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32	[(a)] the practice of mental health therapy, direct client care, direct clinical supervision,
33	direct observation, and other duties and activities completed in the course of the
34	day-to-day job functions and work of [-a]:
35	[(i)] (a) a certified social worker;
36	[(ii)] (b) an associate marriage and family therapist;
37	[(iii)] (c) an associate clinical mental health counselor; or
38	[(iv)] (d) an associate master addiction counselor, wherein the supervisor is available for
39	consultation with the supervisee by personal face-to-face contact, or direct voice
40	contact by telephone, radio, or other means within a reasonable time consistent with
41	the acts and practices in which the supervisee is engaged.
42	(4) "Clinical supervisor" means an individual who oversees and mentors one or more
43	mental health therapists licensed under this chapter, and who:
44	(a)(i) is licensed, in good standing, as a mental health therapist;
45	(ii) is approved or certified in good standing as a supervisor by a national
46	professional organization for social work, mental health counseling, addiction
47	counseling, marriage and family therapy, psychology, medicine, or nursing, or
48	other organization as approved by the division;
49	(iii)(A) has completed eight or more hours of supervision instruction that meets
50	minimum standards established by the division in rule; or
51	(B) has completed a graduate course on clinical supervision from an accredited
52	program;
53	(iv) completes continuing education in clinical supervision, as established by the
54	division in rule; and
55	(v) provides supervision to no more than the number of individuals to whom the
56	supervisor can reasonably provide clinical supervision by performing the duties
57	and responsibilities of a supervisor, including:
58	(A) being available to the supervisee for consultation by personal face-to-face
59	contact, or by direct voice contact by telephone, video conference, or other
60	means within a reasonable time frame;
61	(B) providing instruction, direction, oversight, observation, evaluation, and
62	feedback, to enable the supervisee to acquire the knowledge, skills, techniques,
63	and abilities necessary to engage in the practice of behavioral health care
64	ethically, safely, and competently; and
65	(C) maintaining routine personal contact with the supervisee; and

66	(b)(i) is qualified and acting as a valid supervisor, in accordance with applicable law
67	and division rules, as of April 30, 2024; and
68	(ii) has satisfied the requirements of Subsection (4)(a), as of January 1, 2027.
69	(5) "Confidential communication" means information obtained by an individual licensed
70	under this chapter, including information obtained by the individual's examination of the
71	client or patient, which is:
72	(a)(i) transmitted between the client or patient and an individual licensed under this
73	chapter in the course of that relationship; or
74	(ii) transmitted among the client or patient, an individual licensed under this chapter,
75	and individuals who are participating in the diagnosis or treatment under the
76	direction of an individual licensed under this chapter, including members of the
77	client's or patient's family; and
78	(b) made in confidence, for the diagnosis or treatment of the client or patient by the
79	individual licensed under this chapter, and by a means not intended to be disclosed to
80	third persons other than those individuals:
81	(i) present to further the interest of the client or patient in the consultation,
82	examination, or interview;
83	(ii) reasonably necessary for the transmission of the communications; or
84	(iii) participating in the diagnosis and treatment of the client or patient under the
85	direction of the mental health therapist.
86	(6) "Designated examiner" means the same as that term is defined in Section 26B-5-301.
87	(7)(a) "Direct client care" means the practice of mental health therapy performed as an
88	applicant for licensure.
89	(b) "Direct client care" includes:
90	(i) the practice of mental health therapy;
91	(ii) the utilization of patient-reported progress and outcomes to inform care; and
92	(iii) direct observation.
93	(8)(a) "Direct clinical supervision" means an applicant for licensure and the applicant's
94	direct clinical supervisor meeting in real time and in accordance with the applicant
95	for licensure's supervision contract as defined by division rule.
96	(b) "Direct clinical supervision" includes group supervision.
97	(9) "Direct clinical supervisor" means the clinical supervisor who has signed the
98	supervision contract with the applicant for licensure.
99	(10) "Direct observation" means observation of an applicant for licensure's live or recorded

100 direct client care: (a)(i) by the applicant for licensure's clinical supervisor; or 101 102 (ii) by a licensee under Subsection (4)(a) who the applicant for licensure's direct 103 clinical supervisor approves; and 104 (b) after which the applicant for licensure and the observer under Subsection (10)(a)105 meet, in-person or electronically, to discuss the direct client care for the purpose of 106 developing the applicant for licensure's clinical knowledge and skill. 107 (11) "FBI Rap Back System" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53-10-108. 108 (12) "Group supervision" means an applicant for licensure meeting with the applicant's 109 direct clinical supervisor and at least one of the direct clinical supervisor's other 110 supervised applicants for licensure: 111 (a) while the clinical supervisor and the applicants: 112 (i) can see and openly communicate with each other; and 113 (ii) are present in the same room or via electronic video; and 114 (b) for the purpose of developing the applicants' clinical knowledge and skill. 115 (13) "Hypnosis" means, when referring to individuals exempted from licensure under this 116 chapter, a process by which an individual induces or assists another individual into a 117 hypnotic state without the use of drugs or other substances and for the purpose of 118 increasing motivation or to assist the individual to alter lifestyles or habits. 119 (14) "Individual" means a natural person. 120 (15) "Mental health therapist" means an individual who is practicing within the scope of 121 practice defined in the individual's respective licensing act and is licensed under this title 122 as: 123 (a) a physician and surgeon, or osteopathic physician engaged in the practice of mental 124 health therapy; 125 (b) an advanced practice registered nurse, specializing in psychiatric mental health 126 nursing; 127 (c) an advanced practice registered nurse intern, specializing in psychiatric mental health 128 nursing; 129 (d) a psychologist qualified to engage in the practice of mental health therapy; 130 (e) a certified psychology resident qualifying to engage in the practice of mental health 131 therapy; 132 (f) a physician assistant specializing in mental health care under Section 58-70a-501.1; 133 (g) a clinical social worker;

141	(16) "Mental illness" means a mental or emotional condition defined in an approved
142	diagnostic and statistical manual for mental disorders generally recognized in the
143	professions of mental health therapy listed under Subsection (15).
144	(17) "Practice of mental health therapy" means treatment or prevention of another
145	individual's mental illness or emotional disorder, whether in person or remotely,
146	including:
147	(a) conducting a professional evaluation of an individual's condition of mental health,
148	mental illness, or emotional disorder consistent with standards generally recognized
149	in the professions of mental health therapy listed under Subsection (15);
150	(b) establishing a diagnosis in accordance with established written standards generally
151	recognized in the professions of mental health therapy listed under Subsection (15);
152	(c) conveying an opinion as to the validity of an individual's established diagnosis;
153	[(c)] (d) prescribing a plan for the prevention or treatment of a condition of mental illness
154	or emotional disorder; and
155	[(d)] (e) engaging in the conduct of professional intervention, including:[-]
156	(i) psychotherapy by the application of established methods and procedures generally
157	recognized in the professions of mental health therapy listed under Subsection (15)[-]
158	; and
159	(ii) modes of treatment designed to treat interpersonal dysfunction; and
160	(f) holding oneself out as providing, or has having the skills, experience, or training to
161	competently provide, any of the services described in Subsections (17)(a) through (e).
162	(18) "Remotely" means communicating via Internet, telephone, or other electronic means
163	that facilitate real-time audio or visual interaction between individuals when they are not
164	physically present in the same room at the same time.
165	(19) "Unlawful conduct" is as defined in Sections 58-1-501 and 58-60-109.
166	(20) "Unprofessional conduct" is as defined in Sections 58-1-501 and 58-60-110, and may
167	be further defined by division rule.

168	Section 2. Section 58-60-118 is enacted to read:
169	58-60-118 . Mental Health Professionals Education and Enforcement Fund.
170	(1) There is created an expendable special revenue fund known as the "Mental Health
171	Professionals Education and Enforcement Fund."
172	(2) The fund consists of money from administrative penalties collected pursuant to this
173	chapter.
174	(3) The fund shall earn interest, and all interest earned on fund money shall be deposited
175	into the fund.
176	(4) The director may, with concurrence of the board, make distributions from the fund for
177	the following purposes:
178	(a) education and training of licensees under this chapter;
179	(b) education and training of the public or other interested persons in matters concerning
180	the laws governing the practices licensed under this chapter; and
181	(c) enforcement of this chapter by:
182	(i) investigating unprofessional or unlawful conduct; and
183	(ii) providing legal representation to the division when the division takes legal action
184	against a person engaging in unprofessional or unlawful conduct.
185	(5) If the balance in the fund exceeds \$100,000 at the close of any fiscal year, the excess
186	shall be transferred to the General Fund.
187	(6) The division shall report annually to the appropriate appropriations subcommittee of the
188	Legislature concerning the fund.
189	Section 3. Effective date.
190	This bill takes effect on May 7, 2025.
