

Overview

The H.O.M.E. (Healing Opportunities to Mentally Excel) Court pilot will help individuals with serious mental illness receive treatment and care needed to stabilize. The pilot includes a petition and subsequent order by the court, intensive treatment, and housing services and support. The pilot provides targeted interventions and services that will help avoid high-cost services.

H.O.M.E. Court eligible adults will benefit from intensive case management because less restrictive alternatives may not prevent relapse or deterioration. This may include adults who are, or are at risk of, experiencing homelessness or housing instability.

Proposed pilot components

- System-wide coordination maximizes efficiency of HOME Court and current justice programs, behavioral health services, and treatment providers.
- Technology infrastructure to facilitate communication across court and community providers.
- Housing supports assist funding initial entry into housing and ongoing services to maintain housing.
- Case management teams coordinate and link individuals with treatment, housing, and other resources.
- One-time funding request to develop and coordinate processes, facilitate movement across barriers, and establish system-wide change.

Outcomes

- Develop a civil court system for individuals with complex mental health needs not adequately served in the current system.
- Prevent replication of services with increased coordination and communication providers.
- Decrease rotation through justice system and inpatient psychiatric care.
- Move people from shelter beds or streets to more stable housing.
