## **Section 1: Requester Details**

#### **Description:**

Utah's Centers for Independent Living (CILs) are requesting one-time funding of \$400,000 to complete critical infrastructure and equipment projects totaling approximately \$547,700. These projects address essential needs, including building renovations, accessibility upgrades, and equipment replacement. Highlights include creating a storage facility for assistive technology at OPTIONS, retrofitting the UILC Tooele location for improved consumer safety, replacing aging HVAC systems at Active Re-Entry & Roads To Independence, and expanding RRCI's capacity with a new office in Cedar City to serve a growing population. Collectively, CILs have already raised \$235,000 toward these projects, demonstrating significant local commitment. This funding will ensure that Utah's CILs can continue providing vital services to individuals with disabilities across the state. Funding would be divided evenly among the six CILs.

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#### Who would benefit the most from this request (who is the target audience)?

People with disabilities throughout the state, the six Center for Independent Living, their satellites, and and every region/County would benefit from this request.

#### What is this project or program intended to accomplish?

These projects address essential needs, including building renovations, accessibility upgrades, and equipment replacement. Highlights include creating a storage facility for assistive technology at OPTIONS, retrofitting the UILC Tooele location for improved consumer safety, replacing aging HVAC systems at Active Re-Entry & Roads To Independence, and expanding RRCI's capacity with a new office in Cedar City to serve a growing population. This funding will ensure that Utah's CILs can continue providing vital services to individuals with disabilities across the state. Funding is to be split evenly to the six CILs, approximately \$66,666 each.

# How will the Legislature know whether the project or program achieved its intended purpose?

The success of this funding can be measured through clear and tangible outcomes. In the short term, CILs will provide quarterly progress reports detailing the status of infrastructure improvements, equipment replacements, and facility upgrades until project completion. These upgrades will directly enhance service delivery, improve consumer safety, and increase operational and energy efficiencies. CILs will document and report these outcomes to the Legislature, ensuring transparency, accountability, and a demonstrated return on investment.
