Pathways & Learning Experiences

Students earn credentials through Concurrent Enrollment, CTE, Technical College programs, Youth Apprenticeships, or Industry-Recognized Credentials.



Data, Advising, & Continuous Improvement

Participation, outcomes, and opportunities for improvement are tracked to strengthen advising, career mapping, and system performance.



Utah's First Credential program is powered by partnerships. Schools, colleges, employers, and state leaders work together to turn classrooms into career pathways and make opportunity a shared reality for each student.

- » LEAs guide students through credential pathways and provide local support.
- » Higher Education offers stackable, transferable credits and credentials to high school learners.
- » Employers & Industry Associations validate credential relevance, co-design programs, and provide work-based learning and mentorship.
- » Talent Ready Utah connects schools, employers, and higher education partners to strengthen regional collaboration.
- » State Partners & USBE administer scholarships, manage data infrastructure, and support continuous improvement.



Scholarships & Incentives

Implementation: Building a Connected Ecosystem

Year 1 | Build the System: Launch implementation plan, establish review committee, finalize Master Credential List, evaluate data systems, and identify staffing gaps.

Year 2 | Align & Strengthen: Enhance communications, support regional learning hubs, increase educator resources, and review industry alignment.

Year 3 | Review & Refine: Assess credit mapping and articulation, update Master Credential List, re-evaluate scholarships and incentives, and refresh the Master Plan.
