# Challenges

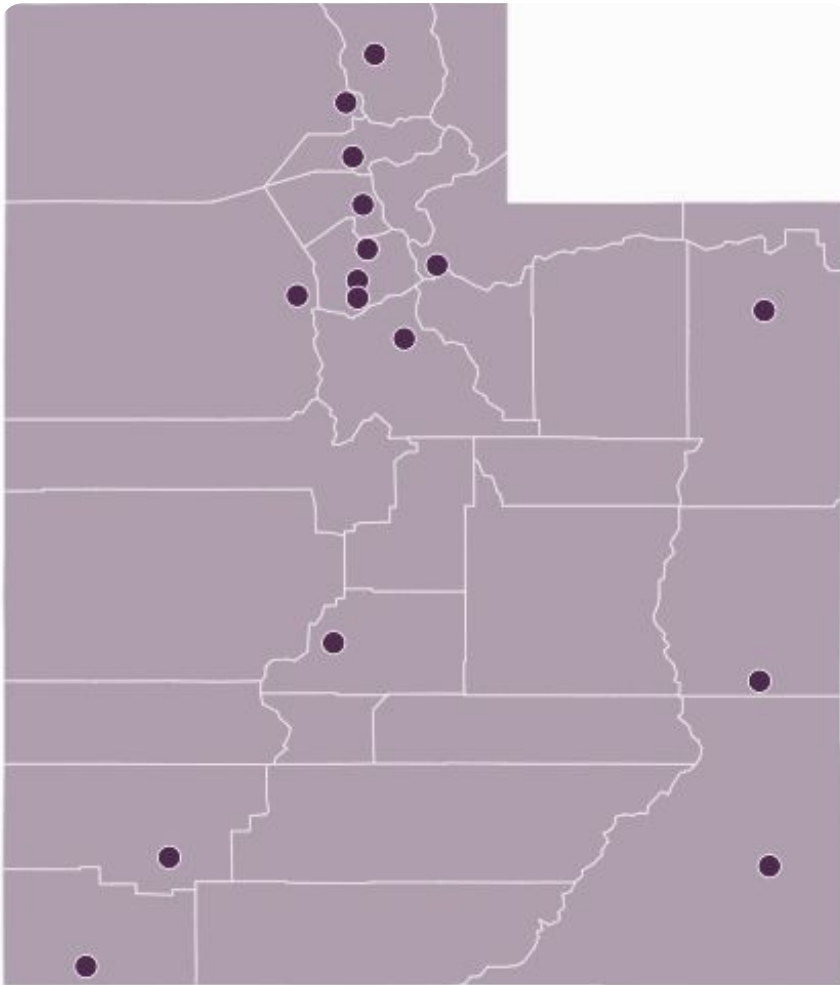
- Sustain the domestic violence shelter services without creating a bigger service shortfall
- The current one-time victim service funds will end in FY26, further reducing available shelter resources



# How will this request help address the challenges?

- Help maintain existing services
- Bridge funding gap when one-time funding ends in FY26
- Allows more time for Victim Services Commission to complete the needs assessment
