Chief Sponsor:

LONG TITLE**General Description:**

This bill provides emergency funding to schools experiencing a significant increase in English language learner enrollment.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- defines terms;
- provides a school district with emergency funding if enrollment of students learning English meets or exceeds a threshold; and
- requires the state board to oversee an application process and distribute emergency funds.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **53F-2-302.1** is amended to read:

53F-2-302.1 . Enrollment Growth Contingency Program.

(1) As used in this section:

(a) "Program funds" means money appropriated under the Enrollment Growth Contingency Program.

(b) "Student enrollment count" means the enrollment count on the first school day of October, as described in Section 53F-2-302.

(2) There is created the Enrollment Growth Contingency Program to:

- 32 (a) [-]mitigate funding impacts on an LEA resulting from student enrollment
 33 irregularities regarding kindergarten[-] ; and
- 34 (b) provide emergency funding for a school district with increased enrollment of
 35 students learning English in accordance with Section 53F-2-315.
- 36 (3) Subject to legislative appropriations, the state board, in consultation with the Office of
 37 the Legislative Fiscal Analyst and the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget, shall
 38 use program funds to[-] :
- 39 (a) fund additional WPU's if the student enrollment count for kindergarten exceeds the
 40 amount of legislative appropriations for kindergarten[-] ; and
- 41 (b) provide emergency funding as described in Subsection (2)(b).
- 42 Section 2. Section **53F-2-315** is enacted to read:
- 43 **53F-2-315 . Emergency funding for schools with increased enrollment of students**
 44 **learning English.**
- 45 (1)
- 46 As used in this section:
- 47 (a) "Program funds" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53F-2-302.1.
- 48 (b)(i) "School district" means a group of public elementary or secondary educational
 49 institutions that provide K-12 education under the same local school board.
- 50 (ii) "School district" does not include a charter school.
- 51 (c) "Student learning English" means a student, currently enrolled at a public elementary
 52 or secondary educational institution, whose most recent score on an English language
 53 proficiency assessment is a 1 or 2.
- 54 (2)(a) A school district may submit an application to the state board to receive
 55 emergency funding if enrollment, at a school within the school district, of students
 56 learning English increases by 50% or more above the previous three-year average
 57 enrollment for students learning English in the school.
- 58 (b) An application submitted under Subsection (2)(a) shall:
- 59 (i) demonstrate substantial need for the emergency funding;
- 60 (ii) include the percentage by which the school's student learning English enrollment
 61 exceeds the previous three-year average for the school; and
- 62 (iii) demonstrate that the school has insufficient existing funds to adequately support
 63 the increased student learning English enrollment.
- 64 (3) The state board shall:
- 65 (a) establish and oversee the application process to award emergency funding; and

- 66 (b) prioritize applications and distribute funding based on:
- 67 (i) the greatest percentage increase in students learning English enrollment in the
- 68 school; and
- 69 (ii) the severity of the financial need of the school.
- 70 (4)(a) The state board shall draw the emergency funding described in Subsection (2)(a)
- 71 from the program funds.
- 72 (b) The state board may not draw program funds of more than \$5,000,000, per fiscal
- 73 year, for the emergency funding described in this section.

74 Section 3. **Effective Date.**
