**LONG TITLE**

**General Description:**

This bill eliminates the compensation limit for a member of a board of trustees of a limited purpose local government entity.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

Section 1. Section **17B-1-307** is amended to read:

**17B-1-307 . Annual compensation -- Per diem compensation -- Participation in group insurance plan -- Reimbursement of expenses.**

(1)(a) Except as provided in Subsection 17B-1-308(1)(e), a member of a board of trustees may receive compensation for service on the board, as determined by the board of trustees.

~~[(b) The amount of compensation under this Subsection (1) may not exceed \$5,000 per year.]~~

~~[(e)] (b)[(f)]~~ As determined by the board of trustees, a member of the board of

trustees may participate in a group insurance plan provided to employees of the special district on the same basis as employees of the special district.

~~[(ii) The amount that the special district pays to provide a member with coverage under a group insurance plan shall be included as part of the member's compensation for purposes of Subsection (1)(b).]~~

~~[(d)]~~ (c) The amount that a special district pays employer-matching employment taxes, if a member of the board of trustees is treated as an employee for federal tax purposes, does not constitute compensation under this Subsection (1).

(2) In addition to the compensation provided under Subsection (1), the board of trustees may elect to allow a member to receive per diem and travel expenses for up to 12 meetings or activities per year in accordance with rules adopted by the board of trustees or Section 11-55-103.

Section 2. Section **17D-1-305** is amended to read:

**17D-1-305 . Compensation for administrative control board members.**

An administrative control board member may receive compensation, per diem, and reimbursement of travel expenses as provided in Section 17B-1-307 to the same extent as if the member were a member of a board of trustees of a special district.

Section 3. **Effective date.**

This bill takes effect on May 7, 2025.
