



# WRI History

- Nearly 20 year old program
  - Hatched out of NRAEQ
- Housed in DNR Administration
  - Heavily supported by DNR agencies, especially DWR
- Program existed through funding only for first @ fifteen years
- 2022 HB131
  - Sponsored by Rep. Bennion, Sen Vickers
  - Codified the WRI program
  - Set policies, objectives, etc.
  - Passed with zero "No" votes





# WRI History

- **Ecosystem Values WRI focuses** on improving
  - Watershed health and biological diversity
  - Water quality and yield
  - Opportunities for sustainable uses of natural resources
- Program Accomplishments to date
  - Over 2,700 completed projects
  - Over 2.5 million acres, 2,500 stream miles restored
  - Nearly \$380 million invested
  - More than 700 funding partners






# Watershed Program Funding

# FY 2023 Accomplishments

- 101 Completed projects
- 86 Different funding partners
- 148,883 Acres completed
  - 31,518 acres fire rehabilitation
  - 117,366 acres proactive restoration
- 262 Miles of stream and riparian areas treated
- 523,120 Pounds of seed applied
- 70,089 Acres of new class III cultural resource inventory
  - 1,265 new sites located/avoided







# Funding Requests

- \$500,000 FY2024 supplemental request
  - One -Time General Fund request
  - To be used for already completed fire re-seeding, post-fire monitoring/research
- \$500,000 FY2025 request
  - One -Time General Fund request
  - Pre-load fire rehabilitation account in anticipation of summer 2024 fires



- Shovel ready projects


