Consider recommendations from the Education Advisory Board (53-22-104.2)

Prioritize needs for <u>general grants</u> to local education agencies (\$50M appropriation)

Consult with the Huntsman Mental Health Institute on additional supports and school safety enhancements to the SafeUT Crisis Line (53B-17-1202)

Grant Subcommittee

(<u>53F-5-220(6)</u>)

Review local education agency applications for <u>targeted grants</u> (\$48M appropriation)

Provide recommendations for awards to the state board

Chairs appoint up to half of the Task Force; staffed by the School Safety Center



Grant Subcommittee

Utah Code 53F-5-220(6)

- Members of the School Security Task Force (53-33-104.2).
- Staffed by the USBE School Safety Center.
- "Review local education agency applications and provide recommendations for awards to the state board based on the criteria described in this section."



School Safety Needs Assessment

Utah Code 53G-8-701.5(1)

Every local education agency must do the following by December 31, 2024:

- Conduct a school safety needs assessment for each school.
- Determine needs and deficiencies for the following:
 - School safety personnel
 - Physical building security and safety, including upgrades to facilities and technology
 - Current threat and emergency response protocols, including agreements with local law enforcement
- Report results to the State Security Chief and School Safety Center

Total Appropriation: \$104,306,100

Entity	Amount	Legislative Intent & Other Information
State Board of Education: General Grants to School Districts and Charter Schools	\$50,000,000	 General grants for school districts and charter schools; the Task Force (in coordination with the State Security Chief and School Safety Center) prioritizes the grants by need. Research expenses supporting the work of the Task Force, authorized by the co-chairs. (Lines 2805-2010)
State Board of Education: Targeted Grants to School Districts and Charter Schools	\$48,700,000	 Targeted grants to school districts and charter schools, based on the results of their needs assessment (53G-8-701.5). The Task Force's grant subcommittee reviews applications and provides recommendations for awards. (Lines 2811-2812; 53F-5-220, 53G-8-701.5)

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State Board of Education: Early Warning Software	\$2,100,000	Select a third-party provider for a statewide contract for student intervention early warning software. Local education agencies use funds for an online data reporting tool, digital platform, or to enhance existing tools. (Lines 2798-2801)
State Board of Education: Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind (USDB)	\$45,700	Implementation costs specific to USDB
Commissioner of Public Safety: State Security Chief	\$2,118,100	 Personnel Equipment, vehicles, other costs School guardian stipends (Lines 2777-2788)
Commissioner of Public Safety: One-time Costs	\$1,300,000	One-time costs related to the State Security Chief's responsibilities. (Lines 2812-2817; 53-22-102)
Legislature: Senate, House, and LRGC	\$42,300	Administrative costs (Lines 2829-2841)
