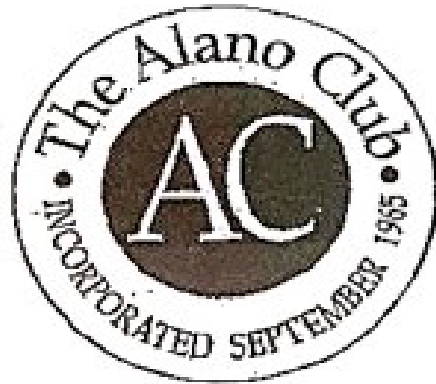

ALANO CLUB AT 5056 SOUTH 300 WEST

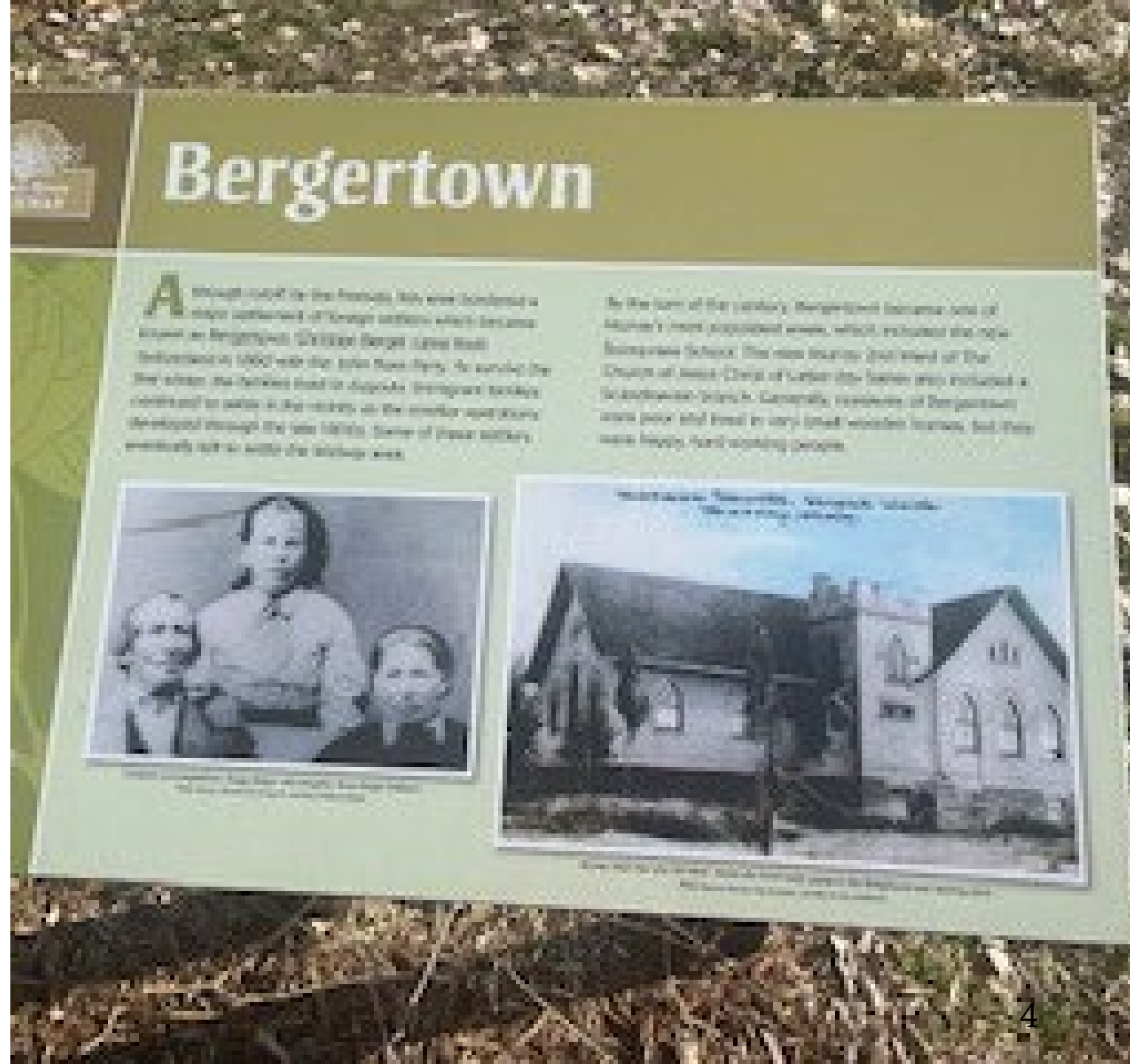


OFFICIAL ALANO CLUB LOGO



INTRODUCTION TO THE ALANO CLUB

- The Alano Club Building is a former LDS Church located in Central Murray.
- The building is 112 years old and was known as Bergertown. 2nd Ward.



Bergertown

A small group of the first settlers who were descended a direct settlement of German settlers which became known as Bergertown. (Original Bergertown name used) Settlement in 1840 with first school house built. In 1845 the school was burned down and replaced. Bergertown building continued to serve as the center of the community and church developed through the late 1800s. Some of these settlers eventually left to settle the Murray area.

By the turn of the century, Bergertown became one of Murray's most populated areas, which included the original Bergertown School. This was burned and replaced by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints who purchased a 10-acre parcel from H. Cameron, a resident of Bergertown, and built the first in a series of school houses, but there were many hard-working people.



HOW BERGERTOWN BECAME THE ALANO CLUB

- The LDS Church made a decision to re-assign the building in their property portfolio.
- A group of people in recovery from alcoholism approached Spencer W. Kimball (LDS Church) and a meeting was held.
- The recovery folks promised Spencer W. Kimball they would contribute mightily to saving the lives of those inflicted with alcoholism. Later David O. McKay became a supporter of the club.
- A deal was agreed upon and the Church was rented by the Club and eventually sold to the club in 1965. The building and grounds became The Alano Club 56 years ago!!
- Over 5,000,000 people have used the club to help their sobriety.

OUR REQUEST FOR FUNDING

- The pandemic has devastated the Alano Club finances. The club has lost 88% of its normal revenue. Volunteers currently staff the club, no full-time employees. The building infrastructure is badly in need of attention. The club's financial prudent reserve is expended. The club is operating day to day on the proceeds from an abbreviated meeting schedule and donations.

ECONOMICS MOVING FORWARD

- The temporary funding makes the club a viable business. With an influx we can rebuild and expand our capabilities. We understand that Utah is on a rapid expansion trend. We anticipate more people will be seeking a safe environment for recovery. This means a growth in the size and frequency of recovery meetings. It is logical to assume the kitchen traffic will increase. Fund raising should also benefit.
