1:20 **2.** Government Response to Public Health Emergencies

Background

The committee will receive a presentation on strategies that state policymakers could consider to ensure that federal, state, and local government officials retain a role in planning for and responding to public health emergencies.

Potential questions for consideration include:

- What mechanisms are currently in place to promote government transparency during public health emergencies (public health orders of constraint and restriction, approved treatments, off-label treatments, public health response protocols, etc.)?
- How can local, state, and federal government systems more effectively balance public health recommendations against the right of an individual to make decisions with their



doctor, or healthcare practitioner, based on personal beliefs, conscience, or medical priorities?

- What are the rights or responsibilities of local and state government officials and public health officials to question public health decisions and directives made by federal or global health officials (World Health Organization, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, etc.)?
- What actions should the state legislature take right now to ensure that national or world organizations do not usurp state sovereignty either now or in the event of a potential public health emergency?

2:30 **3. Transgender Treatment for Minors**

Background

The committee will receive an update on certain statutory provisions established by $\underline{SB\ 16}$ (2023) – Transgender Medical Treatments and Procedures Amendments. Specifically, the Department of Health and Human Services will provide an update on the 'Systematic Medical Evidence Review of Hormonal Transgender Treatments,' in accordance with UCA $\underline{26B-1-239}$, and the Division of Professional Licensing will provide an update on the 'Transgender Treatment Certification,' in accordance with UCA $\underline{58-1-603}$.

Additionally, the committee will be briefed on recent studies related to transgender treatment for minors, including 'The Cass Review: Independent Review of Gender Identity Services for Children and Young People,' a report commissioned by the National Health Service England to "... make recommendations on how to improve NHS gender identity services, and ensure that children and young people who are questioning their gender identity or experiencing gender dysphoria receive a high standard of care, that meets their needs, is safe, holistic and effective."
