HB 233, School Curriculum Amendments Statement of Support from Mary Taylor, President of Pro-Life Utah

- Wouldn't we find it strange if a tobacco company wanted to teach health education in our public schools? Wouldn't we immediately be suspicious of their motives? If we allowed tobacco companies to have access to our children, and teen smoking and smoking related health problems escalated, wouldn't we see a connection? That is exactly what is happening with elective abortion providers teaching sex education in our schools. There were approximately 500 abortions committed on teens in 2023. That does not include the mail order abortion pills that we suspect teens access at a staggering number.

- Abortion providers have a vested financial and ideological interest in early sexual activity and abortion access, making their involvement in public school education inappropriate. When they teach in schools, they build trust-based relationships with students—relationships that extend beyond the classroom and into their business model. Schools should not serve as platforms for organizations that profit from students' reproductive choices.
- The majority of Utah school districts already do not use elective abortion providers in their curricula, proving that there are widely accepted, appropriate alternatives. This bill simply extends those best practices across all districts, safeguarding the integrity of our children's education. Our children deserve a learning environment free from the influence of special interest groups
