Dear Sponsors,

I regret to inform you that the total number of verified petition signatures is insufficient for the Clerk's Office to place a referendum on Ordinance 987 on the ballot. I have attached a copy of the Petition marked as "Insufficient".

The Clerk's Office verified 3,214 signatures. The total required for the petition to be sufficient is 4,554. We are declaring the referendum petition insufficient because the total number of verified signatures submitted does not meet the threshold number of signatures required for sufficiency.

Furthermore, the petition also falls short of meeting the required number of signatures in three of the four Voter Participation Areas. Voter Participation Area 1 had 900 signatures and needed 1181; Voter Participation Area 2 had 447 signatures and needed 1157; Voter Participation Area 3 had 945 signatures and needed 1109; Voter Participation Area 4 had 922 and needed 1107.

As set forth in my February letter, the Clerk's Office was not able to verify a number of packets because they had not been bound as a unit throughout the petition process. In addition signatures that were unreadable, duplicative, undated, and not matching, along with signers who were not registered or had a different address or lived outside of Summit County could not be counted either.

Dear Sponsors,

I want to let you know as soon as possible about some of the packets you submitted yesterday that do not meet petition requirements.

Twenty-one of the packets submitted have three holes punched along the top. They have also been spiral bound. Pictures from media coverage of your signature drives show signature pages being circulated without being in a bound packet. I have attached photographs from KPCW, the Park Record, and the TownLift all showing petition drives without bound packets.

The Utah Code requires the sponsors to ensure that the signature pages are bound as part of a packet that a person can open to sign, section 20A-7-604. The binding must occur prior to the signing. A case that helps explain these provisions is *Smith vs. Zook*, 2021 UT 10, which talks about a referendum packet as a unit.

Under the circumstances, we cannot accept any of the packets that have three holes punched across the top. The numbers on those packets are: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 26, 29.

If you have evidence that would show the packets had been bound prior to their being signed, we would be happy to consider that, and if persuaded, verify those packets. Alternatively, because we will not count those signatures, if you wanted to obtain signatures in a bound packet from the individuals who signed the rejected packets you could recontact them and have them sign in a bound packet. We would not consider those individuals as having signed the petition twice.

If you have questions, I will do my best to answer them.
