HIGHLIGHTS:

Federal Grant Applications Requiring Legislative Action

Eleven grants, totaling **\$40,632,612** require approval from the **Executive Appropriations Committee**. These grants require an additional \$12,759,348 of state matching funding, which will be covered by existing program funds. Eight of the grants are new and three are previously approved grants needing supplemental spending authority.
