Through the use of Unite Us data and outcomes tracking, the state can effectively measure progress and target resources for scalability. Additionally, it can be scaled by connecting justice, health, housing, employment, and social services by developing partnerships (e.g., workforce programs, behavioral health, housing authorities), implementing referral pathways and data sharing (with confidentiality protections), and integration prevents silos that slow scaling.

Section 4: Performance Outcome Measurement

Who would benefit the most from this request (who is the target audience)?

Utah residents leaving the corrections system; case managers in homeless services and DOC; community based organizations that provide re-entry services to those leaving incarceration.

What is this project or program intended to accomplish?

This program is intended to address the common reentry challenges faced by the Utah DOC, including: Fragmented individual records across reentry providers make it hard to track and manage support services.



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How will the Legislature know whether the project or program achieved its intended purpose?

Research demonstrates that successful models of care for community reentry and reintegration include connection to a range of community-based support services. Through data collection within the CLR platform on specific outcomes-based measures tied to recidivism rates, the legislature will be able to see whether or not this program has an impact on recidivism rates. They will also be able to see where needs are being met and where they are not - helping to better allocate limited state resources.
