

Conflict of Interest Disclosure Modifications

- We were not able to find a way, at a cost that could be funded in this year's budget, to allow local officials to use the State's disclosure website to file their conflict-of-interest disclosure. I hope to get there in a future year.
- This bill impacts elected officials in the following Political Subdivisions:
 - County
 - Municipal (Cities)
 - School District
 - Special District
 - State Land Use Authority (Elected or Appointed Officials)



HB80 S1

Conflict of Interest Disclosure Modifications

This Bill Does NOT:

- Change WHO is required to file a conflict-of-interest disclosure
- Eliminate any special or unique requirements a political subdivision may have related to conflict-of-interest disclosures

This Bill Does:

- Change WHERE conflict of interest disclosures are **POSTED** for elected officials & State Land Use Authorities
- Standardizes who must file annually
- Clarifies enforcement responsibilities and standard penalties

Conflict of Interest Disclosure Modifications

Key Policy Points

- Local Officials will now be required to post conflict-of-interest disclosures on their organization's website (many do today, but not all)
- Each official is required to file/amend a conflict-of-interest disclosure annually between January 1-January 31st
- If an official fails to file a conflict-of-interest statement, the clerk/recorder/administrator gives them notice within 5 days.
- After being notified, if they again fail to file the conflict-of-interest statement within another 7 days they are subject to a \$100 civil fine



Conflict of Interest Disclosure Modifications

Additional Policy Points

- Raises “substantial interest” in a regulated business from ~~\$2,000~~ to \$5000.
- Clerk/recorder/administrator posts disclosures on each organization’s website & sends a link (one time) to Lt. Governor’s Office.
- Lt. Governor’s disclosure site will provide a centralized directory that will link to each local entity’s site
- Campaign Financial Reports will also now be posted on the local entity’s website. The Lt. Governor’s disclosure site will provide a centralized directory that will link to each local entity’s site.



Conflict of Interest Disclosure Modifications

Key Policy Points – Special Districts

- Captures only those special districts with an annual budget “*that is equal to or exceeds ten times the revenue and expenditure amount described in Subsection [51-2a-201\(1\)](#)*” (which is \$1 million in 2024)
- Unofficial List of Districts over \$10M (Source: State Auditor’s office)

Conflict of Interest Disclosure Modifications Key Policy Points – State Land Use Authorities

- Major State Land Use Authorities Included:
 - a. The Utah Inland Port Authority
 - b. The Point of the Mountain State Land Authority
 - c. The Military Installation Development Authority (MIDA)
 - d. The School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration
 - e. The Utah Housing Corporation
 - f. The Heber Valley Historic Railroad Authority; and
 - g. The Great Salt Lake Advisory Council
 - h. The Colorado River Authority
