Hide and Seek: *Don't worry, no one can see us. Oops, I forgot this interview is being recorded.*

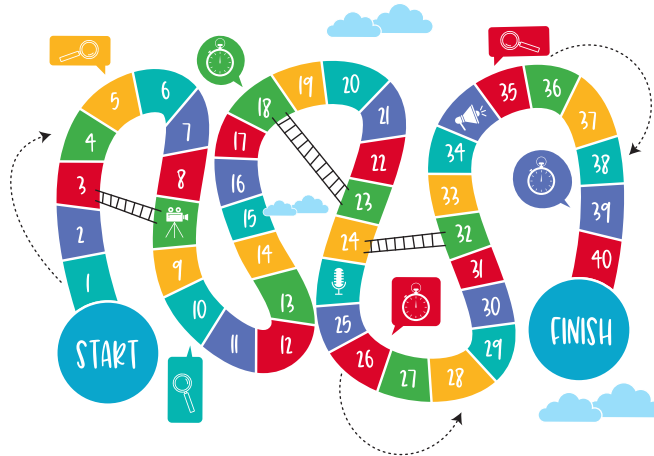


District Attorney's Office and State Auditor's Staff conspire to knowingly violate GRAMA.

Sorry [the game]: *Justifying a no contest to a plea an abeyance to a single misdemeanor after 6 plus years*

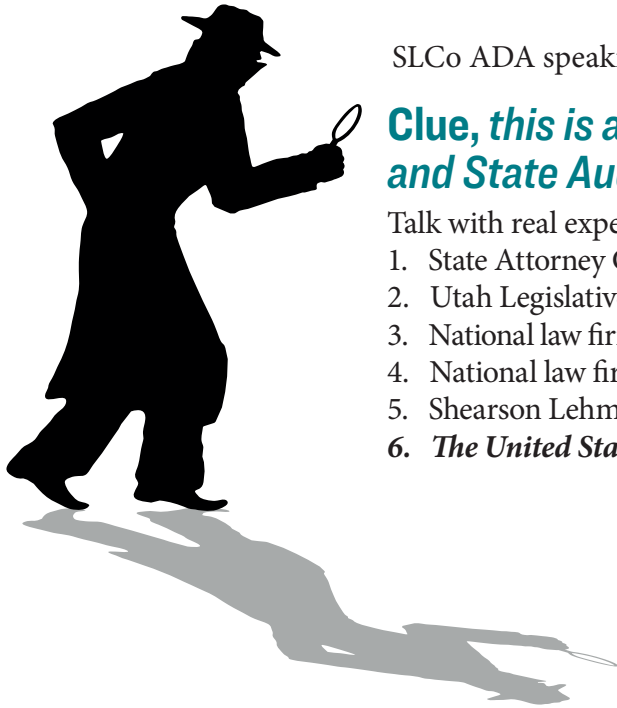
Deputy District Attorney Williams "There is no restitution owed to the State... and I have a new job to start..."
