

# Legislative Interim Meetings

## **Business and Labor**

## **DABS: Identity Verification**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Services (DABS) and heard comments from the Department of Public Safety outlining the processes and procedures in place to verify the age of individuals when purchasing alcohol at restaurants, bars, and retail DABS locations in the state.

# Office of Artificial Intelligence Policy: 2025 Annual Report

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Office of Artificial Intelligence Policy outlining the office's work over the past year, including a status update on the AI regulatory relief program, the learning laboratory's analysis of regulatory issues involving deepfakes and AI companions, and a review of the office's ongoing legislative support for policy questions in artificial intelligence.

## **OPLR Prioritization of Licensing Reviews**

**Action:** Discussed and approved proposed 2026 periodic reviews from the Office of Professional Licensure Review.

### **Regulatory Sandbox Update**

## **Draft Legislation: Voting Equipment Amendments**

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "Voting Equipment Amendments," which would amend provisions related to voting equipment.

## **Signature Gathering and Verification**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff providing an overview of electronic signature gathering in Utah and other jurisdictions. Also received a demonstration from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor of Utah's electronic signature gathering platform.

**Actions:** Opened a committee bill file to sunset manual signature gathering and improve the electronic signature gathering process.

Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "Signature Verification Revisions," which would amend provisions related to candidate nomination petitions.

Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session legislation, "Candidate Petition Amendments," which would amend provisions related to candidate nomination petitions.

# **Sunset Review: Purchase from Community Rehabilitation Programs**

Received information from the Division of Purchasing and General Services regarding the purpose and implementation of Section <u>63G-6a-805</u>, Purchase from community rehabilitation programs, which is scheduled to sunset on July 1, 2026.

**Action:** Opened a committee bill file to extend the sunset date of Section 63G-6a-805 for up to 10 years and to establish accountability measures for future evaluation of the program.

### **Voter Identification**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff related to voter identification when voting in person, including an analysis of federal case law, Utah's current law, and a comparison of other states' voter identification laws.

# Draft Legislation: Utah Commission on Aging Sunset Amendments

## **Draft Legislation: Correctional Facility Capacity**

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "Correctional Facility Capacity Amendments," which would create the Corrections Facility Expansion Restricted Account for the purposes of expanding existing, or constructing new, state correctional facilities.

# Draft Legislation: Courts Rules on Admissibility of Evidence

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "Joint Resolution Amending Rules of Evidence Concerning Crimes or Other Acts," which would amend Rule 404 of the Utah Rules of Evidence to expand the admissibility of evidence of prior crimes or acts in child molestation and sexual assault cases.

## **Draft Legislation: Juvenile Justice**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from a legislator related to 2026 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Juvenile Justice</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would address how school-based drug offenses are reported and investigated, define juvenile and school-based recidivism, and limit the eligibility of certain offenses for nonjudicial adjustments and expungement.

## **Draft Legislation: Public Land Access**

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "Public Land Access Amendments," which would repeal the requirement that under certain circumstances an individual is required to hold authorization to hunt or fish to access wildlife management areas.

### **Draft Legislation: Stalking Amendments**

# Draft Resolution: House Rules Resolution - Abandoning Legislation

Received a presentation from a legislator regarding 2026 General Session, "<u>House Rules Resolution - Abandoning Legislation</u>," which would establish a process for a chief sponsor to abandon a numbered bill.

# Draft Resolution: Joint Rules Resolution - Legislative Subcommittee Amendments

Received a presentation from a legislator regarding 2026 General Session, "Joint Rules Resolution—Legislative Subcommittee Amendments," which would allow a legislative subcommittee to consist of members who are legislators and members who are not legislators.

# Draft Resolution: Joint Rules Resolution - Sponsor's Supporting Information

Received a presentation from a legislator regarding 2026 General Session, "Joint Rules Resolution—Sponsor's Supporting Information," which would establish a process for a chief sponsor to provide supporting information about the sponsor's legislation that is posted to the bill page on the Legislature's website.

Discussed potential rules and procedural changes to make legislative resolutions more purposeful, including utilizing citations more as the primary method of honoring or supporting groups and events.

Action: Discussed and approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "County Forms of Government Amendments," which would remove restrictions on including full-time county executive or legislative members in a new or amended county government plan.

Opened a committee bill file to address county classifications and the triggers that would result in a change in county classification.

### **Title 17 Recodification**

Received a status update from committee staff on the five bill drafts that relate to the recodification of Title 17, Counties:

- <u>Title 17 Recodification General Provisions and County</u>
   Officers;
- <u>Title 17 Recodification County Programs and Related Provisions;</u>
- County Recodification External References;

# Administrative and Technical Modifications to Retirement

Discussed potential administrative and technical modifications to retirement provisions for the committee's bill file, "Administrative and Technical Modifications to Retirement."

#### **Utah Dairy Commission**

Received a presentation from the Utah Dairy Commission and Dairy West that describes the commission's history, composition, duties, and purpose.

## Utah Retirement Systems: AUREUS Project Overview

Received a <u>presentation</u> on the Utah Retirement Systems' AUREUS project to upgrade record-keeping systems for retirement plans. The project upgrade will serve as a replacement for line of business software for:

- retirement record keeping;
- savings plans record keeping; and

automation and straight-through processing.

The AUREUS project will serve as a new member and employer portal with increased functionality and enhanced security. Project development addressed components of planning, design, infrastructure, functional delivery, the system is expected to be ready for deployment by March 30, 2026.

## **Utah Retirement Systems: Financial Status Report**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from Utah Retirement Systems regarding the funding status and preliminary contribution rates for fiscal year 2026-2027.

## Utah Retirement Systems: Retirement Application Processing and Backlog

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Utah Retirement Systems (URS) on retirement application processing. Discussed the factors leading up to an application backlog that took place from late 2024 to early 2025. Reviewed:

- temporary challenges that caused delays;
- how URS addressed the backlog; and
- the current status of retirements.

URS noted that typical retirement applications process within 60 days and that the only retirement applications past 60 days involve some form of complication.

# **Draft Legislation: Tax Credit Review Process Amendments**

**Action:** Approved as a committee bill 2026 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Tax Credit Review Process</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would exempt the income tax credit for taxes paid to another state from periodic review by the committee.

### **Federal Tax Reform Update**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on tax provisions in Federal legislation bill H.R. 1, "<u>One Big Beautiful Bill Act</u>," and how those provisions could potentially impact Utah's tax code.

## **Local Option Sales Taxes**

Heard from the State Tax Commission and the Utah League of Cities and Towns regarding the reauthorization of local option sales taxes, such as the Botanical, Cultural, Recreational, and Zoological Organizations or Facilities (ZAP tax) and Rural City Hospital taxes.

#### **Truth in Taxation**
