;
17	 requires \$1 from certain license plate fees to be deposited into the Motor Vehicle
18	Safety Impact Restricted Account; and
19	 makes technical changes.

54	13-48-103. Motor vehicle rental company Fee disclosure and collection
55	requirements.
56	(1) A motor vehicle rental company may include separately stated surcharges, fees, or
57	charges in a rental agreement, including:
58	(a) motor vehicle license cost recovery fees;
59	(b) airport access fees;
60	(c) airport concession fees; and
61	(d) all applicable taxes.
62	(2) If a motor vehicle rental company includes a motor vehicle license cost recovery
63	fee as a separately stated charge in a rental transaction, the amount of the fee shall represent the

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64 motor vehicle rental company's good-faith estimate of the motor vehicle rental company's daily 65 charge as calculated by the motor vehicle rental company to recover its actual total annual 66 motor vehicle titling, registration, obtaining [license plates] a license plate, and motor vehicle 67 inspection and emission costs. 68 (3) If the total amount of the motor vehicle license cost recovery fees collected by a 69 motor vehicle rental company under this section in any calendar year exceeds the motor vehicle 70 rental company's actual costs to license, title, register, and obtain [license plates] a license plate 71 for the motor vehicles and have the motor vehicles pass inspections and emissions for that 72 calendar year, the motor vehicle rental company shall retain the excess amount and adjust the 73 estimated average per motor vehicle license cost recovery fee for the following calendar year 74 by the corresponding amount. 75 Section 2. 140	(1) (a) Except as provided in [Subsection (1)(c)] Subsections (1)(c), (d), and (e), the
141	division upon registering a vehicle shall issue to the owner:
142	(i) one license plate for a motorcycle, trailer, or semitrailer;
143	(ii) one registration decal for a park model recreational vehicle, in lieu of a license
144	plate, which shall be attached in plain sight to the rear of the park model recreational vehicle;
145	(iii) one registration decal for a camper, in lieu of a license plate, which shall be
146	attached in plain sight to the rear of the camper; and
147	(iv) [two identical license plates] one license plate for every other vehicle.

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157	(B) the person applying to register the vehicle applies to transfer the license plate to the

160	registered owner under this Subsection (1)(c) if the new registered owner does not meet the
161	qualification or eligibility requirements for that personalized or special group license plate
162	under this part or Part 16, Special Group License Plates.
163	(d) (i) For a vehicle described in Section 41-1a-301, the division upon registering a
164	vehicle shall issue a license plate or set of license plates as provided in that section.
165	(ii) For any vehicle that meets the definition of an intrastate commercial vehicle as
166	defined in Section 72-9-102, at the request of the registrant, the division upon registering a
167	vehicle may issue two license plates, for display on both the front and rear of the intrastate
168	commercial vehicle.
169	(e) The division upon registering a vehicle may, until inventory of license plate sets is
170	exhausted, but no later than December 31, 2025, issue a set of two plates.
171	(2) The division may receive applications for registration renewal, renew registration,
172	and issue <u>a</u> new license [plates] <u>plate</u> or registration decals at any time prior to the expiration of
173	registration.
174	(3) (a) (i) Except as provided in Subsection (3)(a)(ii), all license plates to be
175	manufactured and issued by the division shall be treated with a fully reflective material on the
176	plate face that provides effective and dependable reflective brightness during the service period
177	of the license plate.
178	(ii) Notwithstanding Subsection (3)(a)(i), a historical support special group license
179	plate may be treated with a place face that is partially reflective and provides effective and
180	dependable reflective brightness during the service period of the license plate.
181	(b) The division shall prescribe all license plate material specifications and establish
182	and implement procedures for conforming to the specifications.
183	(c) The specifications for the materials used such as the aluminum plate substrate, the
184	reflective sheeting, and glue shall be drawn in a manner so that at least two manufacturers may
185	qualify as suppliers.
186	(d) The granting of contracts for the materials shall be by public bid.
187	(4) (a) The commission may issue, adopt, and require the use of indicia of registration

188	it considers advisable in lieu of or in conjunction with license plates as provided in this part.
189	(b) All provisions of this part relative to license plates apply to these indicia of
190	registration, so far as the provisions are applicable.
191	(5) A violation of this section is an infraction.

193	41-1a-402. Standard license plates Required colors, numerals, and letters
194	Expiration.
195	(1) (a) Upon registering a vehicle, the division shall issue to the owner a standard
196	license plate described in Subsection (1)(b) unless the division issues to the owner:
197	(i) a special group license plate in accordance with Section 41-1a-418; or
198	(ii) an apportioned vehicle license plate in accordance with Section 41-1a-301.
199	(b) The division may offer up to four standard license plate options at one time, each
200	with a different design as follows:
201	(i) two designs that incorporate one or more elements that represent the state's
202	economy or geography;
203	(ii) one design that represents the state's values or culture; and
204	(iii) one design that commemorates a current event relevant to the state or a significant
205	anniversary of a historic event relevant to the state.
206	(c) The division shall offer:
207	(i) each design described in Subsection (1)(b)(i) or (ii) for at least a 10-year period; and
208	(ii) each design described in Subsection (1)(b)(iii) for no more than a five-year period.
209	(d) The division may not offer more than four standard license plate designs at any one
210	time.
211	(2) Before the division may offer a design described in Subsection (1)(b), the division
212	shall:
213	(a) consult with the Utah Department of Cultural and Community Engagement
214	regarding the proposed design;
215	(b) identify which current standard license plate design will be replaced by the
216	proposed design;
217	(c) submit the proposed design to the governor for approval; and
218	(d) if the governor approves the design pursuant to Subsection (2)(c), submit to the

219	Transportation Interim Committee a request for the Legislature to approve the proposed design
220	by concurrent resolution.
221	(3) The division may issue a new standard license plate design only if:
222	(a) the Legislature has by concurrent resolution approved the standard license plate
223	design; and
224	(b) sufficient funds are appropriated for the initial costs of production.
225	(4) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (4)(b), the division may not order or produce a
226	standard license plate that is discontinued under this section.
227	(b) The division may issue a discontinued standard license plate until the division
228	exhausts the discontinued standard license plate's remaining stock.
229	(5) Each license plate shall have displayed on it:
230	(a) the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which the license plate is issued;
231	(b) the name of the state; and
232	(c) unless exempted by Section 41-1a-301 or 41-1a-407, a registration decal showing
233	the date of expiration displayed in accordance with Subsection (8).
234	(6) If registration is extended by affixing a registration decal to the license plate, the
235	expiration date of the registration decal governs the expiration date of the license plate.
236	(7) (a) Except as provided under Subsection 41-1a-215(2) and Section 41-1a-216,
237	[license plates] <u>a license plate</u> shall be renewed annually.
238	(b) (i) The division shall issue the vehicle owner a month registration decal and a year
239	registration decal upon the vehicle's first registration with the division.
240	(ii) The division shall issue the vehicle owner only a year registration decal upon
241	subsequent renewals of registration to validate registration renewal.
242	(8) Except as otherwise provided by rule:
243	(a) the month registration decal issued in accordance with Subsection (7) shall be
244	displayed on the license plate in the left position; and
245	(b) the year registration decal issued in accordance with Subsection (7) shall be
246	displayed on the license plate in the right position.
247	(9) The current year registration decal issued in accordance with Subsection (7) shall
248	be placed over or in place of the previous year registration decal.
249	(10) If a license plate, month registration decal, or year registration decal is lost or

250	destroyed, a replacement shall be issued upon application and payment of the fees required
251	under Section 41-1a-1211 or 41-1a-1212.
252	(11) (a) A violation of this section is an infraction.
253	(b) A court shall waive a fine for a violation under this section if:
254	(i) the registration for the vehicle was current at the time of the citation; and
255	(ii) the person to whom the citation was issued provides, within 21 business days,
256	evidence that the license plate and registration decals are properly displayed in compliance with
257	this section.
258	(12) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act,
259	the division may make rules regarding the placement and positioning of registration decals on
260	[license plates] a license plate issued by the division.

262	41-1a-403. Plates to be legible from 100 feet.
263	(1) License plates and the required letters and numerals on them, except the decals and
264	the slogan, shall be of sufficient size to be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during
265	daylight.
266	[(2) An individual may not attach a tinted or translucent license plate cover that
267	obscures the readability of the license plate as required in Subsection (1).]
268	(2) An individual may may not attach to or over a license plate:
269	(a) a license plate cover; or
270	(b) a license plate frame that obscures or blocks the readability of the license plate
271	number or registration decals on a license plate.
272	(3) A violation of this section is an infraction.
273	Section 8. Section 41-1a-404 is amended to read:
274	41-1a-404. Location and position of plates Visibility of plates Exceptions.
275	[(1) License plates issued for a vehicle other than a motorcycle, trailer, vintage vehicle,
276	or semitrailer shall be attached to the vehicle, one in the front and the other in the rear.]
277	[(2) (a) The license plate issued for a motorcycle, trailer, or semitrailer shall be
278	attached to the rear of the motorcycle, trailer, or semitrailer.]
279	[(b) (i) An owner of a vintage vehicle shall ensure that a license plate is attached to the
280	rear of the vintage vehicle.]

281	[(ii) An owner of a vintage vehicle is not required to display a license plate on the front
282	of the vintage vehicle.]
283	(1) Except as provided in Section 41-1a-301 relating to a vehicle with apportioned
284	registration, the owner or operator of a vehicle shall ensure that the license plate is attached to
285	the rear of the vehicle as described in this section.
286	[(3)] (2) Except as provided in Subsection $[(5)]$ (3), a license plate shall at all times be:
287	(a) securely fastened:
288	(i) in a horizontal position to the vehicle for which it is issued to prevent the plate from
289	swinging;
290	(ii) at a height of not less than 12 inches from the ground, measuring from the bottom
291	of the plate; and
292	(iii) in a place and position to be clearly visible; and
293	(b) maintained:
294	(i) free from foreign materials or a tinted or translucent license plate cover; and
295	(ii) in a condition to be clearly legible.
296	[(4) Enforcement by a state or local law enforcement officer of the requirement under
297	Subsection (1) to attach a license plate to the front of a vehicle shall be only as a secondary
298	action when the vehicle has been detained for a suspected violation by any person in the

300	license plate to the front of the vehicle, or for another offense.]
301	[(5)] <u>(3)</u> The provisions of Subsections [(3)(a)(iii) and (3)(b)] <u>(2)(a)(iii) and (2)(b)</u> do
302	not apply:
303	(a) to a license plate that is obscured exclusively by one or more of the following
304	devices or by the cargo the device is carrying, if the device is installed according to
305	manufacturer specifications or generally accepted installation practices:

307	(ii) a wheelchair lift or wheelchair carrier;
308	(iii) a trailer being towed by the vehicle;
309	(iv) a bicycle rack, ski rack, or luggage rack; or
310	(v) a similar cargo carrying device; or
311	(b) to a military vehicle if the license plate is in the military vehicle and ready for

312	inspection by law enforcement upon request.
313	[(6)] (4) A violation of this section is an infraction.
314	Section 9. Section 41-1a-407 is amended to read:
315	41-1a-407. Plates issued to political subdivisions or state Use of "EX" letters
316	Confidential information.
317	(1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), each municipality, board of education, school
318	district, state institution of learning, county, other governmental division, subdivision, or
319	district, and the state shall:
320	(a) place a license plate displaying the letters, "EX" on every vehicle owned and
321	operated by it or leased for its exclusive use; and
322	(b) display an identification mark designating the vehicle as the property of the entity
323	in a conspicuous place on both sides of the vehicle.
324	(2) The entity need not display the "EX" license plate or the identification mark
325	required by Subsection (1) if:
326	(a) the vehicle is in the direct service of the governor, lieutenant governor, attorney
327	general, state auditor, or state treasurer of Utah;
328	(b) the vehicle is used in official investigative work where secrecy is essential;
329	(c) the vehicle is used in an organized Utah Highway Patrol operation that is:
330	(i) conducted within a county of the first or second class as defined under Section
331	17-50-501, unless no more than one unmarked vehicle is used for the operation;
332	(ii) approved by the Commissioner of Public Safety;
333	(iii) of a duration of 14 consecutive days or less; and
334	(iv) targeted toward careless driving, aggressive driving, and accidents involving:
335	(A) violations of Title 41, Chapter 6a, Part 5, Driving Under the Influence and
336	Reckless Driving;
337	(B) speeding violations for exceeding the posted speed limit by 21 or more miles per
338	hour;
339	(C) speeding violations in a reduced speed school zone under Section 41-6a-604;
340	(D) violations of Section 41-6a-1002 related to pedestrian crosswalks; or
341	(E) violations of Section 41-6a-702 related to lane restrictions;
342	(d) the vehicle is provided to an official of the entity as part of a compensation package

343	allowing unlimited personal use of that vehicle;
344	(e) the personal security of the occupants of the vehicle would be jeopardized if the
345	"EX" license plate were in place; or
346	(f) the vehicle is used in routine enforcement on a state highway with four or more
347	lanes involving:
348	(i) violations of Section 41-6a-701 related to operating a vehicle on the right side of a
349	roadway;
350	(ii) violations of Section 41-6a-702 related to left lane restrictions;
351	(iii) violations of Section 41-6a-704 related to overtaking and passing vehicles
352	proceeding in the same direction;
353	(iv) violations of Section 41-6a-711 related to following a vehicle at a safe distance;
354	and
355	(v) violations of Section 41-6a-804 related to turning and changing lanes.
356	(3) Plates issued to Utah Highway Patrol vehicles may bear the capital letters "UHP," a
357	beehive logo, and the call number of the trooper to whom the vehicle is issued.
358	(4) (a) The commission shall issue "EX" and "UHP" plates.
359	(b) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
360	commission shall make rules establishing the procedure for application for and distribution of
361	the plates.
362	(5) For a vehicle that qualifies for <u>an</u> "EX" or "UHP" license [plates] plate, the entity is
363	not required to display the month or year registration decals described in Section 41-1a-402.
364	(6) (a) Information shall be confidential for vehicles that are not required to display the
365	"EX" license plate or the identification mark under Subsections (2)(a), (b), (d), and (e).
366	(b) (i) If a law enforcement officer's identity must be kept secret, the law enforcement
367	officer's agency head may request in writing that the division remove the license plate
368	information of the officer's personal vehicles from all public access files and place it in a
369	confidential file until the assignment is completed.
370	(ii) The agency head shall notify the division when the assignment is completed.
371	(7) A peace officer engaged in an organized operation under Subsection (2)(c) shall be
372	in a uniform clearly identifying the law enforcement agency the peace officer is representing
373	during the operation.

376	(1) A person who is the registered owner of a vehicle not subject to registration under
377	Section 41-1a-301, registered with the division, or who applies for an original registration of a

379	prescribed in Section 41-1a-1211 apply to the division for [personalized license plates] a
380	personalized license plate.
381	(2) Application shall be made in accordance with Section 41-1a-411.
382	(3) The personalized [plates] license plate shall be affixed to the vehicle for which
383	registration is sought in lieu of the regular license [plates] plate.
384	(4) [Personalized license plates] A personalized license plate shall be issued only to the
385	registered owner of the vehicle on which they are to be displayed.
386	Section 11. Section 41-1a-411 is amended to read:
387	41-1a-411. Application for personalized plates Refusal authorized.
388	(1) An applicant for [personalized license plates] a personalized license plate or
389	renewal of the [plates] plate shall file an application for the [plates] plate in the form and by the
390	date the division requires, indicating the combination of letters, numbers, or both requested as
391	a registration number.
392	(2) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (3), the division may refuse to issue any
393	combination of letters, numbers, or both that:
394	(i) may carry connotations offensive to good taste and decency or that would be
395	misleading; or
396	(ii) disparages a group based on:
397	(A) race;
398	(B) color;
399	(C) national origin;
400	(D) religion;
401	(E) age;
402	(F) sex;
403	(G) gender identity;
404	(H) sexual orientation;

405	(I) citizenship status; or
406	(J) physical or mental disability.
407	(b) The division may refuse to issue a combination of letters, numbers, or both as a
408	registration number if that same combination is already in use as a registration number on an
409	existing license plate.
410	(3) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2) or (3)(b), the division may not refuse a
411	combination of letters, numbers, or both as a registration number if:
412	(i) the license plate is an honor special group license plate as described in Section
413	41-1a-421, and the combination of letters, numbers, or both refers to:
414	(A) a year related to military service;
415	(B) a military branch; or
416	(C) an official achievement, badge, or honor received for military service; or
417	(ii) the combination of letters, numbers, or both as a registration number refers to an
418	official state symbol described in Section 63G-1-601.
419	(b) If an applicant requests a combination containing only numbers, the division may
420	refuse the combination if the combination includes less than four numerical digits.
