With legislative support, we work collectively to share resources and provide equitable access to high-quality and cost-effective information resources, research infrastructure, and support services. We have been statewide leaders to advance student success and research outcomes, improving the quality of life across the state while promoting fiscal responsibility.

CURRENT IMPACT

In 2018, the legislature provided an additional \$800,000 in ongoing funding, for a total of nearly \$3.7 million. This funding provides access to core electronic journals and databases available to *all* students and faculty at USHE's colleges and universities, resulting in:

RESEARCH


Increased faculty research through enhanced library collections

THE POWER OF SHARED SERVICES AND COLLECTIVE BUYING

The 2018 legislative funding increase enabled UALC to add subscriptions and combat annual publisher price increases for five years. With the growth in academic programs at institutions across the state, additional funding will enable UALC to strategically grow and sustain the core collection of **resources essential to continue training our students for high demand careers.**

UALC saves money via shared services and collective buying. The consortium negotiates pricing and licenses for critical databases supporting the educational and research mission of public higher education libraries in the state of Utah. Together we have leveraged our power to secure access, centrally funded through legislative allocation, for the following resources:
