





Existing Family-Friendly Guardrails:



53G-9-207

- Curriculum must be approved by USBE
- Parents must be notified in advance
- Parents must be able to preview the curriculum
- Parents are invited to attend the instruction with their children
- Parents can excuse their child from participation
- LEAs must provide prevention training to school personnel and parents at least every other year



S.B. 205

Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Amendments

- Requests \$1.5 million in ongoing funding for prevention education in Utah elementary classrooms
- Creates a state contract with a primary prevention education provider responsible for state-wide outreach, tracking, reporting, and education
- Provides flexibility and funding for schools using other approved providers
- Further ensures that prevention curriculum is age appropriate





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
