Best Buddies continually strives to expand our presence and impact in Utah. This funding would help Best Buddies support existing programs and expand our presence to new schools to serve more students. Partial funding for the project would reduce Best Buddies' capacity to grow our presence in Utah beyond our existing programs. Therefore, with partial funding, we would be able to support our existing programs, but would need to seek additional external resources to expand to serve new Utah schools.

Section 4: Performance Outcome Measurement

Who would benefit from this request (who is the target audience)?

The requested funding will directly benefit students with and without disabilities attending 11 elementary, middle, and high schools in Utah. Students will participate in one-to-one friendships, inclusive social activities, and leadership development, which will benefit the individuals involved and their larger communities as they interact with classmates, family members, coaches and neighbors, and their communities allow the full participation of those with intellectual disabilities.

What is this project or program intended to accomplish?

Best Buddies affords the opportunity for students with disabilities and their typical peers to have meaningful social interactions. As a result, students with IDD gain appropriate social skills that help them become college and career ready. Additionally, students without disabilities learn that students with IDD have many strengths and abilities – knowledge which makes them understand the benefits of the participation of individuals with disabilities in schools, communities, and the workplace.

How will the Legislature know whether the project or program achieved its intended purpose?

The project will be successful if Best Buddies supports a minimum of 11 chapters located throughout Utah, engages a minimum of 520 enrolled participants, matches a minimum of 125 students with disabilities in one-to-one friendships with typical peers, provides a minimum of 44 inclusive group activities, and delivers leadership training to a minimum of 33 student leaders.

The Legislature intends that \$50,000 from the general fund provided by this item be ongoing and recurring funding to be used for school-based programs that develop social skills and friendships among students with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities.
