Utah's only nonpartisan and independent forum for public discussion among candidates for federal and statewide elected offices.

Ensures Fair Representation: By allocating funds to the Utah Debate Commission (UDC) the State Legislature supports an impartial forum for candidates to present diverse perspectives to voters. The UDC hosts debates for federal and statewide races, and has produced 56 primary and general debates in election cycles since 2014. All candidates who meet UDC qualifying standards have access to debate participation.

Promotes Civic Engagement: Funding the Utah Debate Commission encourages informed civic participation by providing a platform for meaningful debates on Utah's critical issues. UDC debates are broadcast live on Utah's major television stations and covered by radio and print outlets across the state, including the following UDC partners:

The UDC provides a unique and elevated experience for students and local citizens by partnering with Utah's eight major institutions of higher education who serve as debate hosts. Budget Information

Budget Assumptions

- Debates are held every two years based on statewide elections held every four years and congressional elections taking place every two years.
- Each year's budget includes one Special Election debate.
- Debate costs include production, polling, voter database, security and travel.
- Costs are estimated to increase 4% per year.

General & Special Election Debates - \$34,700 per debate

- Held at universities across the state.
- Student engagement and exposure to a broader demographic.
- Higher costs due to mobile equipment and travel.

Primary & Off-Campus Debates - \$11,100 per debate

- Held in the studios of our media partners.
- Lower costs due to media partners donating facilities and equipment.

Budget Request

To provide the highest quality of political discourse, expand civic education, foster public engagement, and maximize voter participation, the UDC needs:

\$300,000 / year for the next four years.
