Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 31A-22-622 is enacted to read:
31A-22-622 . Cost sharing requirements for health benefit plans.
(1) As used in this section:
(a)(i) "Cost sharing requirement" means any copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or
annual limitation on cost sharing required by a health benefit plan for a specific
health care service covered by the health benefit plan.
(ii) "Cost sharing requirement" includes any copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or
annual limitation that is subject to 42 U.S.C. Secs. 18022(c) or 300gg-6(b).
(b)(i) "Health care service" means an item or service furnished to an individual for
the purpose of preventing, alleviating, curing, or healing human illness, injury, or
physical disability.
(ii) "Health care service" includes a prescription drug.
