LONG TITLE
General Description:
This bill allows the State Board of Education (state board) to adjust funding for charter
schools with significant enrollment underestimates.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 provides the state board discretionary authority to allocate funds to adjust charter school
enrollment estimates;
 specifies funding sources in priority order;
 requires reporting to the Office of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst and the Governor's
Office of Planning and Budget; and
 exempts adjustments from certain budgetary requirements.

This bill provides a special effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 53F-2-707 is enacted to read:
53F-2-707 . Allocations for adjustment of initial enrollment estimates for charter
schools.
(1) As used in this section, "enrollment deficiency" means the difference between:
(a) the actual enrollment of a new or expanding charter school; and
(b) in accordance with Section 53F-2-208, the estimated enrollment of a new or

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32	expanding charter school the state board used in developing the state appropriation
33	for the applicable budget year for the new or expanding charter school.
34	(2) The state board may provide an allocation to adjust initial enrollment or weighted pupil
35	unit estimates for a new or expanding charter school if:
36	(a) the charter school requests an adjustment from the state board;
37	(b) the enrollment deficiency is more than 10% of the charter school's marginal
38	approved enrollment; and
39	(c) in accordance with Section 53F-2-208, the initial budgetary estimates the state board
40	used to develop the state appropriation for the new or expanding charter school did
41	not include or underestimated the enrollment for the applicable budget year.
42	(3) If the state board approves an allocation under Subsection (2), the state board may
43	provide additional preliminary weighted pupil units to cover costs until the completion
44	of the fall enrollment counts and the mid-year or end of year updates to the estimated
45	state funding distribution.
46	(4) The state board may use unencumbered balances from the following programs, in
47	priority order, to provide an allocation to a charter school under this section:
48	(a) without the consent or approval of the State Charter School Board, balances
49	remaining in the grants for charter school start-up costs under Section 53F-2-705;
50	(b) from prior year ending balances, balances remaining in the charter school levy state
51	guarantee under Section 53F-2-704; and
52	(c) unrestricted balances in the basic school program.
53	(5) The state board shall report actions the state board takes under this section to the Office
54	of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst and the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget.
55	Section 2. Section 63J-1-206 is amended to read:
56	63J-1-206 . Appropriations governed by chapter Restrictions on expenditures
57	Transfer of funds Exclusion.
58	(1)(a) Except as provided in Subsections (1)(b) and (2)(e), or where expressly exempted
59	in the appropriating act:
60	(i) all money appropriated by the Legislature is appropriated upon the terms and
61	conditions set forth in this chapter; and
62	(ii) any department, agency, or institution that accepts money appropriated by the
63	Legislature does so subject to the requirements of this chapter.
64	(b) This section does not apply to:
65	(i) the Legislature and its committees; and

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66	(ii) the Investigation Account of the Water Resources Construction Fund, which is
67	governed by Section 73-10-8.
68	(2)(a) Each item of appropriation is to be expended subject to any schedule of programs
69	and any restriction attached to the item of appropriation, as designated by the
70	Legislature.
71	(b) Each schedule of programs or restriction attached to an appropriation item:
72	(i) is a restriction or limitation upon the expenditure of the respective appropriation
73	made;
74	(ii) does not itself appropriate any money; and
75	(iii) is not itself an item of appropriation.
76	(c)(i) An appropriation or any surplus of any appropriation may not be diverted from
77	any department, agency, institution, division, or line item to any other department,
78	agency, institution, division, or line item.
79	(ii) If the money appropriated to an agency to pay lease payments under the program
80	established in Section 63A-5b-703 exceeds the amount required for the agency's
81	lease payments to the Division of Facilities Construction and Management, the
82	agency may:
83	(A) transfer money from the lease payments line item to other line items within
84	the agency; and
85	(B) retain and use the excess money for other purposes.
86	(d) The money appropriated subject to a schedule of programs or restriction may be used
87	only for the purposes authorized.
88	(e) In order for a department, agency, or institution to transfer money appropriated to it
89	from one program to another program, the department, agency, or institution shall
90	revise its budget execution plan as provided in Section 63J-1-209.
91	(f)(i) The procedures for transferring money between programs within a line item as
92	provided by Subsection (2)(e) do not apply to money appropriated to the State
93	Board of Education for the Minimum School Program or capital outlay programs
94	created in Title 53F, Chapter 3, State Funding Capital Outlay Programs.
95	(ii) The state superintendent may transfer money appropriated for the programs
96	specified in Subsection (2)(f)(i) only as provided by Section 53F-2-205.
97	(3) Notwithstanding Subsection (2)(c)(i):
98	(a) the state superintendent:
99	(i) may transfer money appropriated for:

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100	(A) the Minimum School Program between line items in accordance with Section
101	53F-2-205; and
102	(B) initial enrollment estimates for charter schools between line items in
103	accordance with Section 53F-2-707; and
104	(ii) shall provide the state board with information on the transfers described in
105	Subsection (3)(a)(i) within 60 days of a transfer; and
106	(b) the Department of Government Operations may transfer money appropriated to
107	another department, agency, institution, or division for the purpose of paying the
108	costs of pay for performance under Section 63A-17-112.
109	Section 3. Effective date.
