


CY 2024 DATA TRENDS

Figure 1: Utah's Court Referral Rate per 100 Youths for FY 2017-2024 and CY 2024

Referrals to Utah's juvenile court system was 3.28 per 100 youths in CY 2024. While calendar year is on a different time frame cycle, we can see the rate is lower than pre-covid time.

JJYS' YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAM AND SCHOOL BASED OUTREACH, RECIDIVISM OUTCOMES CONTINUE TO IMPROVE

Since the reinvestment of dollars, recidivism outcomes continue to improve with an increase from 98.0% in CY 2020 to 99.3% in CY 2024 of those cases avoiding a new Court Ordered custody to the Division of Child and Family Services (DCFS) or JJYS, or Court Ordered Formal Probation within 90 days of release.



Overall, there were 13,989 referrals to the Juvenile Court in CY 2024.




YOUTHS CONTINUE TO BE DIVERTED FROM THE SYSTEM THROUGH THE USE OF NONJUDICIAL ADJUSTMENTS

The share of youths entering into an Nonjudicial Adjustment was 65% and the share of success rates were 94% in CY 2024.


While referrals to Juvenile Court for all offenses have decreased, referrals for serious offenses remained stable from FY 2018- 2024, and CY 2024.

Figure 3: Top 10 Serious Offenses (Violent, Theft of a Firearm, and Weapon Offenses) CY 2024


In CY 2024, there were a total of 1,446 serious offenses The top 10 offense includes aggravated assault. Previous years analysis show Sex-related offenses have decreased in CY 2024 when compared to FY 2018 while Aggravated Assault and Firearm-related offenses have increased.

Figure 4: Top 5 Firearm Offenses for CY 2024


In CY 2024, there were a total of 246 firearmrelated offenses episodes with 67 episodes being flagged as a restricted person. The top firearm related offense is aggravated robbery.



YOUTH AND SCHOOL DATA WORKING GROUP

A working group was convene with Senator McCay, CCJJ staff, Prosecutor, Defense, education representatives from Canyons School District, Granite School District, Jordan School District, and the Utah State Board of Education.

We had a series of discussions and review of statutory and board rules on reintegration plans, student sharing of student records between schools, various data systems, and school safety incidents.
