PATIENTS SEEN

The Medical Outreach Street Team saw 443 patients in 2024 through 7,924 visits, including Medical Case Manager visits and distribution of essential items. Outreach services are provided in 100+ known encampments per year.

STREET RESIDENCY PROGRAM & U OF U SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

Partnerships with the Street Residency Program at CHC, Inc. and the University of Utah School of Medicine Student Clinic allow residents and students to go out with the Medical Outreach Street Team two to four times per month, collectively doubling the number of patients seen. This program teaches our future health care workers empathy and compassion.

PATIENT STORY FROM THE STREET

When a patient living on the streets missed an appointment with his provider, our Medical Outreach Street Team knew the situation was urgent. He was living with a softball-sized hernia that required surgery and could not safely wait. Rather than losing him, the team searched areas they knew he frequented. Once the team found him, they assessed his condition and worked quickly to finish scheduling his surgery, secure a safe place for him to recover, coordinating every step.

On the day of his procedure, they transported him to the hospital, ensuring he arrived safely and on time. The team's ability to adapt helped prevent a potentially life-threatening emergency and reduced the strain on local EMS and emergency departments, keeping resources available for other crises.

Moments like this reflect who we are and why we do this vital work; The Fourth Street Clinic Medical Outreach Street Team goes the distance and keeps patient-centered thinking at the core of what we do. Without this program, critical care disappears for those who are not able to access traditional services and need them the most.

FOURTH STREET CLINIC HELPS INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IMPROVE THEIR HEALTH AND QUALITY OF LIFE BY PROVIDING HIGH-QUALITY INTEGRATED HEALTH CARE.

In 2024, Fourth Street Clinic served 6,606 individuals through 30,284 patient visits. According to the Salt Lake County 2025 Point-in-Time Count, homelessness increased by 18%.

- 96% of patients seen were experiencing homelessness.
- 44% of patients were uninsured.
- 46% of services provided were medical.
- 31% of our patients received behavioral health treatment.
- The ALSAM Foundation Pharmacy at Fourth Street Clinic dispensed 93,517 prescriptions.
