

Begin Summary (subject to change)

Funding allocations for various U.S. Education Department programs from fiscal years 2023 to 2026 show consistency in many areas, with some proposed changes in the FY 2026 Trump administration proposal and Senate Appropriations Committee bill. This summary, to date, details specific program funding levels, USBE staff associations, and notable funding proposals.

- **Title I, Part A funding steady:** The program maintains \$18.4 billion funding across FY 2023 to FY 2026 Senate proposal.
- **K-12 Simplified Funding Program proposed:** A new \$2 billion program appears in the FY 2026 Trump proposal but is not included in Senate plans and is unlikely to pass. This may change and get passed but the likelihood fell when the Senate Appropriations Committee did not move it forward.
- **Title I, Part C and Part D funding restored:** Migrant and Neglected and Delinquent programs receive \$376 million and \$49 million respectively in Senate FY 2026, reversing Trump proposal cuts to zero.
- **Title II, III, IV programs maintained:** Supporting Effective Instruction, English Language Acquisition, and Student Support grants retain funding near \$2.2 billion, \$890 million, and \$1.4 billion respectively in Senate FY 2026, despite zero in Trump proposal.
- **Career and Technical Education steady:** State Grants remain funded at \$1.4 billion through FY 2026 in both proposals.
- **IDEA Part B grants stable:** Maintains \$14.2 billion in Senate FY 2026, with Trump proposal slightly higher at \$14.9 billion.
- **Institute of Education Sciences and Office for Civil Rights:** Senate FY 2026 maintains funding near prior years (\$793 million and \$140 million), contrasting with Trump proposal cuts.
- **School Safety and Promise Neighborhoods slightly reduced:** Senate FY 2026 proposes modest decreases to \$190 million and \$91 million, respectively.
- **Charter School Grants increase in Trump proposal:** Proposed rise to \$500 million in FY 2026 contrasts with Senate maintaining \$440 million.
- **Staff assignments detailed:** Various USBE staff percentages are associated with each program, indicating personnel involvement in grant management.
