Intent Language

Government Operations - DFCM - DFCM

- 1. Under the terms of 63J-1-603 of the Utah Code, the Legislature intends that \$2,700,000 of the appropriations provided for the DFCM Administration line item in Item 66 and Item 117, Chapter 6, Laws of Utah 2024, shall not lapse at the close of FY 2025. Expenditures of these funds are limited to: information technology projects, customer service, optimization efficiency projects, time-limited FTEs, and Governor's Mansion maintenance, \$2,500,000; and Energy Program operations, \$200,000.
- 2. The Legislature intends that within existing budgets, the DFCM Administration may add up to five vehicles and up to two FTEs for Project Management staff to provide services to customers in FY 2025.
- 3. The Legislature intends that within existing budgets, the DFCM Administration may add up to five vehicles and up to two FTEs for Project Management staff to provide services to customers in FY 2026.

Government Operations - DFCM - ISF - Facilities Management

4. The Legislature intends that the DFCM Internal Service Fund may add up to 15 FTEs, and up to 10 vehicles, and multiple capital assets, beyond the authorized level if new facilities come on line or maintenance agreements are requested. Any added FTEs, vehicles, and capital assets will be reviewed and may be approved by the Legislature in the next legislative session.

State Treasurer - Advocacy Office

5. In accordance with UCA 63J-1-903, the Legislature intends that the Office of the State Treasurer report on the following Advocacy Office line item performance measures for FY 2026: 1. Annual System Accountability Report Timeliness (Days after January 15 that report is complete) (Target = 0); 2. Beneficiary Representation (Target = 85%); 3. Legislator Outreach Completion (Target = 85%); and 4. Timeliness of Trust Protection Reports (Target = 90%).

Capital Budget - Higher Education Capital Projects Fund

6. The Legislature intends that before commencing construction of a capital development project funded for an institution of higher education during the 2025 General Session, the Division of Facilities Construction and Management (DFCM) and the institution shall report to the Transportation & Infrastructure Appropriations Subcommittee and the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee on the status and cost of the project, and that DFCM and the institution shall seek feedback from the committees before committing funds for demolition or construction.

Capital Budget - Olympic and Paralympic Venues Grant Fund

- 7. The Legislature intends that appropriations for Olympic Park Improvement may be used for improvements at the Utah Olympic Park, Utah Olympic Oval, or Soldier Hollow Nordic Center.
- 8. The Legislature intends that the Division of Facilities Construction and Management pass through \$7.3 million from the Olympic and Paralympic Venues Grant Fund in FY 2025 for Olympic venue renovation projects as follows: \$3.8 million to Weber County for the Weber County Sports Complex, \$3.0 million to Provo City for the Provo City Peaks Ice Arena, and \$500,000 to West Valley City for the Maverik Center.

Debt Service

9. The Legislature intends that in the event that sequestration or other federal action reduces the anticipated Build America Bond subsidy payments that are deposited into the Debt Service line item as federal funds, the Division of Finance, acting on behalf of the State Bonding Commission, shall reduce the appropriated transfer from Nonlapsing Balances Debt Service to the General Fund, one-time proportionally to the reduction in subsidy payment received, thus holding the Debt Service line item harmless.

Intent Language

Transportation - Aeronautics

10. The Legislature intends that the Aeronautics Fund be available by application to all airports across the state for electric aircraft charging stations beginning in FY 2026.

Transportation - Highway System Construction

- 11. Notwithstanding the intent language in "Transportation and Infrastructure Base Budget" (House Bill 6, 2025 General Session), Item 13, the Legislature intends that up to \$41,000,000 of appropriations for the Highway System Construction line item in Item 24, Chapter 6, Laws of Utah 2023, shall not lapse at the close of FY 2025.
- 12. Notwithstanding the intent language in "Transportation and Infrastructure Base Budget" (House Bill 6, 2025 General Session), Item 13, the Legislature intends that the Department of Transportation use \$40,000,000 appropriated by Senate Bill 6, Item 24, to apply for and match a federal rail grant, including project design activities if necessary to obtain a grant, and that the Department report to the Executive Appropriations Committee prior to expending state funds to match a federal rail grant.
- 13. Notwithstanding the intent language in "Transportation and Infrastructure Base Budget" (House Bill 6, 2025 General Session), Item 13, the Legislature intends that up to \$88,500,000 of appropriations for the Highway System Construction line item in Item 251, Chapter 486, Laws of Utah 2023, shall not lapse at the close of FY 2025.
- 14. Notwithstanding the intent language in "Transportation and Infrastructure Base Budget" (House Bill 6, 2025 General Session), Item 13, the Legislature intends that if the Department of Transportation determines that land owned by the department near the Calvin L. Rampton Complex is surplus to the department's needs, proceeds from the sale of the surplus property may be used to help mitigate the traffic impact associated with the Taylorsville State Office Building.

Transportation - Share the Road

15. The Legislature intends that the ongoing appropriation from the Share the Road Bicycle Support Restricted Account to the Share the Road Line Item be reversed in FY 2025 due to account closure.

Transportation - TIF Capacity Program

16. Notwithstanding the intent language included in Item 167, Chapter 300, Laws of Utah 2022, the Legislature intends that the Department of Transportation (UDOT) pass through the remaining \$2,850,000 to Lehi City in FY 2025 to study and construct a local transportation project that enhances east/west mobility near Camp Williams.

Transportation - County of the First Class Highway Projects Fund

17. The Legislature intends that Utah Department of Transportation pass through \$3,200,000 from the County of the First Class Highways Projects Fund to Kearns City for the 6200 South Sidewalk and Wall Project in FY 2026.

Transportation - Amusement Ride Safety

18. In accordance with UCA 63J-1-903, the Legislature intends that the Department of Transportation report the final status of performance measures established in FY 2025 appropriations for the Amusement Ride Safety line item to the Office of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst and to the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget before August 15, 2025. For FY 2025, the Department of Transportation shall report on the following measures: 1. Number of rides registered; 2. Percent of ride registrations completed within 3 days of receipt; and 3. Number of inspectors registered.

Transportation - Transit Transportation Investment Fund

19. Under the terms of 63J-1-603 of the Utah Code, the Legislature intends that appropriations provided for the Transit Transportation Investment line item in Item 87, Chapter 6, Laws of Utah 2024, shall not lapse at the close of FY 2025. Expenditures of these funds are limited to the Transit Transportation Investment program.
