Business and Labor

2024 Interim Study Items

Reviewed proposed 2024 interim <u>study items list</u> for the Business and Labor Interim Committee.

Actions: Amended and approved the proposed interim study item list by adding a new study item regarding the scope of practice for paramedics and emergency medical technicians (EMTs) and modifying item #10 to permit consideration of any issue relating to professional licensure.

Granted the chairs authority to open committee bill files for items on the list.

Department of Commerce Audit

Reviewed the Legislative Auditor's report for the Systematic Performance <u>Audit</u> of the Department of Commerce, regarding professional licensure, real estate, and securities. Heard a response to the audit findings from the Department of Commerce and discussed changes related to the audit recommendations.

Insurance Investment Vehicles

Heard comments from the Insurance Department and a representative from the insurance industry on potential changes to Utah Code Ann., <u>Title 31A. Chapter 18</u>. Discussed having the chairs open a committee bill file on the regulation of insurance investment vehicles.

Licensing Mobility

Heard from the Division of Professional Licensing and the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs regarding license portability for active-duty military members and their spouses stationed in Utah.

Sunset Review: Health Facility Administrators Act

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on procedures and options for sunset reviews. Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Division of Professional Licensing and heard comments from the Health Facility Administrators Board on extending the sunset date of the Health Facility Administrators Act.





Overview of Federalism Commission

Received an <u>overview</u> from commission staff regarding the statutory mandate and responsibilities of the commission, including changes from last year. Discussed appointing nonvoting members and reporting requirements.

Government Operations

2024 Interim Study Items

Reviewed the proposed 2024 interim study items list for the Government Operations Interim Committee.

Actions: Amended and approved the proposed interim study item list by adding an additional study item to examine the procedures and timelines for a state agency to act on a request for agency action.

Granted the chairs authority to open committee bill files for items on the list.

Availability of Election Documents

Discussed which election-related documents should be sealed after an election and which should be made available to election officials for research purposes and the study of election processes.

Action: Opened a committee bill file related to the availability of election documents to election officials for research purposes.

Ballots From Utah Post Offices

Discussed the current requirement that ballots mailed to voters must be mailed from within Utah in light of the relocation of the United States Postal Service processing center for southern Utah from Provo to Las Vegas. Heard from committee staff, the Davis County Clerk, and the Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

Action: Opened a committee bill file to address ballots mailed from a location outside of Utah.

Procurement Code Modifications

Received a <u>presentation</u> (slides 13-16) from the Division of Purchasing and General Services on clarifying the definition of "award" in the procurement code.

Prohibiting Terms in State Contracts

Received a <u>presentation</u> (slides 7-12) from the Division of Purchasing and General Services on state contracting. Discussed enacting an indemnification provision and prohibiting specific terms in state procurement contracts to which the state cannot agree and circumstances where negotiations by the state or the vendor are not feasible.

Purchasing From Community Rehabilitation Programs

Received a <u>presentation</u> (slides 2-6) from the Division of Purchasing and General Services on whether for-profit entities should be permitted to assist the Persons with Disabilities Advisory Board with the board's functions and policies. Currently, only not-for-profit associations may assist the board.

- clarify the legal protections for stepparents if the child's natural parent dies;

- clarify the post-judgment interest rate that is applied to foreign judgments.
