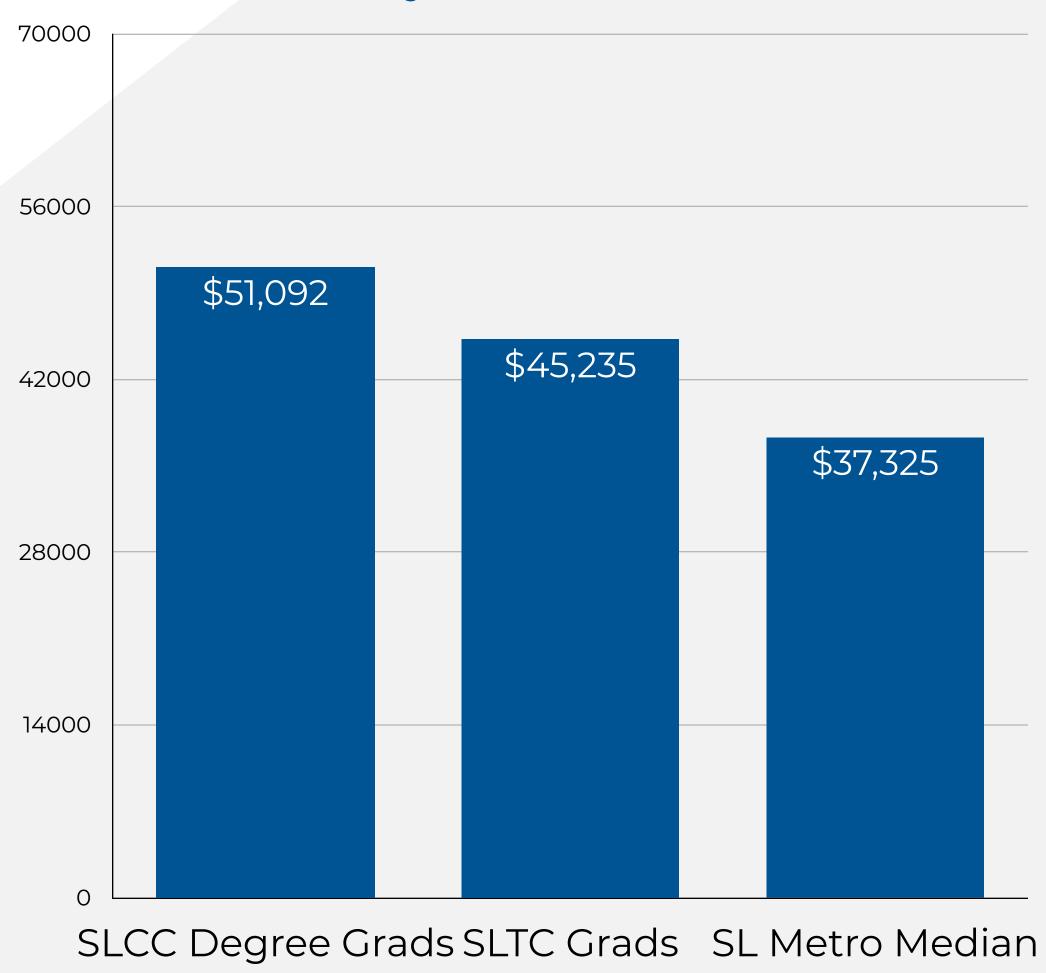

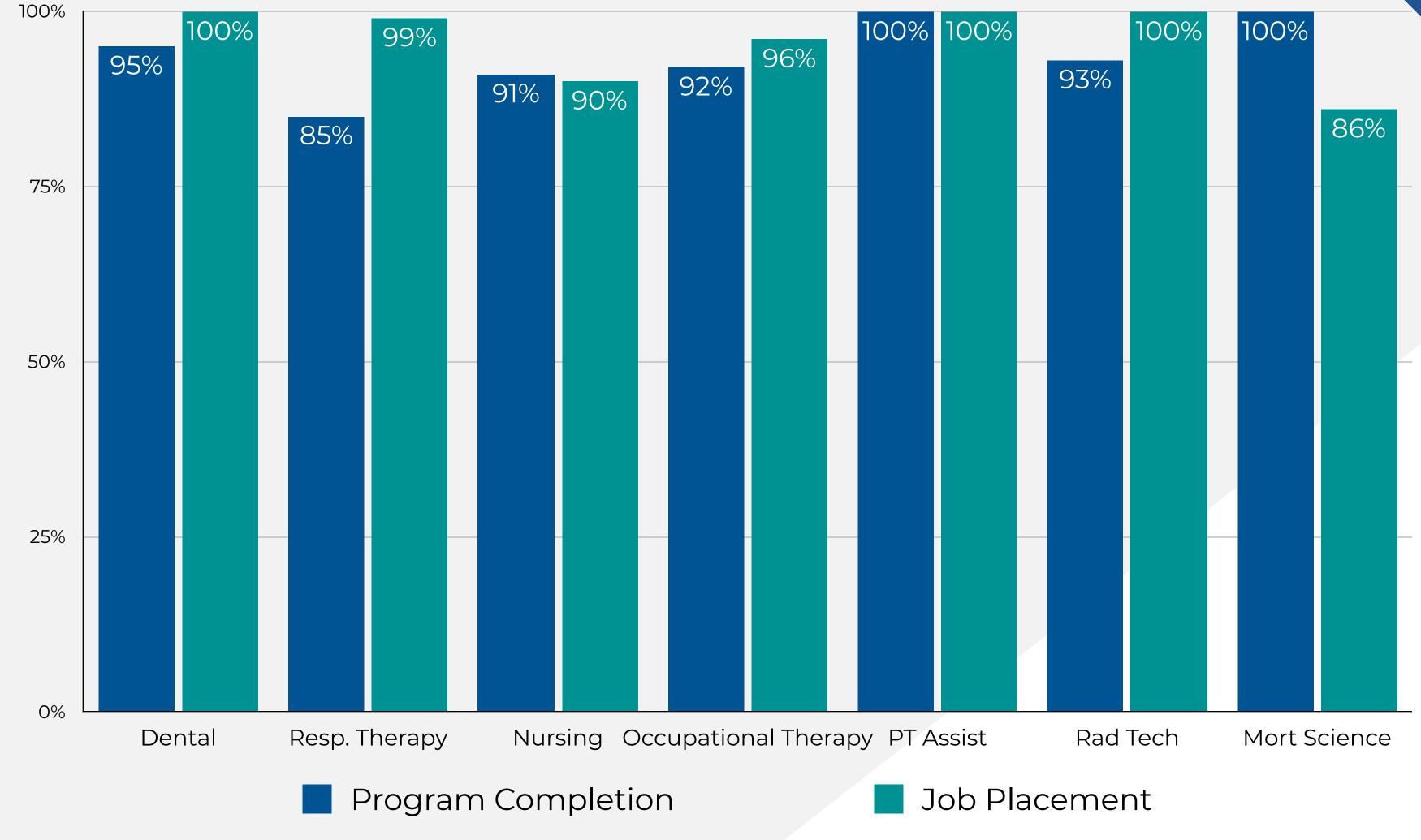

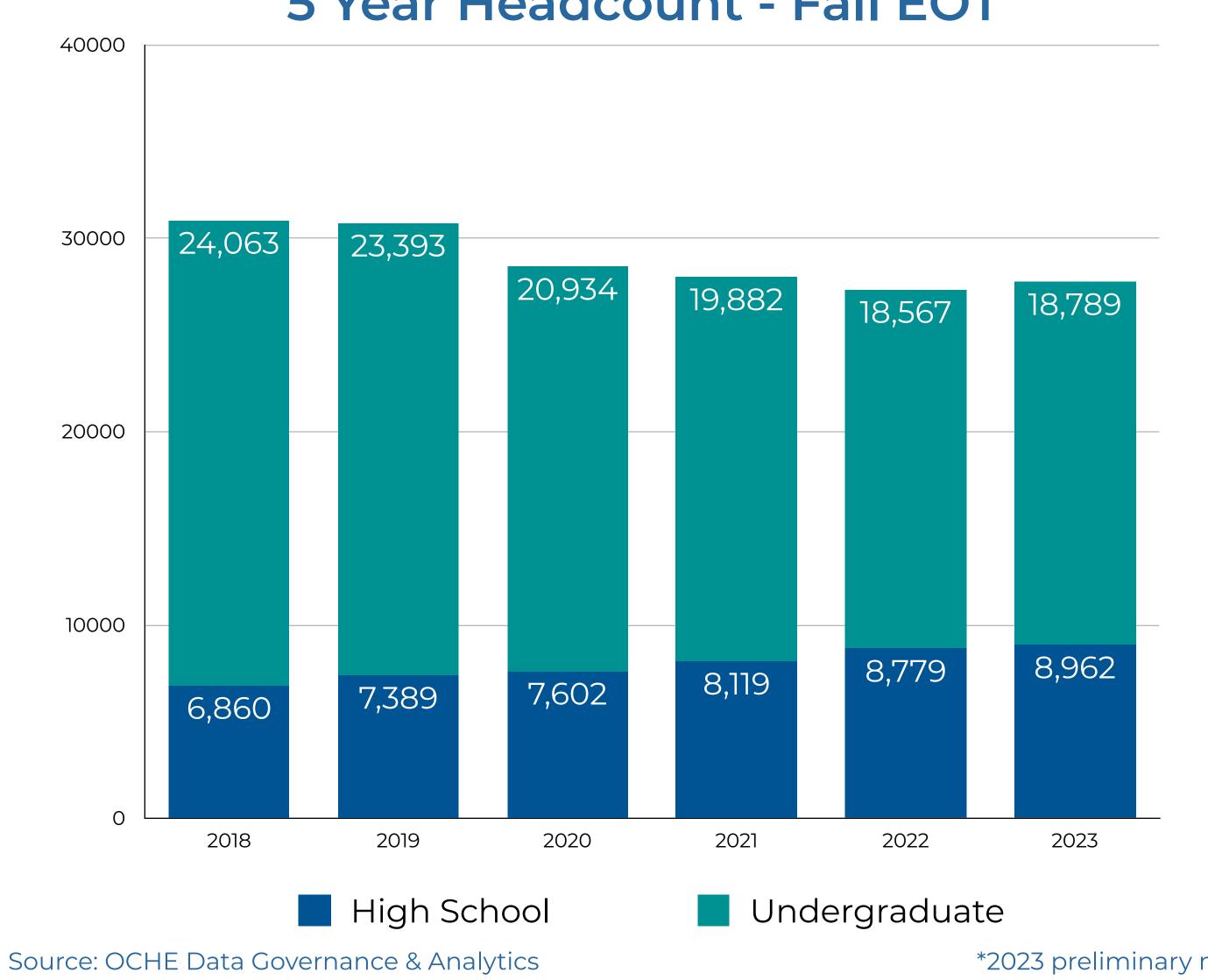

### TOTAL ENROLLMENT HISTORY: HEADCOUNT

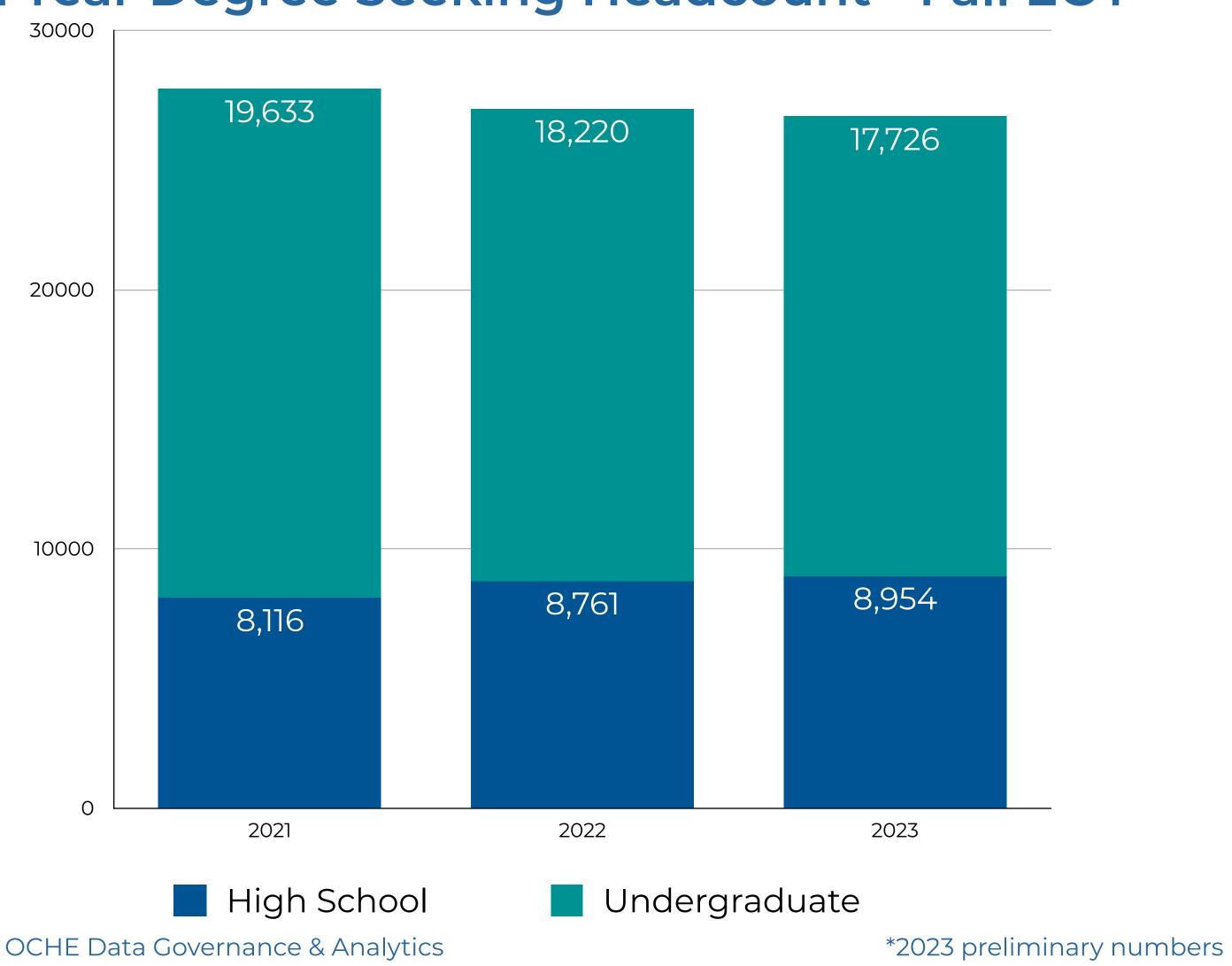
#### 5 Year Headcount - Fall EOT





## **ENROLLMENT HISTORY:** DEGREE SEEKING HEADCOUNT

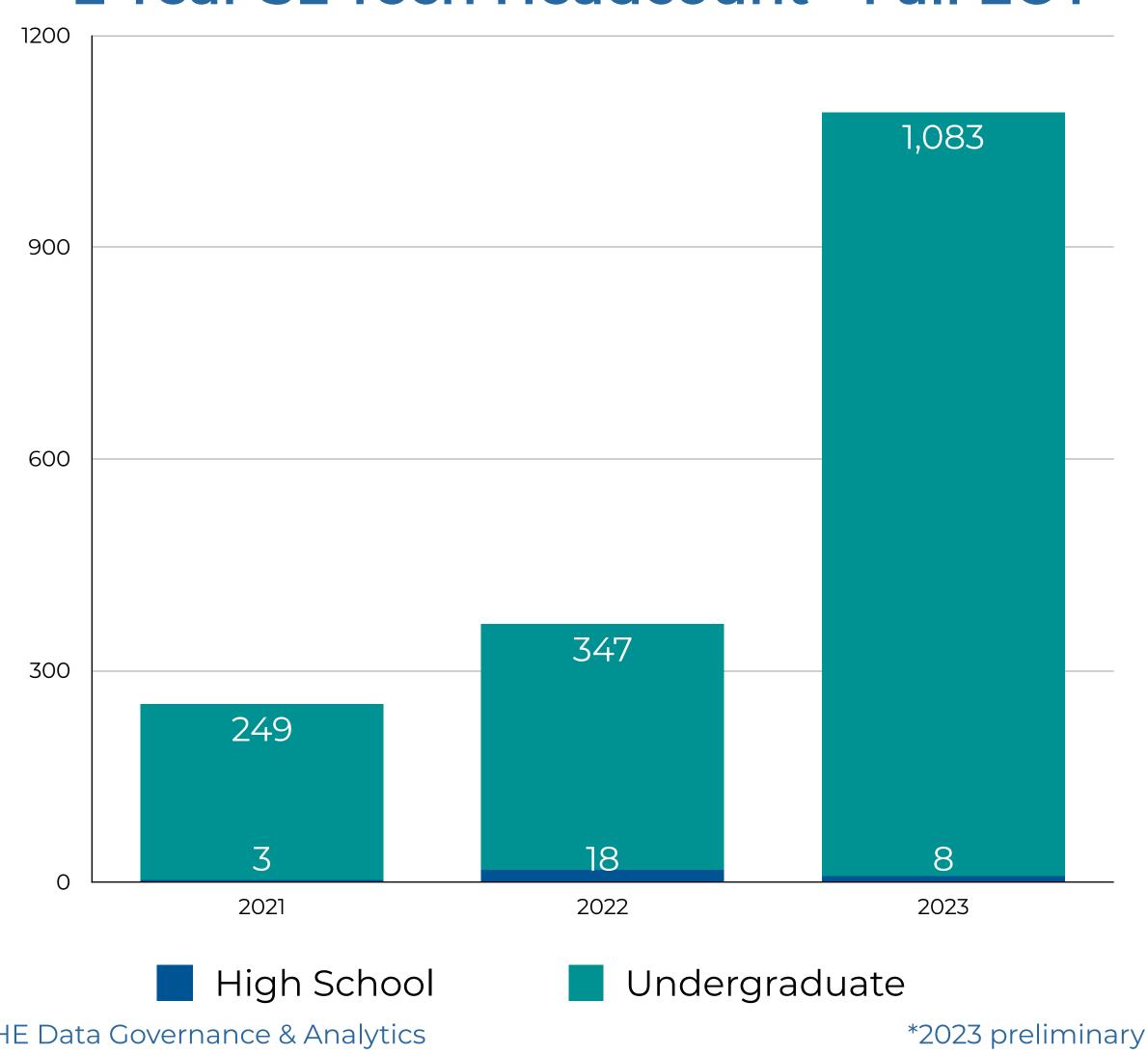
2 Year Degree Seeking Headcount - Fall EOT





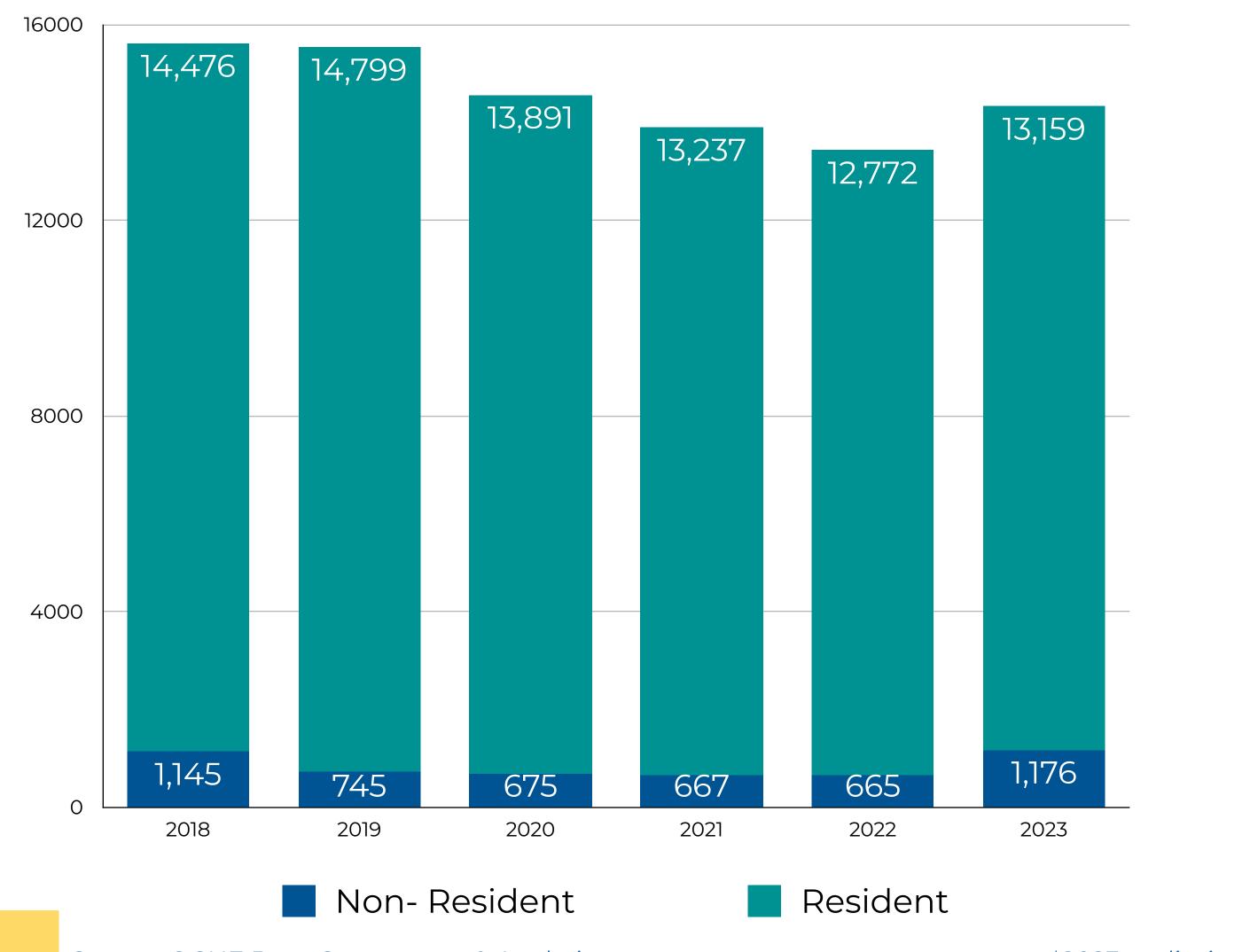

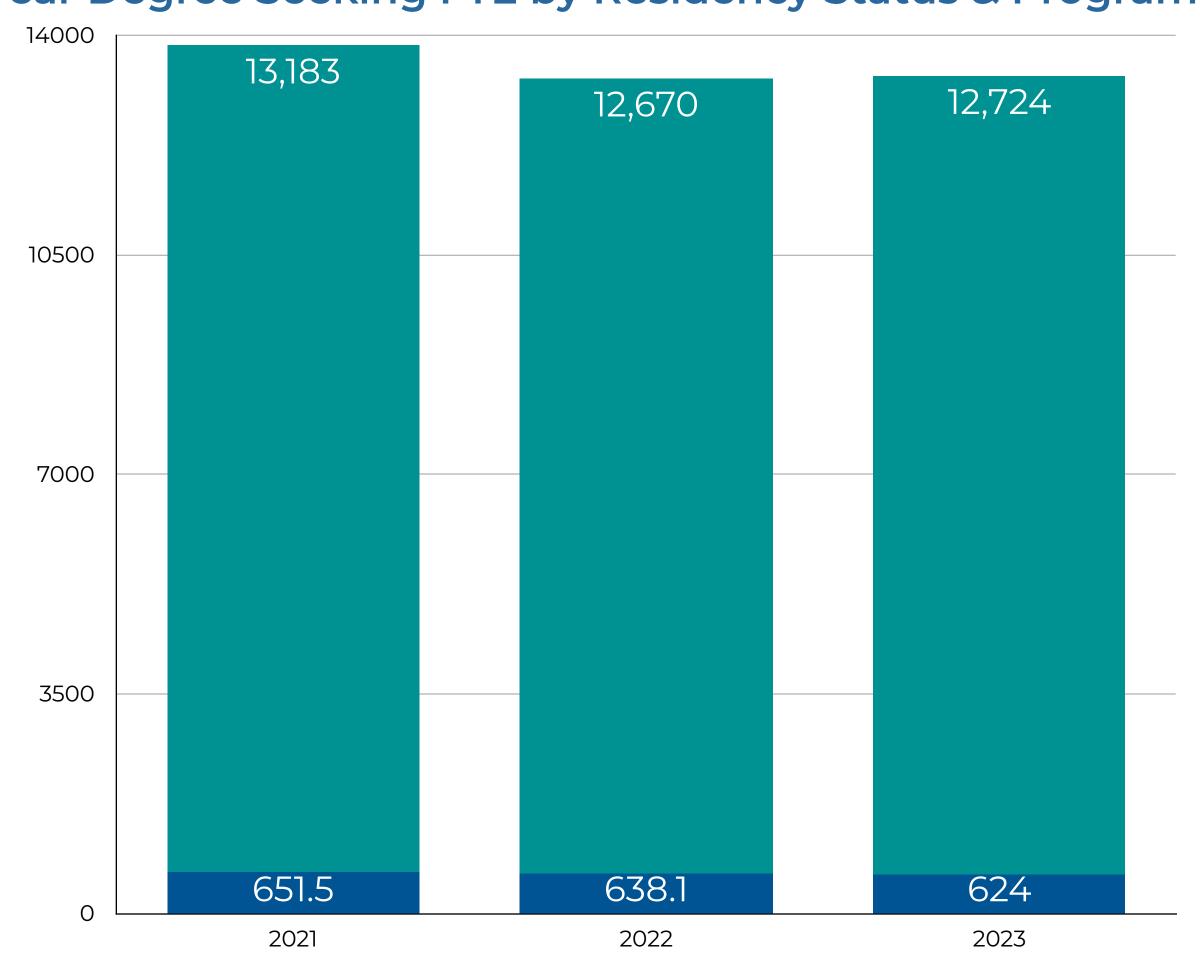
#### 5 Year FTE by Residency Status and Program Type

#### 2 Year Degree Seeking FTE by Residency Status & Program Type



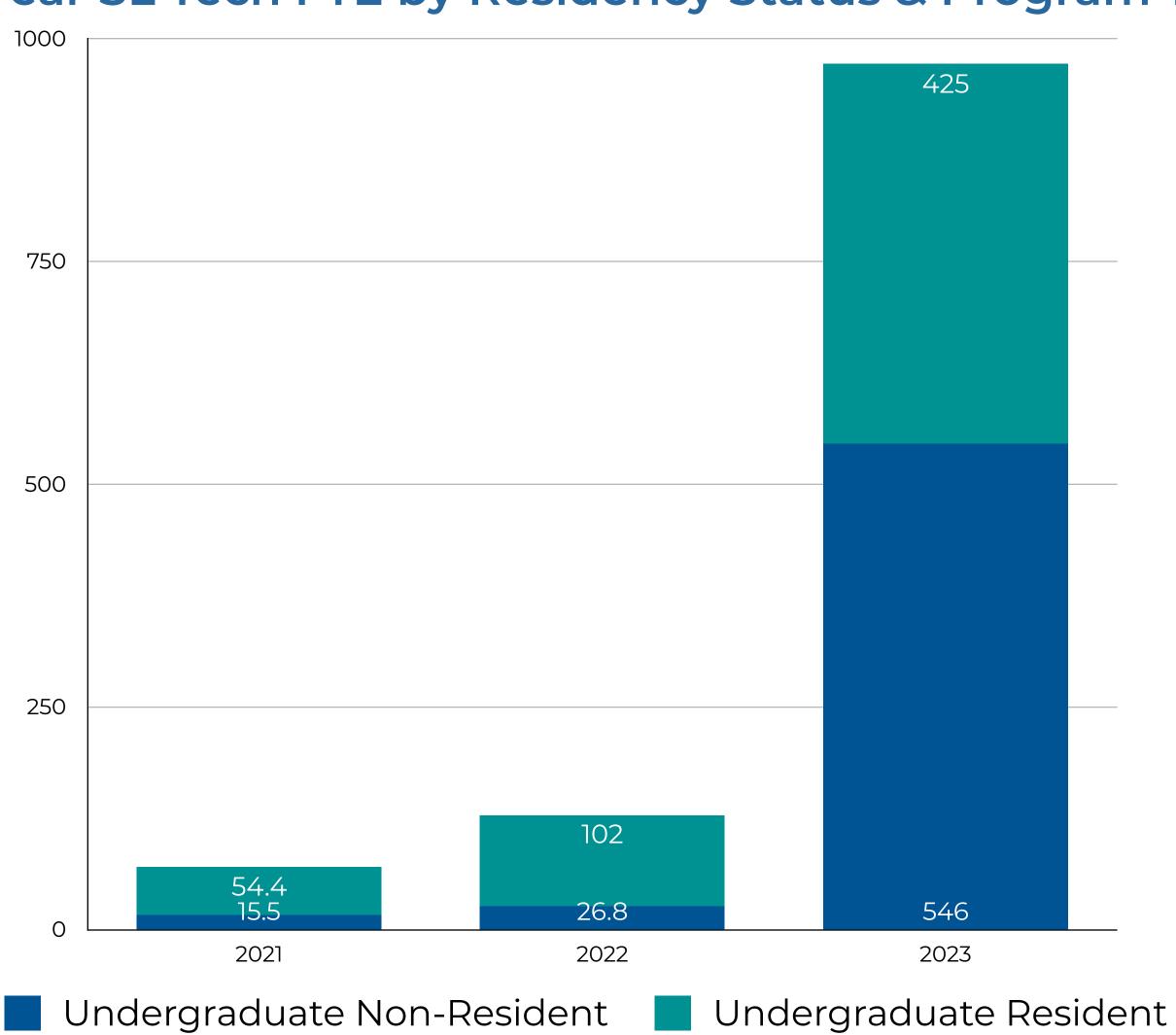

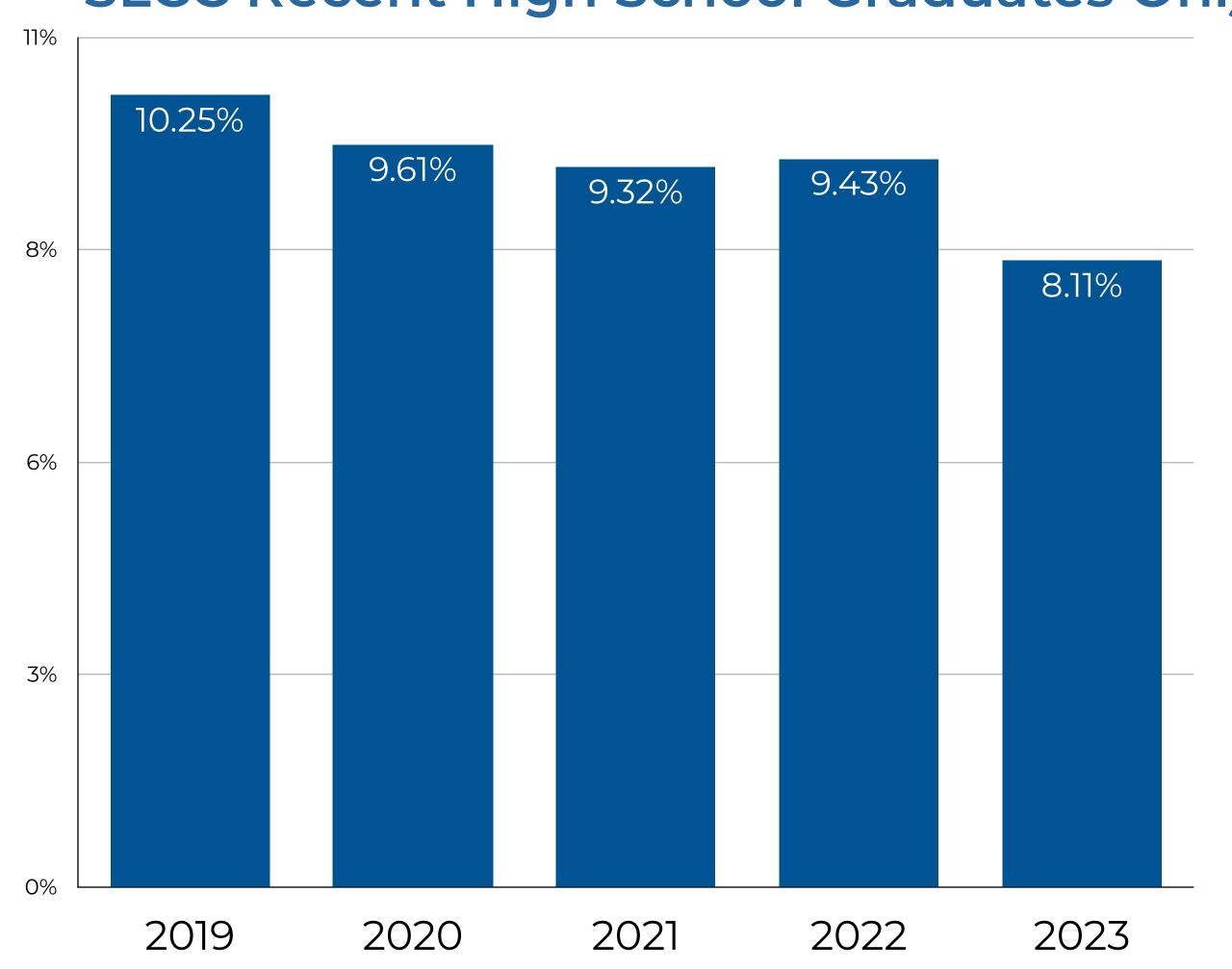
2 Year SL Tech FTE by Residency Status & Program Type





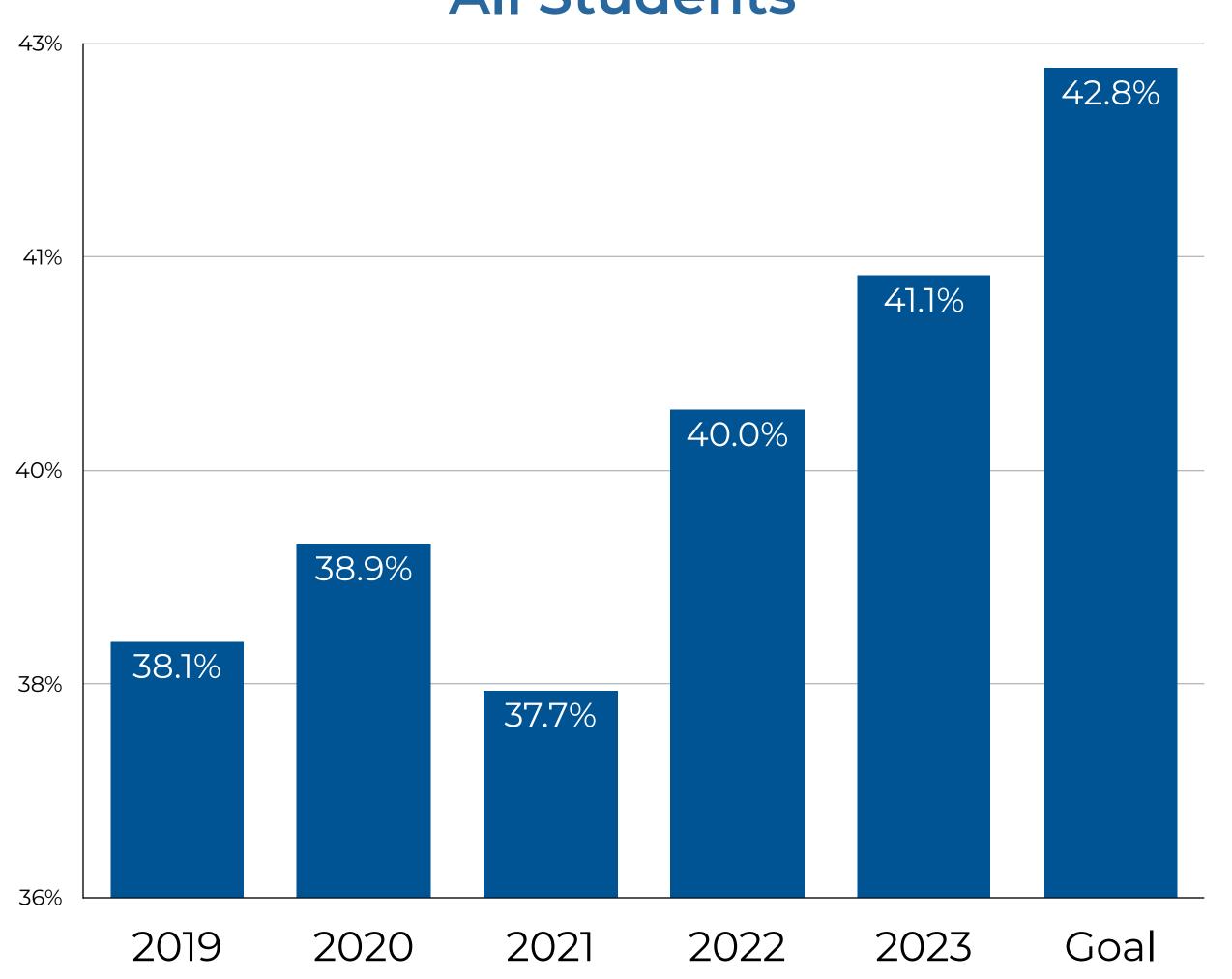

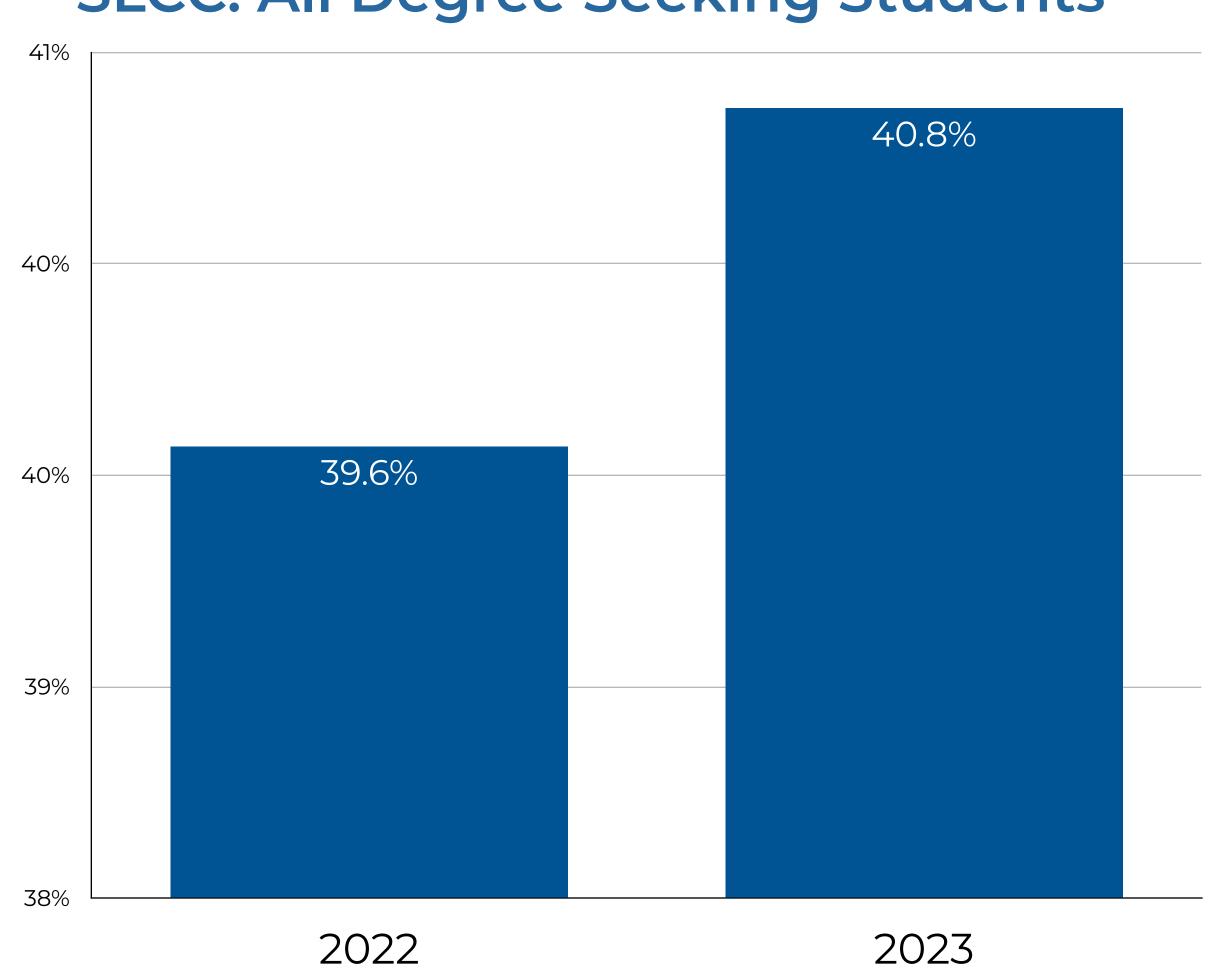

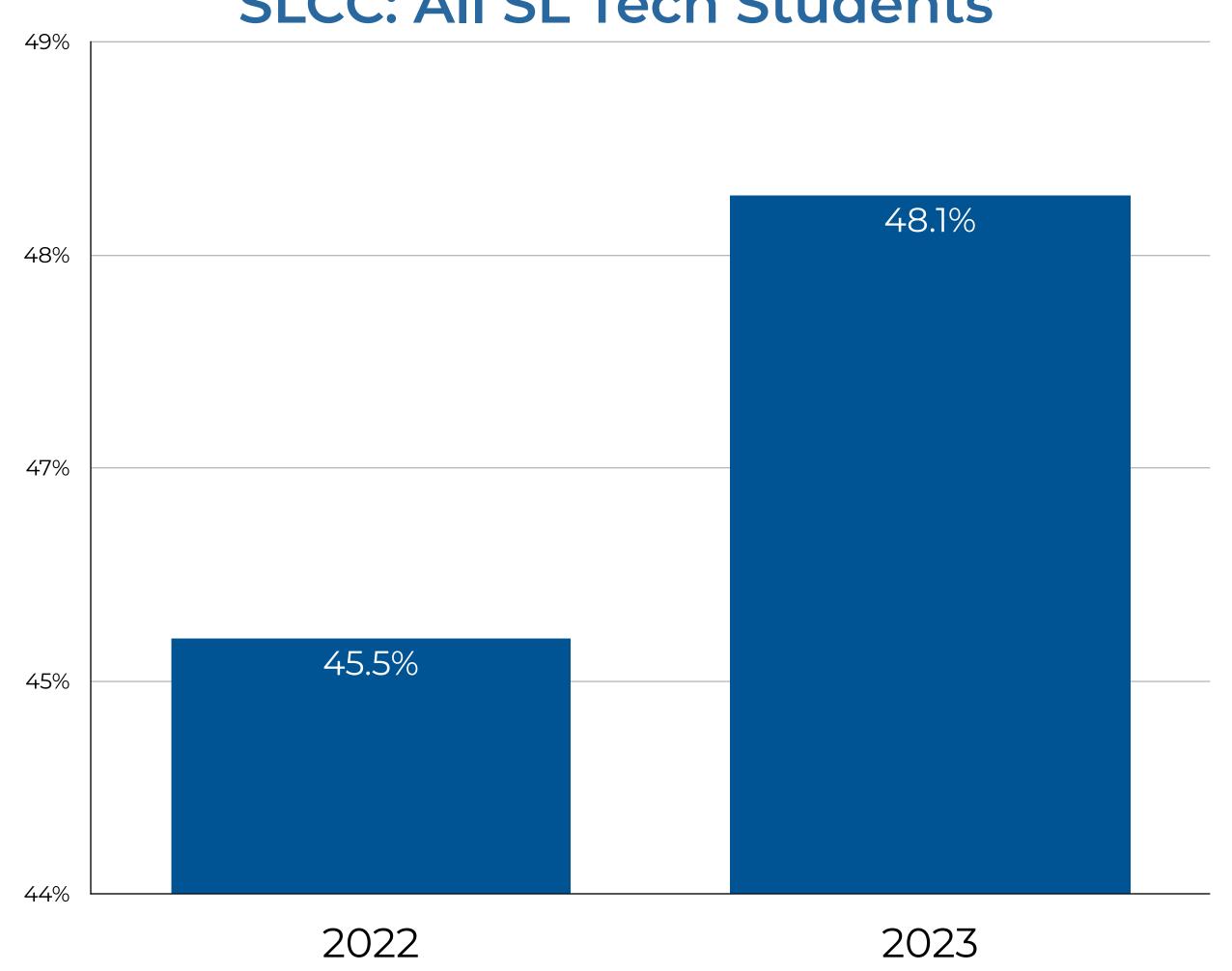

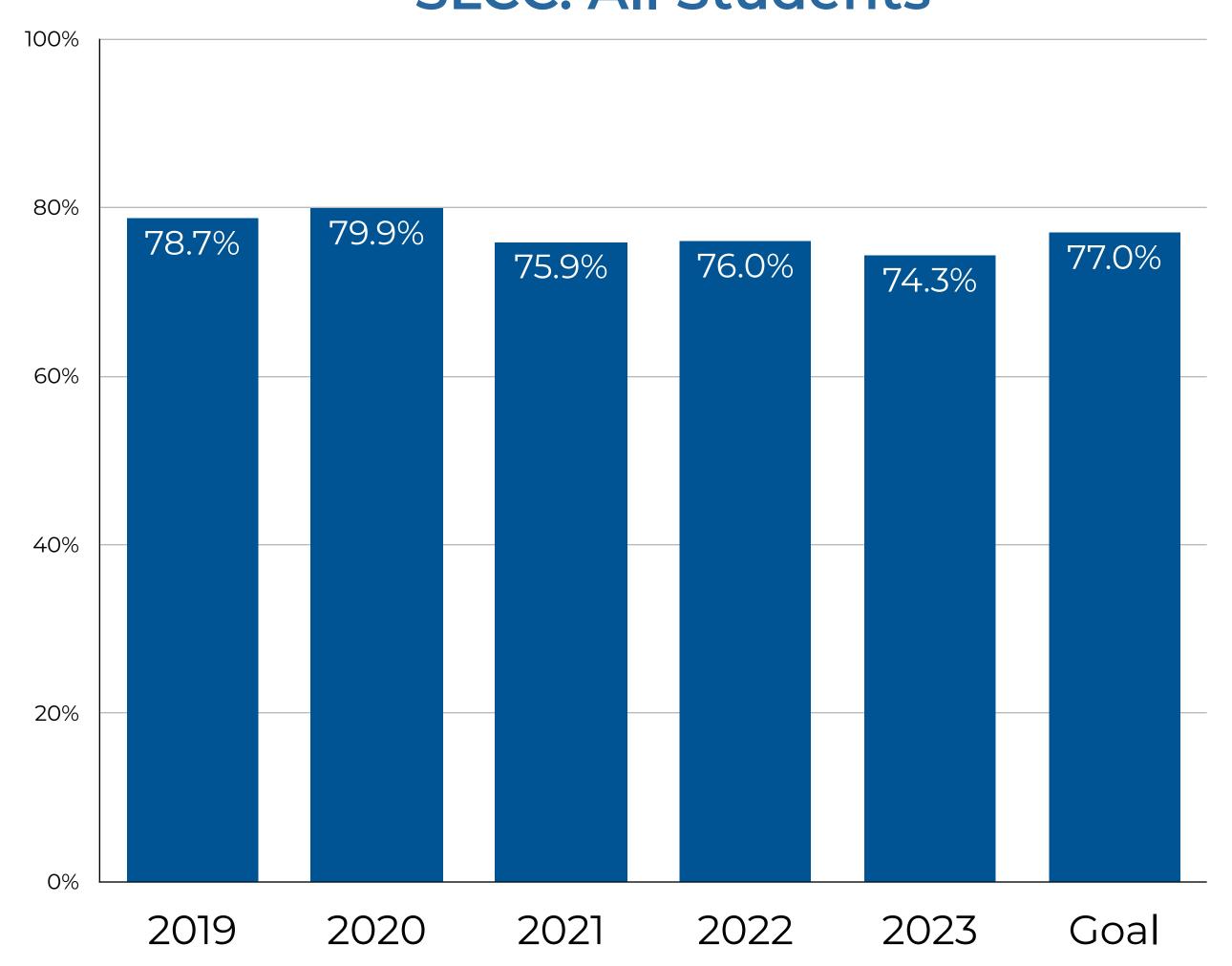

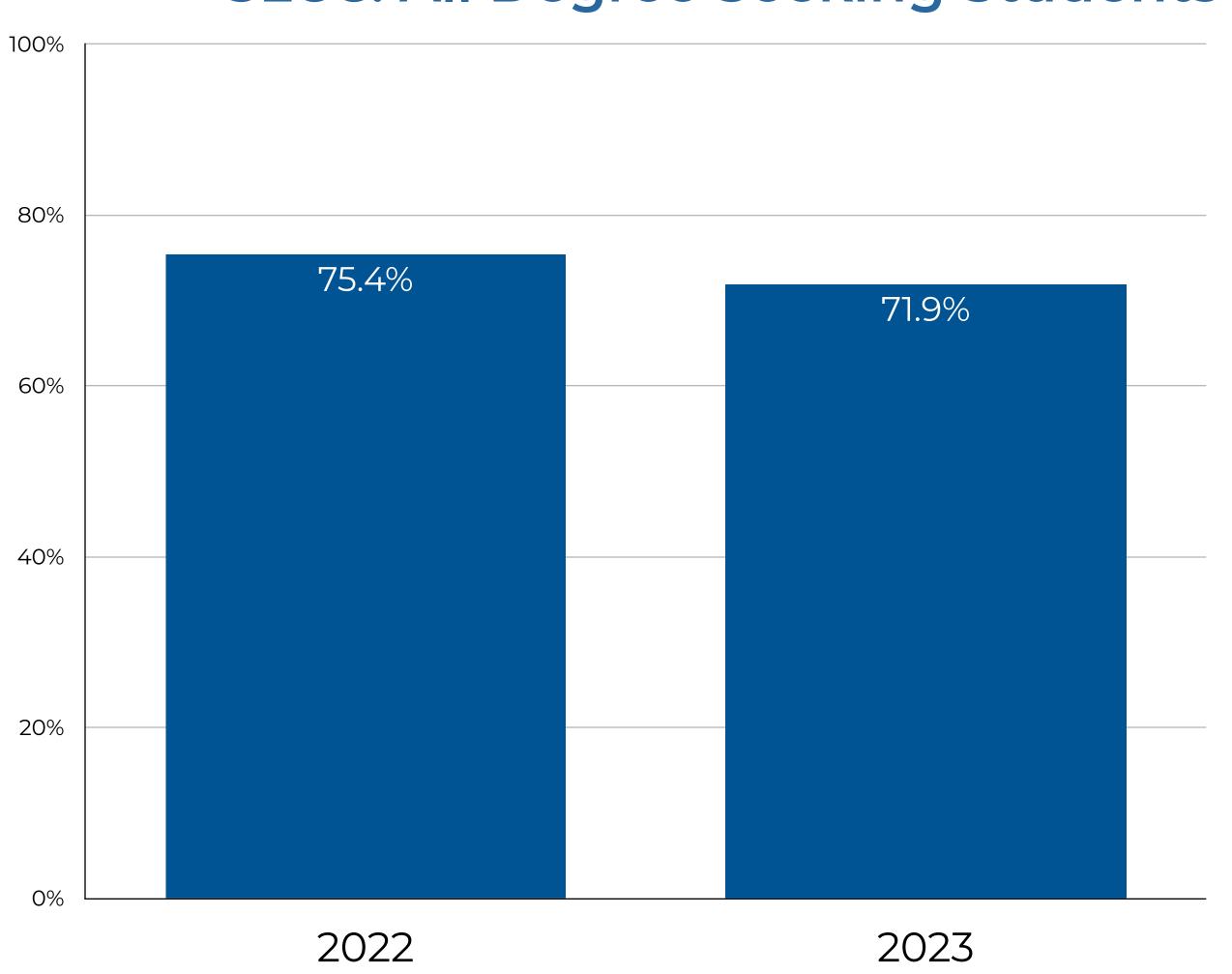

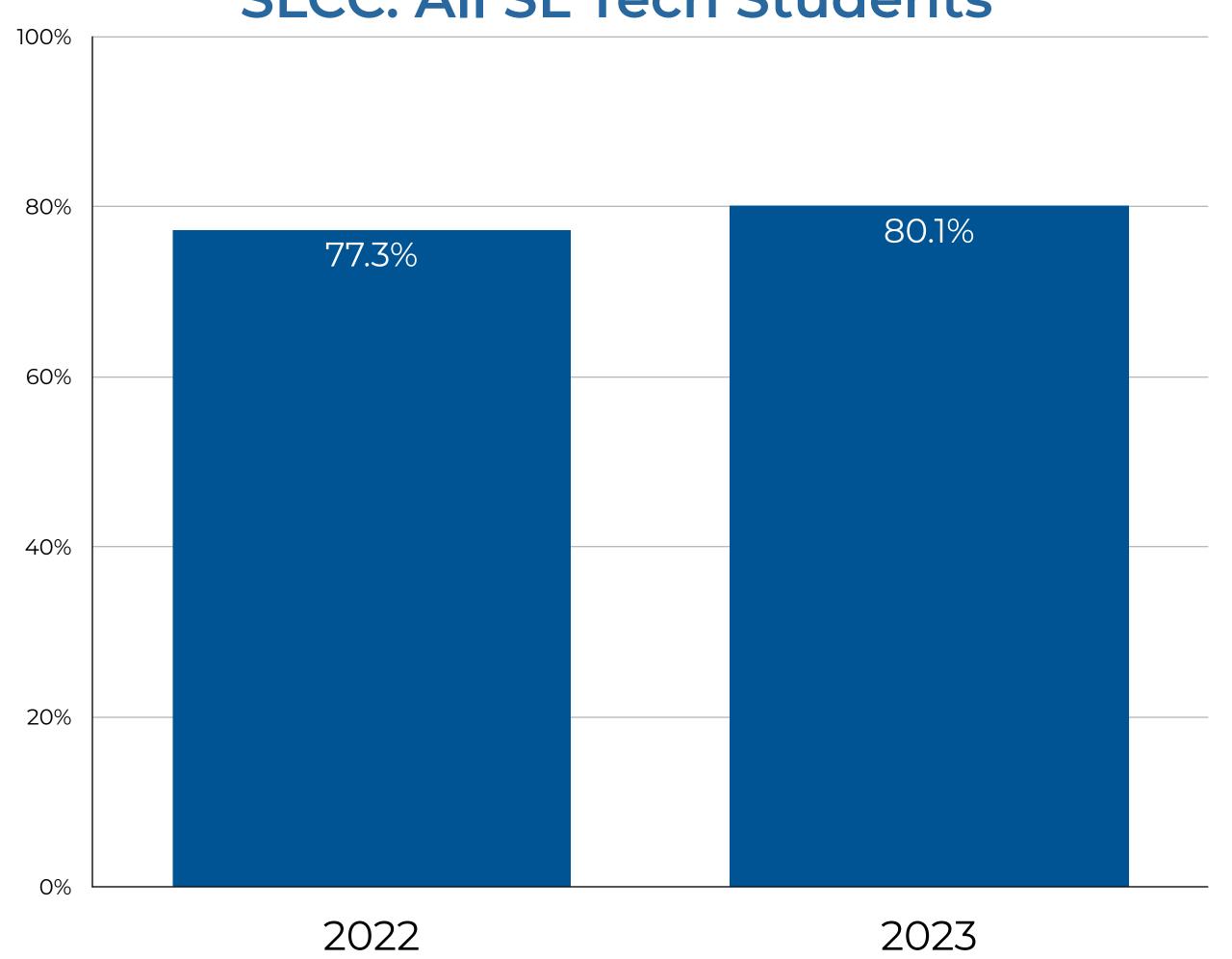

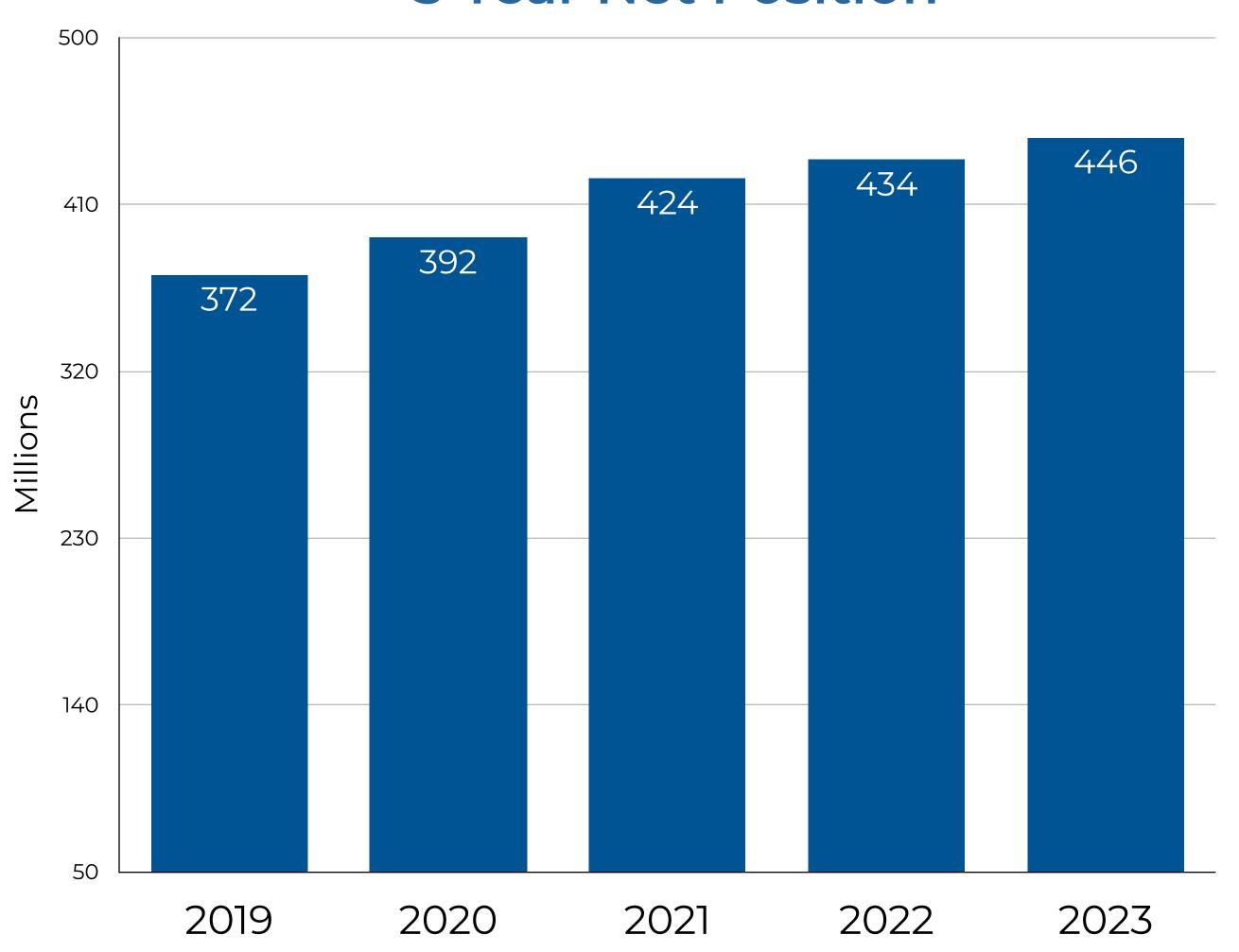

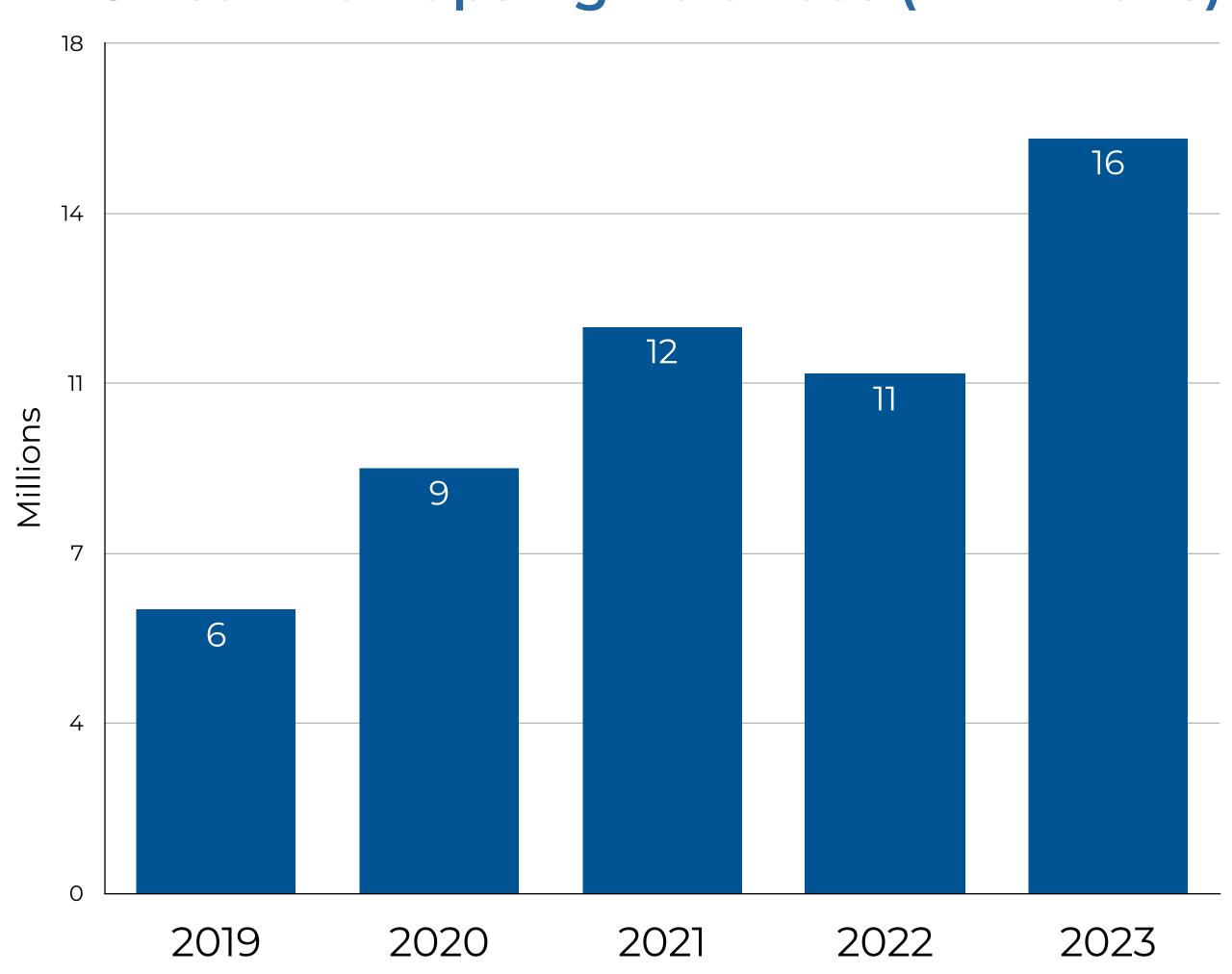
#### **5 Year Net Position**

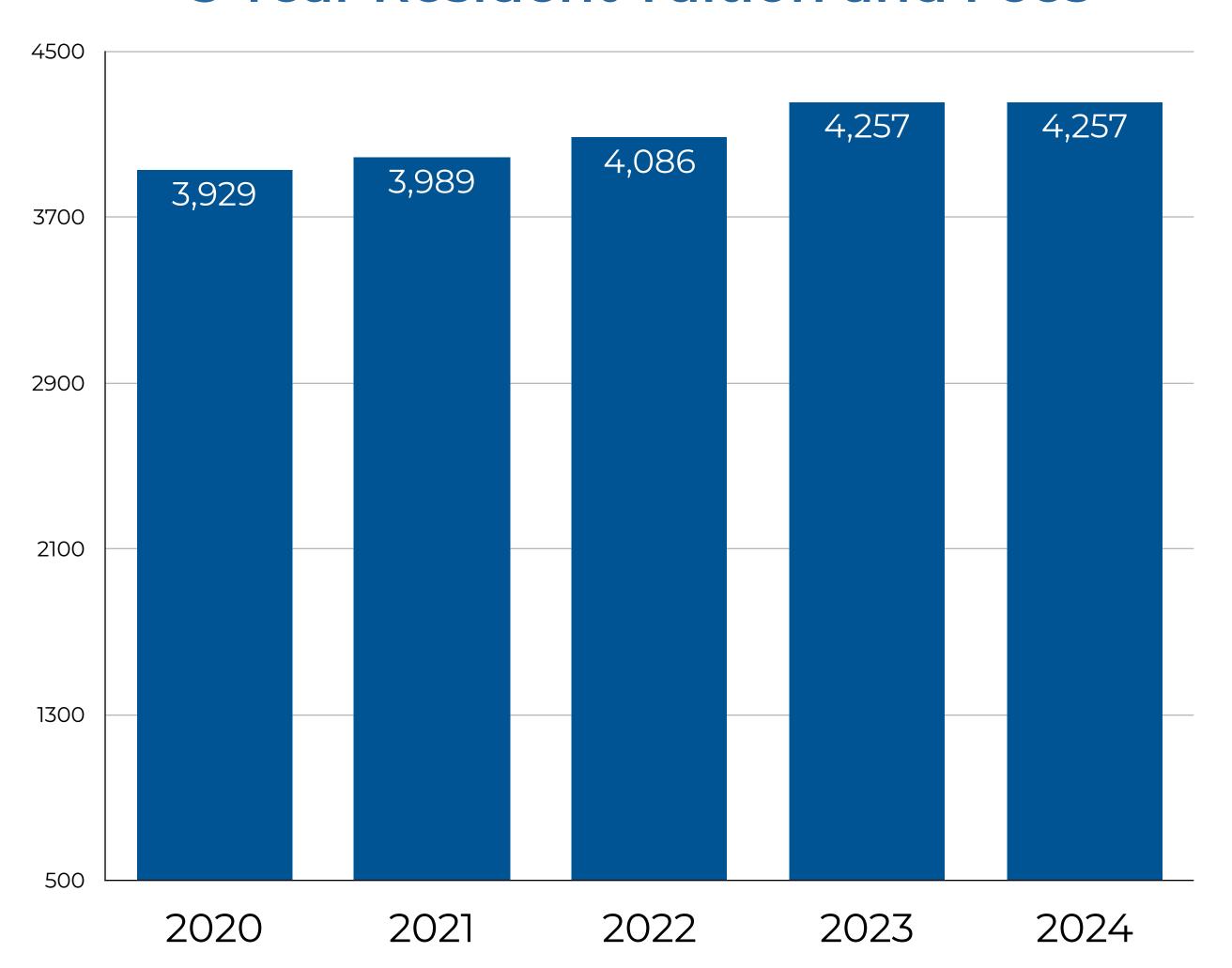
