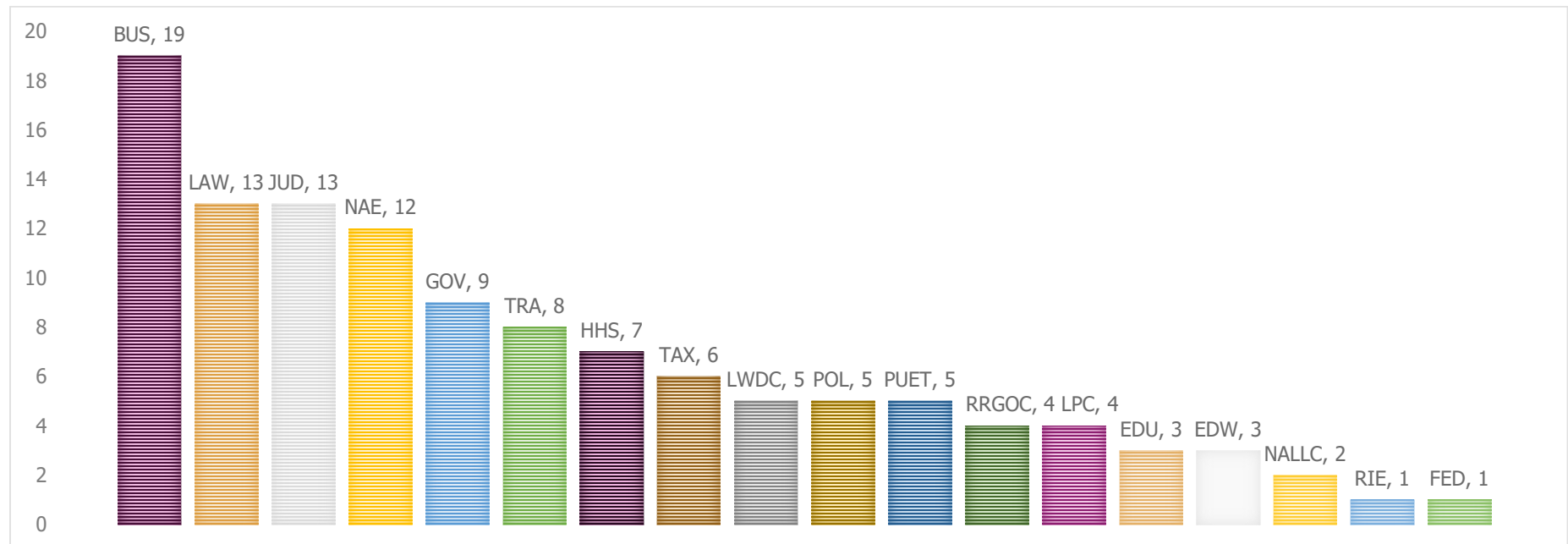

During the 2025 interim period, the legislature’s 13 interim committees studied a total of 311 items, including legislative audit and sunset reviews. Interim committees and other authorized legislative committees recommended 120 pieces of legislation for the 2026 General Session.

Joint Legislative Rule requires interim committee chairs to report to the Legislative Management Committee (LMC) on the disposition of each issue assigned to or studied by the committee. An additional report to LMC is required that lists each piece of legislation recommended for the upcoming General Session (see **Appendix A**). This report provides a description and a link to each piece of legislation recommended by each interim committee. For items studied that did not result in legislation, this report indicates whether the committee chairs consider the issue sufficiently studied or in need of further study. Issues that need more study include a link to the minutes of the last committee meeting at which the issue was discussed.

Public Education Revisions

The bill authorizes the State Board of Education to appoint the state superintendent as the superintendent of the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind and allows the state superintendent to delegate duties related to the role of superintendent for the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind. The bill also aligns terminology regarding juvenile justice reintegration to apply to all local education agencies, instead of only school districts. The bill allows the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind to coordinate with the state security chief rather than the security chief of each county a Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind campus is located. Additionally, the bill allows the State Board of Education to reduce suicide prevention grant amounts when appropriations are not available to provide the full amount required by code.
