- 79 (A) the department may submit clinical health information about a patient, to a
- 80 qualified network, via electronic exchange of clinical health information, if:
- 81 (I) the electronic exchange of clinical health information meets the standards



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82 established by the department under Section 26B-8-411; and

83 (II) the clinical health information was collected by an emergency medical service

84 provider performing emergency medical services for the provider's patient; 85

(B) in connection with providing emergency medical services to a patient, an

86 emergency medical service provider may, through electronic exchange, access the patient's clinical health information

1. Page 1, Lines 13 through 16:

- 13 modifies professional conduct standards for physicians, advance practice registered
- 14 nurses, and physician assistants { to include obtaining a parent or guardian signature
- 15 when completing an order for life sustaining treatment for a minor | related to do not resuscitate orders; and
- 16 makes technical and conforming changes related orders for life sustaining treatment.
- Page 3, Lines 81 through 82:
- 81 (s) for an advance practice registered nurse, { failing to comply with Subsection
- 82 <u>75-2a-106(3)(b)(iii) when completing an order for life sustaining treatment for the minor</u>} designating a child as do not resuscitate without parental consent .
- Page 4, Lines 114 through 115:
- (h) { failing to comply with Subsection 75-2a-106(3)(b)(iii) when completing an order
