Issues
Created

1. Messy Ballot

ASD board member: "I want to point out how important it is that we put out something clear and understandable that is going to be on the ballot... there is a problem for our public when they see two things that are interrelated on the ballot."

"I don't believe that the three processes outlined in code for dividing a school district were ever intended to be enacted at the same time. The potential for confusion on the ballot cannot be overstated."

2. Messy Result

- If multiple splits pass, which proposal is implemented?
- If an interlocal passes but the district proposal fails, what happens?
