1	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
	Section 1. Section 23A-6-402 is amended to read:
	23A-6-402. Right of access to lands for hunting, trapping, or fishing reserved to
l	oublic Exceptions.
(	1) Except as provided in Section 65A-2-5, there is reserved to the public the right of access
	to lands owned by the state, including those lands lying below the official government
	meander line or high water line of navigable waters, for the purpose of hunting,
	trapping, or fishing.
(	2) When a department or agency of the state leases or sells land belonging to the state
	lying below the official government meander line or the high water line of the navigable
	waters within the state, the lease, contract of sale, or deed shall contain a provision that:
	(a) the lands shall be open to the public for the purpose of hunting, trapping, or fishing

31	during the lawful season, except as provided by Section 65A-2-5; and
32	(b) the lessee, contractee, or grantee may not charge a person who desires to go upon the
33	land for the purpose of hunting, trapping, or fishing.
34	(3) Lands referred to in this section shall be regulated or closed to hunting, trapping, or
35	fishing as provided in this title for other lands and waters.
36	(4) The division may temporarily close that portion of a highway, as defined in Section
37	72-1-102, that enters into or crosses land owned by the division if closure is needed for
38	the benefit of wildlife.
39	[(5)(a) Except as provided in Subsections (5), (6), and (7), an individual who is 18 years
40	old or older may not enter that portion of a wildlife management area that is located
41	within a county of the first or second class for any use unless the individual:]
42	[(i) holds a valid hunting, fishing, or combination license;]
43	[(ii) is permitted to engage in the use under a contract with, or other permission given
44	by, the division; or]
45	[(iii) is permitted to engage in the use or to access the land in accordance with a
46	property right giving the individual the right to use or access land within the
47	wildlife management area.]
48	[(b) If the use engaged in by an individual described in Subsection (5)(a) would require
49	a specific license, permit, cooperative agreement, or certificate of registration under
50	this title if engaged in on other lands or waters, the individual shall hold the correct
51	license, permit, cooperative agreement, or certificate of registration to engage in the
52	use.]
53	[(6)(a) If an individual is expressly exempt under this title from a requirement to hold a
54	license, permit, cooperative agreement, or certificate of registration to engage in
55	hunting, trapping, or fishing if engaged in on other lands or waters, the individual is
56	not required to hold a hunting, fishing, or combination license to enter a wildlife
57	management area described in Subsection (5)(a).]
58	[(b) An individual may travel on a highway, as defined in Section 72-1-102, located
59	within a wildlife management area described in Subsection (5)(a) without obtaining a
50	hunting, fishing, or combination license.]
51	[(e) An individual may participate in an educational program or visit an education or
52	visitor center located within a wildlife management area described in Subsection
53	(5)(a) without obtaining a hunting, fishing, or combination license.]
54	[(7)(a) The Wildlife Board may make rules in accordance with Title 63G. Chanter 3

70	[(b) The Wildlife Board may not exempt an individual under Subsection (6)(a), on the
71	basis that the individual is not engaged in hunting, trapping, or fishing within a
72	wildlife management area.]
