88% OF DIAPER RECIPIENTS ARE EMPLOYED

70% say the distribution helps them pay bills, feel less frustrated, have more money for transportation.

75% say the distribution said that diaper distribution helps them buy food, and essential non-food items.



60% PARENTS REPORT HAPPIER CHILDREN Children cry less, sleep better, and improve their child's overall happiness.



80% OF RECIPIENTS FEEL MORE CARED FOR They feel more connected to society, less stressed, and feel like a better parent & care-giver.

The Utah Diaper Bank existed as a volunteer-based foundation for 11 years and only just hired on its first employee January 2025. They distribute through a network of partnerships with non-profits and government agencies. They have steadily grown from distributing 11,324 diapers in 2013 to 1.9 million diapers distributed in 2024.
