As the chairs of the Federalism Commission, and pursuant to the requirements of Utah Code Section 63C-4a-302(b), we respectfully submit the following proposed non-voting member for your review and approval.

The Federalism Commission (commission) is authorized through July 1, 2028, under Utah Code Section 63I-1-263 and consists of nine voting members and an unspecified number of non-voting members.

Non-voting members

The commission received authorization to add non-voting members to the commission membership during the 2024 General Session. The chairs of the commission may send a list of proposed non-voting members to the Legislative Management Committee for review and approval.

There are no specific requirements or qualifications for non-voting members of the commission, only that any proposed non-voting member show an interest in being part of the work that the commission does to evaluate federal actions, be willing to attend meetings in-person or remotely, and have experience or interest in areas that the commission may study so that the non-voting member adds value to the discussion.
