


2024 Passed Legislation

Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Environment | May 15, 2024

The Legislature passed 64 bills during the 2024 General Session related to Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Environment (NRAE). The figure to the right shows the number of bills by subject. The table below lists each bill and provides a summary. Bill numbers are hyperlinked to the full bill.

This document is a general resource for legislators and may not include every piece of 2024 legislation related to NRAE.
