Voter Registration Process



Federal Voter Registration Laws

National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA)	Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Required states to offer voter registration at motor vehicle offices and public assistance agencies▪ Established uniform requirements for how states maintain voter registration lists▪ Prohibited states from setting the voter registration deadline more than 30 days before election day for federal elections	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Required states to maintain a statewide electronic voter registration system▪ Required coordination between election officials and other state and federal records to verify voter registration information▪ Provided federal funding and created the Election Assistance Commission



Voter Registration Methods & Deadlines

Method

In person

- County clerk's office
- **Utah Driver License Division**
- Public Assistance Agency
- Discretionary voter registration agency

Mail

Deadline


11 days before election day

Provisional Ballot

On election day or during early voting



Statewide Voter Registration Deadlines



Eligibility Requirements

Citizenship – a United States citizen

Residency –


- A resident of Utah for at least 30 calendar days immediately before an election; and
- Currently reside in the voting precinct where the individual applies to register.

Age – at least 18 years old on election day

(or 17 for a primary election if the individual will be 18 on the immediately following general election day)
